AMENDED PCT RULE 4.10 AND PCT SCHEDULE OF FEES

MEMBERS OF WORLD TRADE ORGANIZATION

As indicated in *PCT Newsletter* No. 10/1999, PCT Rule 4.10, as amended with effect from 1 January 2000, will enable applicants to claim the priority of an earlier application filed in or for a Member of the World Trade Organization that is not party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property.

NOTIFICATIONS OF INCOMPATIBILITY WITH PCT RULE 4.10, AS IN FORCE FROM 1 JANUARY 2000

New paragraph (d) of PCT Rule 4.10, as in force from 1 January 2000, provides that if, on 29 September 1999, amended paragraphs (a) and (b) of Rule 4.10 are not compatible with the national law applied by any designated Office, those paragraphs as

amended will not apply to that Office but those paragraphs as in force until 31 December 1999 will continue to apply after that date in respect of that Office for as long as the incompatibility continues to exist, provided that the said Office informs the International Bureau accordingly by 31 October 1999.

PCT PUBLICATIONS

PCT Newsletter subscriptions for 2000

Due to the introduction of a new pricing structure which will be applied from January 2000, the basic price, not including mailing costs, for a subscription to the PCT Newsletter for January to December 2000 is 50 Swiss francs. In addition, you must pay 10 Swiss francs for regular mail and 20 Swiss francs for priority mail. Therefore, the regular mail (previously referred to as "surface mail") subscription price of 60 francs remains the same and the new priority mail (previously referred to as "airmail") subscription price of 70 Swiss francs represents a 12.5% reduction in the price. The equivalent amounts in US dollars will be 42 US dollars for the basic price, 50.40 US dollars by regular mail and 58.80 US dollars by priority mail.

The price of the *PCT Newsletter* binder is now 13.20 Swiss francs or 9.60 US dollars by regular mail, or 15.40 Swiss francs or 11.20 US dollars by priority mail.

A PCT Newsletter subscription form for January to December 2000 is included in this issue as a pink tear-out sheet. If you are already a subscriber, it is not necessary to return the form since, unless notification to the contrary is received from you by WIPO, subscription renewal is automatic; subscribers will shortly receive an invoice for year 2000 subscriptions. You may, however, wish to use the subscription form to subscribe to additional copies. You are reminded that, for subscriptions to more than one copy, you are entitled to a 25% discount off the basic price for each copy subscribed to (including the first). You may also use the subscription form to order binders for the PCT Newsletter.

PCT Gazette subscriptions for 2000

The annual subscription price for the *PCT Gazette* has also changed, as from January 2000. The basic subscription price is

550 Swiss francs or 360 US dollars, the regular mail subscription price is 660 Swiss francs or 435 US dollars, and the priority mail subscription price is 770 Swiss francs or 500 US dollars.

BUDAPEST TREATY ACCESSION

Croatia

On 25 November 1999, Croatia deposited its instrument of accession to the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure. That Treaty will enter into force with respect to Croatia on 25 February 2000.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Indication of dates and numbering of international applications in the year 2000

Q: I know that, at present, dates in an international application, for example, the filing dates of earlier applications (in Box No. VI "Priority Claim" of the Request Form) should be repeated in parentheses by indicating a sequence of three two-digit Arabic numbers: for the date, the number of the month and for the last two numbers of the year. Will the number of the year, as from 1 January 2000, continue to be indicated by two-digit Arabic numerals, in other words "00" for the year 2000, or will it have to be indicated as a four-digit number, as is the case in certain other situations?

A: For the time being, the two-digit system of indicating dates, so far as international applications are concerned, at the International Bureau *will remain unchanged*. The shorter date which should be indicated, for example in Box No. VI, in

parentheses after, above or below the longer date (the latter consisting of the Arabic number of the day, the name of the month and the (complete) Arabic number of the year) will, for the year 2000 onwards, continue to be indicated as prescribed in Section 110 of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT. Hence, the shorter date will continue to be written as two-digit Arabic numbers, each for the number of the day, for the number of the month and for the last two numbers of the year, with the number of the day, month and year separated by a period, a slant or a hyphen. For example, a priority date of 3 January 2000 will be followed by the shortened, numeric version of that

date: "(03.01.00)," "(03/01/00)" or "(03-01-00)."

Similarly, the system of numbering of international applications will, for the time being, continue to be as prescribed in Section 307 of the *Administrative Instructions under the PCT*, that is, they will continue to be composed of the letters "PCT," a slant, the two-letter code of the receiving Office, a *two-digit* indication of the last two numbers of the year in which the international application was received, a slant, and a five-digit number. For example, the first international application number which will be given by the International Bureau as receiving Office in the year 2000 series will be: PCT/IBOO/00001.

PCT FEE TABLES

The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/B, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The total amount of the basic fee and designation fee may be reduced by CHF 200 under certain circumstances where the request is prepared using the PCT-EASY software; see footnote 2 for details. A 75% reduction in the basic fee, the supplement per sheet over 30, the designation fee and the handling fee, as well as the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States; see footnote 3 for details. (Note that if both the CHF 200 reduction and the 75% reduction are applicable, the 75% reduction is calculated *after* the CHF 200 reduction.) The key to the abbreviations used and the footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.



Any priority claim shall, subject to Rule 26bis.1, be made in the request; it shall consist of a statement to the effect that the priority of an earlier application is claimed and shall indicate:
- (i) the date on which the earlier application was filed, being a date falling within the period of 12 months preceding the international filing date;
 - (ii) the number of the earlier application;

"4.10 Priority Claim

(a) Any declaration referred to in Article 8(1) ("priority claim") shall, subject to Rule 26bis.1, be made in the request; it shall consist of a statement to the effect that the priority of an earlier application is claimed and shall indicate:

- (i) the date on which the earlier application was filed, being a date falling within the period of 12 months preceding the international filing date;

- (iv) where the earlier application is a regional application, the authority entrusted with the granting of regional patents under the applicable regional patent treaty;

 - (b) In addition to any indication required under paragraph (a)(iv) or (v):
- (i) where the earlier application is a regional application or an international application, the priority claim may indicate one or more countries party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property for which that earlier application was filed;
- (ii) where the earlier application is a regional application and the countries party to the regional patent treaty are not all party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property, the priority claim shall indicate at least one country party to that Convention for which that earlier application was filed."
