Belize Copyright Act, Chapter 252 of the Laws of Belize.

6. What kind of copyright works can be registered/recorded? Is the registration/recordation process different for each type of copyrighted work? Please describe the differences, if any.

Works protected by copyright include novels, poems, plays, reference works, broadcasts, newspapers, and computer programs; databases; films, musical compositions, and choreography; artistic works such as paintings, drawings, photographs, and sculpture; architecture; and advertisement, maps, and technical drawings. The process of recording is the same for all works mentioned.

7. Can the subject matter of related rights (e.g., performances, broadcasts, sound recordings) also be registered/recorded? If yes, is there a different registration/recordation process than for works protected by copyright?

Yes. The process is the same for related rights.

8. Is there a possibility to record the transfer or licensing of copyright/related rights? If so, what are the legal requirements and effects of such recordation?

Copyright is transmissible by assignment, by testamentary disposition or by operation of law, as personal or movable property, by virtue of a license agreement or contract. No recordation is required.

9. Is there a possibility to record a security interest in the copyright or related right? If so, what are the legal requirements and effects of such recordation?

There is no provision for recordation of a security interest in copyright.

10. What is the legal effect of registration?

Pursuant to the Berne Convention, registration is not legally required; however, registration may evidence priority rights in a court of law.

Automatic; national treatment principles are applied pursuant to the Berne Convention.

- 27. Does your country have a legal deposit system in place? The Copyright Act does not require any mandatory legal deposit system. However, a separate mandatory deposit system for published works exists, pursuant to the National Library Act.
- 28. Please list relevant national legislation regulating the legal deposit. *The National Library Act*.
- 29. Is the legal deposit mandatory or voluntary in your country? If mandatory, what are the legal consequences in case of non-compliance?

Under the National Library Act, deposit is mandatory; provision (20)(2) provides that the Library shall be entitled to receive 2 copies of any book, pamphlet, journal, newspaper, magazine, report, slide, phonographic record, audio tape, audio-visual tape, CDROM, DVD, thesis, dissertation, plan "and any information constituting Belize's cultural and historical heritage, published or produced in Belize and intended for public distribution." There is a fine of up to \$3,000 and/or imprisonment of up to one year for non-compliance.

Under the Archives Act, deposit is mandatory; Section 16(5) provides that any producer of a recorded work shall be required to deposit a copy with the National Archives upon production of said work. Violators may be subject under Section 23(4) of the Act to a fee of \$5000 or imprisonment of up to one year.
