The specific limitations and exceptions in the Berne Convention

- Fixation
- Official texts (legislative, administrative and legal)
- Political speeches and speeches in legal proceedings
- Lectures, addresses, delivered in public
- Comparison of terms
- Quotation, illustration for teaching
- Borrowing by the press, news reporting
- Broadcasting, retransmission of broadcast works, ephemeral copies
- Making of phonograms, "cover versions" of published musical works
- Translation, publication and broadcasting under the Berne Appendix

The specific limitations and exceptions in the Rome Convention

- Private use
- Use of short excerpts in connexion with the reporting of current events
- Ephemeral fixation by a broadcasting organization by means of its own facilities and for its own broadcasts
- Use solely for the purposes of teaching or scientific research

The general rules

- The three-step-test
 - Certain special cases
 - Do not conflict with the normal use
 - Do not unreasonably prejudice the legitimate interests of the rights owner
- The 'minor reservations'
 - Religious ceremonies, military bands, education and popularization
 - Given lightly without invalidating the principle of the rights
- Ordre public
- The references from related rights to limitations and exceptions under copyright in works



Limitations and exceptions based on the general rules

- Fair dealing/fair use
- Private use, compensation systems
- Education, study and research
- Libraries, archives and museums
- Persons with visual and other impairments
- "Right of panorama"
- and others, as desired by national legislators



The relation between limitations & exceptions and contracts

- Can such limitations and exceptions be set aside through contract?
 - Matter for national legislation
 - Examples of prohibitions in EU Directives
- If yes, how much does it take to enter a binding contract?
 - One-sided conditions of use, set by the vendor
 - "Click-wrap" contracts
- Interpretation and nullification
 - Interpretation Contra proferentem
 - Enforcement of unconscionable contracts

Technological protection measures

- The protection requirements
 - Adequate legal protection and effective legal remedies
 - against circumvention
 - of effective technological measures used by rights owners [...]
 - that restrict acts which are not authorized [...] or permitted by law
- Exemptions from the protection
 - The protection does not cover "acts [...] permitted by law"
 - The protection must be 'adequate' and provide 'effective legal remedies'
 - Core issue: The dissemination of circumvention tools to the general public
