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### PROTOCOL RELATING TO THE MADRID AGREEMENT CONCERNING THE INTERNATIONAL REGISTRATION OF MARKS

#### Individual Fees under Article 8(7): Ireland

1. In Information Notice No. 13/2001 of August 15, 2001, concerning the ratification of the Madrid Protocol by Ireland, it was stated that the instrument of ratification was accompanied by a declaration under Article 8(7)(a) concerning individual fees and that the amounts in Swiss francs of the said fees would be published as soon as they had been established.

2. In accordance with Rule 35(2)(b) of the Common Regulations under the Madrid Agreement and Protocol, the Director General has, after consultation with the Office of Ireland, established the following amounts in Swiss francs of the individual fees that will be payable when Ireland is designated, either in an international application or in a designation subsequent to international registration, or in respect of the renewal of an international registration in which Ireland has been designated (it will be seen that these amounts will change on January 1, 2002):

Designation fee (in the international application or in a subsequent designation):

– for each additional class	<b>193</b>	<b>190</b>

These amounts will be payable where Ireland

(a) is designated in an international application which is received, or is deemed to have been received under Rule 11(1)(c), by the Office of origin on or after the relevant date, or

(b) is the subject of a subsequent designation which is received by the Office of origin or another interested Office on or after that date, or is filed direct with the International Bureau on or after the relevant date, or

(c) has been designated in an international registration which is renewed on or after the relevant date.
