NEW PROVISIONS ON PATENT TERM IN THE US TO ENTER INTO FORCE ON 8 JUNE 1995

US patents granted on international applications designating the US, whose international filing date is before 8 June 1995, will be automatically entitled to the 20-year term calculated from the international filing date or the 17-year term from the date of grant, whichever is the longer. This will apply irrespective of the date on which the international application entered the national phase in the US.

In respect of any international application designating the US, whose international filing date is on or after 8 June 1995, the term of any US patent granted thereon in the US national phase will be 20 years from the international filing date.

EXTENSION OF EUROPEAN PATENTS TO LATVIA

An agreement between the **European Patent Organisation** and Latvia on the extension of the effects of European patent applications and patents to Latvia entered into force on 1 May 1995. Under that agreement, it is possible to obtain patent protection in Latvia by requesting the extension of a European patent to that State. The extension procedure is also available, if the necessary requirements are met, via the PCT. The agreement with Latvia is similar to that which entered into force on 1 March 1994 in respect of Slovenia and on 5 July 1994 in respect of Lithuania (see

PCT Newsletter Nos. 01, 04 and 05/1994).

Note that Latvia (country code: LV) is not party to the European Patent Convention (EPC) and cannot itself be designated for a European patent (EP). If protection is desired in Latvia via the PCT, Latvia must be designated for the purposes of a national patent, even where protection through the extension of a European patent is desired.

The extension of a European patent to Latvia via the PCT route requires that: (i) both the designations EP (regional patent) and LV (national patent) are made – either as express designations under PCT Rule 4.9(a) or as precautionary designations

confirmed under PCT Rule 4.9(c) - and (ii) the PCT designation fees due for these designations are paid within the time limit applicable under PCT Rule 15.4(b) or 15.5; no special indication concerning the extension should be made in the PCT request. The applicant must then, within 21 months (Chapter I) or 31 months (Chapter II) from the priority date, enter the regional phase before the European Patent Office (EPO) – a request for extension of the European patent is automatically deemed to have been made – and pay to the EPO the extension fee for the extension of the European patent to Latvia. The request for extension will be considered withdrawn if, upon entry into the regional phase before the EPO, the extension fee is not paid within the applicable time limit.

Upon completion of the European procedure, the EPO will transmit the European patent, if granted, to the Latvian Patent Office. That patent will have the effect of a national patent granted by the Latvian Patent Office, provided that, within three months from the publication by the EPO of the mention of grant of the European patent, a translation of the claims into Latvian is filed with, and the prescribed publication fee is paid to, the Latvian Patent Office. Renewal fees for the extended European patent will have to be paid to the Latvian Patent Office for the years following the year in which the mention of the grant of the European patent was published by the EPO.

The option of entering the national phase directly before the Latvian Patent Office within 21 or 31 months from the priority date, instead of proceeding with a request for the extension of a European patent to Latvia, is also available for any international application containing the designation of Latvia.

PCT STATISTICS – 1 January to 31 March 1995

During the first quarter of 1995, the International Bureau of WIPO received 9,343 international applications filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, which represented an increase of 21.9% over the same period in 1994.

The table below shows, by country of origin, the number of international applications received, under PCT Article 12, by the International Bureau. (Note that 15.1% of international applications received during this period were filed either with the European Patent Office or the International Bureau; these filings are included in the figures concerning the Contracting State of which the applicant is a national or a resident.)

The 9,343 international applications received during this period had the effect of 201,546 national applications and of 15,922 regional applications, which in turn had the effect of 208,004 applications for patent protection in the Contracting States of the regional patent systems; that is, a total of 409,550 applications.

The number of demands for international preliminary examination filed under Chapter II during the same period amounted to 6,680, which represents an increase of 33% over the corresponding period last year.

EPO REDUCES FEES FOR APPLICANTS FROM GEORGIA

The EPO has announced that the 75% reduction in the international search fee and the international preliminary examination fee charged by the EPO, referred to in *PCT Newsletter* No. 04/1995, also applies, retroactively from 1 April 1995, to applicants from Georgia.

Singapore (evidence of mailing; requirement for address for service)

The Registry of Patents of Singapore no longer accepts evidence of mailing a document, in case of loss or delay, where a delivery service other than the postal authorities is used. Also, although the Registry, in its capacity as receiving Office, does not require an agent to be appointed, it does require that there be an address for service in Singapore.

EXTENSION OF INTERNATIONAL APPLICATIONS TO CERTAIN SUCCESSOR STATES OF THE FORMER SOVIET UNION

Applicants of certain international applications are, under PCT Rule 32, entitled to request the extension of the effects of those international applications to successor States which have made a declaration of continuation of the PCT. Every applicant eligible (depending on the international filing date) under PCT Rule 32 is sent a notification by the International Bureau concerning the extension procedure.

So far, the International Bureau has sent separate notifications in respect of the availability of extensions to the following successor States of the former Soviet Union: Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Ukraine and Uzbekistan. In an attempt to simplify the procedure, and to reduce the high volume of paper which would be needed to send notifications in respect of

each of the other successor States of the former Soviet Union which have made a declaration of continuation of the PCT, namely, Armenia, Kyrgyzstan, Republic of Moldova, Tajikistan and Turkmenistan, a single notification (Form PCT/IB/362/AM-TM), relating to all of those States, will shortly be sent to the applicant in respect of every international application filed after 24 December 1991 and before 15 April 1994. Further details regarding the extension procedure are included in the notification.

For international applications filed after 14 April 1994 and before 19 July 1994, as far as Armenia is concerned, and after 14 April 1994 and before 2 May 1995, as far as Turkmenistan is concerned, further notifications will be sent at a later date.

It is noted that Azerbaijan is the only successor State of the former Soviet Union which has not yet made a declaration of continuation of the PCT.

ACCESSION TO THE PARIS CONVENTION

On 9 March 1995, Saint Lucia (country code: LC) deposited its instrument of accession to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property. Saint Lucia will become bound by that Convention on 9 June 1995.

ACCESSION TO THE BUDAPEST TREATY

On 1 April 1995, China deposited its instrument of accession to the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure. The Budapest Treaty will enter into force with respect to China on 1 July 1995.


