Objectives

Imparting basic knowledge of the main principles of the IP system and how they relate to the issue of ABS (i.e. the potential value and role of IP in relation to the use of GRS and in the protection of TK and TCEs):

- IP aspects/ considerations in the development of legislative, administrative and policy measures to protect TK and TCEs, and to address the interface between IP and GRs, at a national level;
- IP aspects/ considerations in mutually agreed terms for the fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising from the utilization of GRs and associated TK.

Providing an overall overview of relevant regional and international processes:

- -Explaining the rationale and objectives of the negotiations that are taking place in the WIPO Intergovernmental Committee on Intellectual Property and Genetic Resources, Traditional Knowledge and Folklore;
- Providing an overview of relevant processes under the Convention on Biological Diversity (i.e. under the WG on Art. 8(j) and the Nagoya Protocol) on ABS and the relevance of IP to these processes, as well as of the Swakopmund Protocol;

Contributing to building **co-operation and collaboration** between and among **IPLCs** and **government** agencies.

Cameroon, Ethiopia, Kenya, Namibia, South Africa and Uganda.

- one officer from the IP Office
