PCT REQUEST AND DEMAND FORMS ON THE INTERNET

The English versions of the current request (Form PCT/RO/101) and demand (Form PCT/IPEA/401) forms are now available, in PDF format, on WIPO's Internet site at the address indicated above. The request and demand forms in other languages will be included at a later date.

ELECTRONIC FILING OF PCT APPLICATIONS

In an endeavor to facilitate and accelerate the process of filing international applications and other PCT-related papers, WIPO is currently investigating several ways of filing documents electronically.

One technique being investigated is the filing of international applications via the Internet, the use of which has expanded very rapidly over the past few years. Under such a filing system, for which some developmental work has been done by the United States Patent and Trademark Office, an applicant would log on to an Internet site and input the bibliographic data normally included in the request form using software which would include an interactive help sys-

tem to answer questions and flag apparent errors. Electronic files containing the international application (including description, claims and drawings) would then be transmitted on-line to the receiving Office. The transmission would, of course, need to be secure and confidential; it is envisaged that the system would use commercially recognized, certified standards and systems for authentication and data protection.

In another project relating to electronic filing, an interactive software product for preparing international applications (and/or European applications) is being developed, in cooperation with the European Patent Office, under the "EASY" (Electronic Application SYstem) project. EASY would help applicants to provide the necessary information and check data for errors when the application is being prepared. The system is being designed so that applicants can ultimately decide by what means they want to actually file the application (on paper, on diskette or on-line).

Developments in respect of filing using the Internet, the EASY software, or any other form of

Note that the additional fee of USD 180 for each independent claim in excess of one is, however, still payable in connection with the substantive examination fee.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Computer-generated request and demand forms

Q: My company is a regular user of the PCT. To enable us to simplify the process of completing the request and demand forms, we would like to generate our own forms by computer. We understand that it is permitted under the PCT to file the request and demand in the form of computer print-outs, but we would like guidelines to follow in their preparation.

A: A substantial increase has recently been observed in the number of computer-generated forms produced by applicants, patent attorney firms and commercial services.

PCT Rules 3.1 and 53.1 require, respectively, that the request and demand be made on printed forms or be **presented as computer** print-outs. In the latter case, those forms must comply with the requirements of Section 102(h) of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT, the text of which is reproduced in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/B, Annex J.

The aim of those requirements is to ensure that the request and demand forms, as computer print-outs, resemble very closely, in layout and content, the printed versions of the request and demand forms which are promulgated under the PCT Regulations. Using a consistent format makes it easier to identify and understand the contents of the forms irrespective of which language is used (for example, during data capture by PCT Offices and Authorities).

When preparing computer-generated forms, you should take particular care to:

- in the request, ensure that all the countries that are included in Box No. V ("Designation of States") of the current version of the form are included in your computer-generated version, and that the country codes indicated in the latter are correct; if any State becomes bound by the PCT after the issuance of the current request form, the name of that State (together with its two-letter country code, if known to you) should be included in the space where dotted lines presently appear in the area reserved for that purpose at the foot of the right-hand column of designations in Box No. V;
- in the request, ensure that the text at the very bottom of Box No. V of the form effecting "precautionary designations" is included in your computer-generated version (to make sure that your company will benefit, if necessary, from the precautionary designation system under PCT Rule 4.9(b));
- in the demand, ensure that the check-box in Box No. V ("Election of States") of the form is pre-marked (to protect the applicant from omitting to elect any eligible States).

In addition to complying with the requirements mentioned above, it is recommended that you:

- include on all pages of the computer-generated versions of each form, in the bottom margin of each page, the date of issuing or reprinting that appears at the bottom of the printed version of the form (the current version is dated January 1997);
- include an indication identifying the source of the forms (preferably the name of your company), so as to allow staff of the receiving Office, the International Preliminary Examining Authority and the International Bureau to readily distinguish your versions from those produced by the International Bureau; this indication should be placed on each page, either on the same line as and next to the date, or immediately below the date.

Under Section 102 (h) of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT, you have the possibility of omitting explanatory notes printed in italics. This will, of course, enable you to gain space in the boxes. However, if you are filing with the United States Patent and Trademark Office as receiving Office, that Office recommends that you do **not** remove those notes which appear in Box Nos. II and III and the Supplemental Box of the request, so far as those notes relate to the question of residence of the applicant (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 11/1996, cover page).

You should always ensure that computer-generated versions of the request and demand forms, whether prepared by your company or obtained from an outside supplier, include all changes which have been included in the current versions of the forms (updated versions are normally issued twice a year, in January and July; the last page of each issue of the *PCT Newsletter* indicates the date of issue of the current versions). As a precaution, as from the issuance of an updated version, superseded versions of the forms should be removed from your computer system.

The International Bureau will be pleased to advise you whether your proposed computer-generated forms comply with the general requirements as to layout, but is not in a position to proofread such forms for their detailed contents. Responsibility for the accuracy of forms presented as computer print-outs, in matters of detail, including incorporation of modifications, necessarily rests with the applicants concerned.

As indicated on the cover page, the request and demand forms, in English, are now available in PDF format on WIPO's Internet site; forms in other languages will be available on the Internet at a later date. The International Bureau is also currently investigating several ways of filing documents (including the request form) electronically; see cover page for details.

PCT FEE TABLES
