

## **MADRID PROTOCOL CONCERNING THE INTERNATIONAL REGISTRATION OF MARKS**

### **Partial Withdrawal of Declaration Made in its Instrument of Ratification of the Protocol Relating to the Madrid Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Marks: Denmark**

1. It is recalled that on November 10, 1995, the Government of Denmark deposited its instrument of ratification of the Protocol Relating to the Madrid Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Marks (“the Madrid Protocol”) with the Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO). This instrument of ratification contained a declaration specifying that, until further notice, the Madrid Protocol would not apply to the Faroe Islands or to Greenland.
2. The Madrid Protocol entered into force in respect of Denmark on February 13, 1996.
3. On October 11, 2010, the Director General of WIPO received a further declaration from the Government of Denmark which withdrew the declaration contained in the instrument of ratification of the Madrid Protocol with respect to Greenland only.
4. In a communication received on November 17, 2010, by the International Bureau of WIPO the Danish Patent and Trademark Office specified that the Madrid Protocol would apply to Greenland in respect of designations of Denmark in international registrations and in subsequent designations bearing a date of January 11, 2011, or later.
