
- Working multiple jobs or regular employment

- Public funding bias



Impact from first and second pandemic waves in 2020 (source: IGES)




Preliminary Findings: Artistic Categories









Preliminary Findings: Gender dimension






Preliminary Findings: Urban vs Rural Regions















Preliminary Findings: Lockdown Measures





Tentative Conclusions

- Creators across the board see a drop of up to 15 percent in 2020 income from artistic self-employment over the 2019 data
 - Impact most visible among performing artists and musicians locked out from their live stages, hitting hard sectors with lower average pay before the crisis



Tentative Conclusions

- On average, women seem slightly less vulnerable and mixed evidence for different career stages, but again pre-crisis income gaps prevail
 - The pandemic might be a catalyst for digital change and literacy in some sectors, but this will require more research
- How much public support measures and funding will ultimately help correct for 2020 income losses, and
- how forthcoming public interventions (lockdown, theatre closures etc.) will impact in 2021 is unclear at this point in time
