Amendment of the Regulations and Administrative Instructions

Newmethodofcalculatingpublicationfees; amounts of publicationfees; newrequirements concerning the presentation of reproductions

- 1. On January 1, 2002, a new method of calculating the publication fees will come into force. This change is intended to simplify the requirements relating to the presentation of reproductions and the calculation of the publication fees. It will in addition result in a substantial reduction in those fees. The new method of calculation is based on the number of reproductions to be published and the number of A4 pag es on which these reproductions are submitted. The concept of "groups of standard spaces" has been deleted.
- 2. Thenewmethodofcalculationandofthecorrespondingnewscaleoffeesshouldresult in an average reduction of the order of 27% i n the publication fees payable for a deposit governed by the 1960 Act, provided that the users take care to present their reproductions on the number of pages strictly necessary, having regard to the applicable requirements. It is therefore important to be come familiar with this new method of calculation and the new requirements concerning the presentation of reproductions.
- 3. These new requirements, which will also come into force on January 1, 2002, result from the amendment of Rule 12 and Sect ions 401 à 405 of the Administrative Instructions. Section 604 (concerning the international deposit certificate) has also been amended; see paragraph12.
- 4. The amendments to the Schedule of Fees and to Rule 12 of the Regulations under the Hague Agreement were adopted by the Assembly of the Hague Union during its meeting in September 2001. The Administrative Instructions have been amended by the Director General after consultation with the Offices directly concerned, pursuant to Rule 31.1(a) of the Regulations, and will also enter into force on January 1,2002, following their publication in the International Designs Bulletin.
- 5. The present note provides a brief explanation of the above —mentioned changes. The amended text of the Sch—edule of Fees, of Rule 12 and of the Administrative Instructions concerned appears in an annex.

AmendmentoftheRegulations

AmendmentoftheScheduleofFees

- 6. The amendments to the Schedule of Fees relate to the method of calculating the publication fees and to the amounts of these fees. At present, the calculation of the publication fees depends on the number of four "standard spaces" fully or partly occupied by the reproductions. This calculation proved to be complex and led to many irre gularities.
- 7. With the new method of calculating the publication fees, the concept of group of standardspacesisdeleted. From January 1,2002, the calculation of the publication fees will depend, on the one hand, on the number of A4 pages on which those reproductions are set out. The distinction is maintained between reproductions whose publication is requested in color and those whose publication is requested in black and whitherefore greatly simplify the calculation of the publication fees for depositors.
- $8. \quad The new amounts of the publication fees adopted by the Assembly of the Hague Union are the following:$

AmendmentofRule12

Dimension of the representations of a design or object deposited (Rule 12.1(b))

- 9. Rule12.1(b)hasbeenmodifiedinorder
- firstly, to remove the requirement that the representation of each design or article be in the dimensions in which the depositor wishes to have it published (the International Bureau will nevertheless continue to scan the reproductions in the format in which they are submitted) and,
- secondly, to transfer to the Administrative Instructions the requirements concerning the maximum and minimum dimensions of the representation of each design or article(these requirements remain however unchanged; see Section 403(b)).

Representation of an object from different angles (Rule 12.1(d))

10. Aswordedatpre sent,Rule12.1(d)providesthatdifferentviewsofthesamearticlemay be shown on the same reproduction or on separate reproductions. The modification of Rule 12.1(d)consists in allowing the representation of one article from different angles only on separate reproductions. This is necessary having regard to the new method of calculating the publication fee (which is determined mainly by the number of reproductions) and in order to avoid difficulties with the numbering of reproductions that represent a narticle seen from different angles.

AmendmentoftheAdministrativeInstructions

Reproduction of the Designor Article Deposited (Sections 401 à 405)

- 11. The amendments to Sections 401 to 405 of the Administrative Instructions are a consequence of the new method of calculating the publication fee, and of the implications that it has both for the presentation of the reproductions and for their digitization. They consist in particular:
- inremovingallreferencestothegridsofstandardspace s(Sections 401(b)and(c), 402(b) and (c) and 404(c)); in practice, it means that the grids of standard spaces will no longer be included in the application form and that any reproduction will necessarily have to be submitted (either pasted or printed di rectly) onto a separate sheet of A4 paper which is white and opaque, as referred to in Section 401(b);
- in providing that a margin of at least 5mm be left around each reproduction in ordertofacilitatedigitization of the reproductions (Section 401(c));
- in providing that each page containing reproductions be used upright and be allowedtocontainnomorethan25reproductions(Section401(b)); this limit has been set on the basis of the minimum dimensions prescribed for the representation of a design (referred to in Section 403(b)) and in the light of the new requirement to leave a margin of at least 5 mm around each reproduction (Section 401(c));
- in requiring that reproductions be arranged in the orientation in which the applicant wishes them to the publ ished (Section 401(c)) and in ascending numerical order (Section 402(b)).

InternationalDepositCertificate (Section604)

12. Section 604 has been reorganized and completed in order to make it clear that, where an international deposit has been amended in the course of the period of deferment, the International Bureau issues to the owner, after the period of deferment has ended, a new deposit certificate which contains the elements that will be published (and not those initially appearing in the deposit).

$Rule 12 \\ Reproduction, Samples and Models of the Designs or Articles$

12.1 Reproduction, Samples and Models

[...]

(b) Inthecaseo finternationaldepositswhicharegovernedexclusivelyorpartlybythe 1960Act, the application shall be accompanied, for each design or for each article in which it is intended to incorporate the designs, by one photographor other graphic representati on, in color if the depositor requests publication in color or, failing that, in black and white, presented in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Instructions. Additionally, the application may be accompanied by samples or models of the article or articles. The maximum and minimum dimensions of the representation of each design or articles how nin the photographs or other graphic representations accompanying the application shall be laid down in the Administrative Instructions.

 $(d) \quad The same article may be represented from different angles, provided that each representation of the article viewed from a different angle is shown on a separate photograph or graphic representation.$

Section401 PresentationofReproductions

- (a) One and the same deposit may comprise both photographs and graphic representations.
- (b) Wheretheinternationaldepositisgovernedexclusivelyorpartly bythe 1960 Act, the photographsor other graphic representations accompanying the application shall be either pasted or printed directly onto a separate sheet of A4 paper which is white and opaque. These parates heet of paper shall be used upright and shall not contain more than 25 reproductions.
- (c) Thephotographsorothergraphicrepresentationsmustbearrangedonthe separatesheetreferredtoinparagraph(b)intheorientationinwhichtheapplicantwishes themtothepublished. Amarginofatleast 5 millimeters should be left around each reproduction.
- (d) Eachreproductionmustfallwithinaright -angledquadrilateralcontainingno otherreproductionorpartofanotherreproductionandnonumbering. The photographsor other graphic representations sha llnot befolded or stapled or markedinanyway.
- (e) Where a design (in two dimensions) is intended to be applied to two or more articles that form a whole (e.g., a dinner service), the deposit may comprise only one of the articles forming the whole (e.g., a plate) that will be shown in the photographs or other graphic representations accompanying the application.

Section 402 Numbering of Reproductions

- (a) Thenumberingstipulatedformultipledepositsshallappearinthemarginofeach photographor othergraphicrepresentation. When the same article is represented from different angles, the numbering shall consist of two separate figures separated by adot (e.g. 1.1,1.2,1.3, etc. for the first article, 2.1,2.2,2.3, etc. for the secondarticle and so on).
- $(b) \quad The reproductions shall be pasted or printed in ascending numerical order on the separate sheet referred to in Section 401(b).$

Section 403 Representation of the Design or Article Deposited

- (a) Thephotographsandothergraphicrepresen tationsshallrepresentthedeposited designorarticlealone,totheexclusionofanyotherobject,accessory,personoranimal.
- (b) The dimensions of the representation of each design or object appearing in a photographor other graphic representation may not exceed 16x16 centimeters, and one of those dimensions must be at least 3 centimeters.
 - (c) Thefollowingshallnotbeaccepted:
 - (i) technicaldrawingsorrepresentations showing articles in section or in plan, particularly with axes and dimensions;
 - (ii) explanatorytextorlegends.

Section404 RequirementsforPhotographs

- (a) Thephotographssuppliedmustbeofprofessionalstandard. The articles must be shown against an eutral plain background. Photographs retouched within korcorrecting fluid are not allowed.
- (b) Reproductionsofphotographsthatmeettheconditionssetforthinparagraph andhavebeenproducedbymeansofelectronicprocessesshallbeallowediftheyare themselvesofprofessionalstandardandnotretouched.
- $(c) \quad \mbox{Photographsorreprodu ctions of photographs shall have all the edges cut a tright angles.}$

Section405 RequirementsforGraphicRepresentations

Graphicrepresentationsmustbeeitheroriginalsofprofessionalstandardproducedwith drawinginstrumentsorbyelectronicmeans ongoodqualitywhite,opaquepaper,allofwhose edgesarecutatrightangles,orprintsorphotocopiesmadefromsuchoriginalsandhavingthe samequality. Thelinesmustbeevenandboldlydrawn. Thearticlerepresentedshould preferablybeinpersp ective; it may comprise shading and hatching to provide representations executed by electronic means may be shown against a background, provided that it is neutral and plain and has only edges cutatright angles.

Section604 InternationalDepositCertificate

- (a) AfterhavingenteredtheinternationaldepositintheInternationalRegister,the InternationalBureaushallissuetotheowneraninternationaldepositcertificatecontainingthe dataandcopiesofthephotographsorothergra phicrepresentationsenteredintheInternational Register.However,
- $(i) \quad where publication of the international depositis deferred, the certificate shall consist of a copy of the application, bearing the provisional number as signed to the deposit, and, \\$
- (ii) wheretheinternationaldepositisaccompanied by are quest for deferment of publication, the period of deferment has ended and the conditions are fulfilled for publication to proceed, the International Bureau shall is sue to the owner an ewinterna tional deposit certificate containing the data and copies of the photographs or other graphic representations that are to be published.
- (b) Thecopyoftheapplication, the data and the copies of the photographs or other graphic representations contained in an international deposit certificates hall be certified by the Director General or by an officer authorized to signish is name by virtue of Section 111.
