MODIFIED REQUEST FORM

The request form (PCT/RO/101) has been modified with effect from 1 July 1996. See page 7 for details.

PCT COMMITTEE FOR ADMINISTRATIVE AND LEGAL MATTERS

The PCT Committee for Administrative and Legal Matters (PCT/CAL) held its sixth session at WIPO Headquarters from 29 April to 2 May 1996. The session was attended by representatives from 72 PCT Contracting States, representatives from the European Patent Office, in its capacity as International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authority, together with observers from eight non-PCT Contracting States, four intergovernmental organizations and seven non-governmental organizations representing users.

The Committee discussed three proposals: for a supplementary international search system, for a bilingual PCT Gazette and for a liberalization in filing languages.

Supplementary international search system

The Committee discussed a proposed modification of certain time limits fixed in the Treaty and proposed amendments of the PCT Regulations which would give applicants the possibility of requesting a supplementary international search report from an International Searching Authority different from the one that carried out the usual "manda-

tory" international search. The applicant could request a supplementary international search instead of, or in addition to, filing a demand for international preliminary examination, and benefit from the proposed postponement of the time limit for entering the national phase from 20 to 30 months from the priority date, even if a demand for international preliminary examination was not filed. The proposed supplementary international search system would result in two search reports

established by different International Searching Authorities, which would be more likely to be exhaustive with respect to the cited prior art. Designated Offices could therefore be expected to place greater reliance on the search results so obtained. Although a number of delegations welcomed the proposal in so far as it attempted to increase reliance by national Offices on the results of international search, some delegations questioned whether the proposed modification of time limits fixed in the Treaty could be achieved without a diplomatic conference. The Committee noted that the International Bureau planned to study possible alternatives, to continue seeking the views of users and to convene a consultative meeting to which at least the International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities and representatives of users would be invited.

Bilingual PCT Gazette

The Committee discussed a proposal according to which the *PCT Gazette*, which is currently published in separate English- and French-language editions, would be published as a single bilingual edition. The bilingual *Gazette* would differ from the present two editions in that it would no longer contain abstracts and drawings relating to published international applications. The International Bureau explained that the proposal was prompted by the increase in the number of alternative sources of information about published international applications, particularly CD-ROMs and on-line databases, the ever-increasing volume of the *Gazette*, the increase in the production costs and the decrease in subscriptions. The Committee agreed in principle to the publication of a bilingual *Gazette* without abstracts and drawings, but requested the International Bureau to study the matter further and to put it before an appropriate body of the International Patent Cooperation Union (PCT Union).

Liberalization in filing languages

The Committee also discussed an outline proposal which would permit the filing of international applications in a broader range of languages than is currently possible, in particular where the official language of a given State is not one of the languages

presently accepted for filing international applications. Most delegations welcomed the envisaged liberalization and the Committee invited the International Bureau to draw up detailed proposals for further consideration at a later date.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Indication of inventor's name and address in the request form

Q: I am the agent acting for a company which intends to file a PCT application relating to a product which was invented by one of its employees during the course of his work. For personal reasons, the inventor would prefer that his name and address not appear in the international application or be published. Is it obligatory to include the name and address of the inventor in the request form?

A: Although it is strongly recommended that the name and address of the inventor be included in the request form, whether there is a need to do so depends on which States are designated in the international application. Where the national law of at least one of the designated States requires that the name of the inventor (or if there are several inventors, of each one of them) be furnished at the time of filing a national application, the request form should indicate the name and address of the inventor (see PCT Rules 4.1(a)(v) and 4.6(a)). Note, in particular, that if the United States of America is designated, the inventor must not only be named in the request as inventor but must also be named as applicant, since only the inventor may be applicant for the purpose of that designation.

If the name and address of the inventor are not in the request form, the receiving Office may, in the interest of the applicant, and if it appears to be necessary in view of the law of at least one State designated in the international application, bring to the applicant's attention the fact that the name and address are not indicated. If the information concerning the inventor is furnished to the receiving Office, then it will be published in the PCT pamphlet and in the *PCT Gazette*.

If none of the States which are designated in the international application require that the name and address of the inventor be included in the request, that information

may be omitted from the request. Most designated Offices requiring indications concerning the inventor will then invite the applicant to furnish that information upon entry into the national phase, or even later, depending on the national law (or regional treaty) applied by the designated Office concerned.

The table on page 4 shows, for each national or regional Office, whether the applicable national law (or regional treaty) requires that the name and address of the inventor be given in the request at the time of filing the international application, or whether they may be furnished at a later date. With the exception of the national Offices of Austria and Israel, which require neither the name nor the address of the inventor, and the national Office of Spain, which requires only the name of the inventor, all other designated Offices will eventually require the name and address of the inventor. The *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/A, Annex B1, contains information, for each Contracting State, on whether and when the name and address of the inventor must be furnished.

MODIFIED REQUEST FORM (PCT/RO/101)

The request form (PCT/RO/101) has been modified with effect from 1 July 1996; this affects only Box No. V on the second sheet and the Notes thereto. One new PCT Contracting State, IL Israel, has become bound by the PCT since the last revision of the form in January 1996 and has been added to Box No. V under *National Patent*. Under *Regional Patent*, AM Armenia, KG Kyrgyzstan and MD Republic of Moldova have been added for EA Eurasian Patent, and FI Finland has been added for EP European

patent. Minor modifications have been made to the notes to Box No. V of the request form in respect of certain kinds of protection for certain States.

Modified versions of the second sheet of the request form in English and French are included in this issue as white tear-out sheets for insertion into the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/B, Annex X. Also included in this issue are modified versions of the second sheet in German and Spanish. The demand form (Form PCT/IPEA/401) has not been modified except for the inclusion of the date of reprinting (July 1996) on each sheet.

NEW ON-LINE SERVICE FROM EUROPEAN PATENT OFFICE (EPO)

On 1 June 1996, a new on-line service was introduced by the EPO providing improved access to the databases of the EPIDOS (European Patent Information and Documentation Systems) Information Register on-line. The new service provides access to more information than was obtainable from EPIDOS's former Register of European Patents (described in *PCT Newsletter* No. 01/1995, page 4). It is possible to retrieve information from the databases of the Register of European Patents and the EPIDOS Information Register using the following criteria:

a) European application or publication number, or international application or publication number (gives all data stored under the corresponding number);

b) name of applicant (lists all published European, including PCT applications con-

taining a designation for a European patent (Euro-PCT applications), of that applicant);

c) International Patent Classification (IPC) (lists all European, including Euro-PCT, applications published under the IPC symbol(s) entered (searchable by both main and subclass));

d) priority number (identifies the associated European, including Euro-PCT, application and its IPC).

In addition, users can trace the progress of a European, including Euro-PCT, application or

granted patent over the preceding month.

The fee for using the new on-line services remains DEM 2.50 per transaction, irrespective of the quantity of data received.

Several training courses for users of the EPIDOS Information Register on-line are being planned.

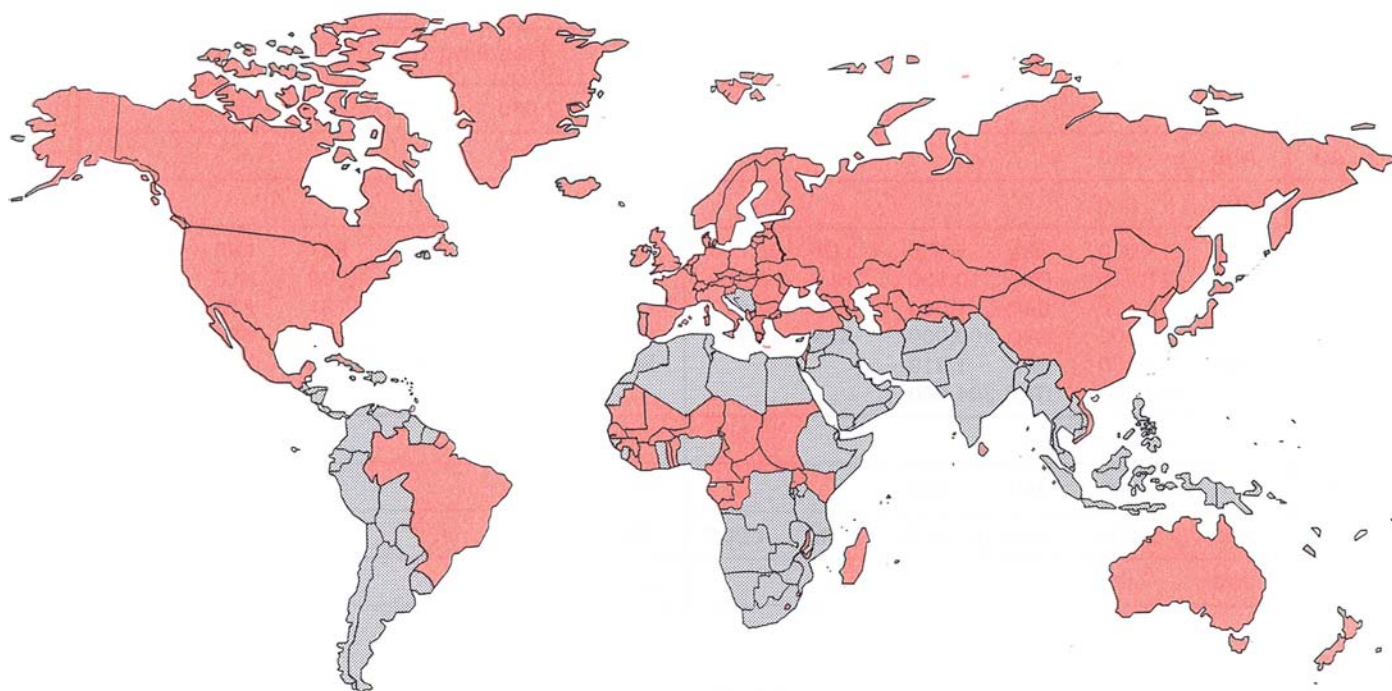
