pamphlet (published PCT application) due to be published during January 2000 should reach the International Bureau, on or before **16 December 1999**. Any such information received after that date is likely to have been received after the completion of technical preparations for international publication. If you are an applicant, or an agent representing an applicant, with any pending international applications falling into this category, it is important to be aware of this special arrangement, particularly if it is your intention to:

- withdraw the international application or a designation under PCT Rules 90*bis*.1 and 90*bis*.2, respectively, in sufficient time to prevent international publication of that application/designation;

- withdraw the priority claim under 90*bis*.3 in sufficient time to postpone publication of the international application;

- amend the claims under PCT Article 19 and both the time limits of two months from the date of transmittal of the international search report by the International Searching Authority and 16 months from the priority date have already expired (see PCT Rule 46.1);

- request recordal under PCT Rule 92*bis*.1 of any change in an indication concerning the applicant, agent, common representative or inventor in sufficient time to be reflected in the publication of the international application.

Any notices effecting such changes, if you want to ensure that those changes are reflected in any international applications due to be published in January 2000, **must reach the International Bureau on or before 16 December 1999**. It is, of course, strongly recommended that applicants notify the International Bureau of any change as early as possible before that date, preferably by fax, bearing in mind that more time may be needed if the International Bureau has to take any action in connection with the matter before the completion of technical preparations for publication. If you are concerned about whether the International Bureau has received and been able to act upon any information that you send during this period, you may call the PCT Information Line (telephone: (41–22) 338 83 38) to follow up the matter.

The date of 16 December 1999 having been set as a precautionary measure, the International Bureau will, to the extent possible, endeavor to process information received after that date, as if the usual arrangements for technical preparations applied, if it is in fact received in time to be taken into account for the publication concerned.

Non-working days of the International Bureau and closing dates of the PCT Information Line during the holiday period

The non-working days of the International Bureau during the end-of-year holiday period, in addition to the weekends, will be 24, 27, 30 and 31 December 1999. The International Bureau will, however, be open for business on 28 and 29 December 1999.

Exceptions to normal publication schedule

The *PCT Gazette* and the PCT pamphlets (published PCT applications) which would normally have been published on Thursday, 30 December 1999, will be published a day earlier, on Wednesday, 29 December 1999, and the completion of technical preparations for those publications will also take place earlier, on 13 December 1999. Note that any international applications for which the time limit of 18 months from the priority date expires on 30 December 1999 **will not** be published on 29 December 1999, but will be published as soon as possible thereafter, in accordance with PCT Article 21 (promptly after the expiration of 18 months from the priority date of the application).
