NEW ACCESSIONS BRING TO 100 THE NUMBER OF **CONTRACTING STATES OF** THE PCT

The following States acceded to the PCT in December. bringing the total number of PCT Contracting States to 100. It is interesting to note that in the last five years, that is, since 1 January 1994, 37 States have joined the PCT.

United Arab Emirates (country code: AE)

On 10 December 1998, the United Arab Emirates deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT. The United Arab Emirates will become the 99th Contracting State of the PCT on 10 March 1999. Consequently, in any international application filed on or after 10 March 1999, the United Arab Emirates may be designated and, because it will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, may also be elected. Furthermore, nationals and residents of the United Arab Emirates will be entitled from 10 March 1999 to file international applications under the PCT.

On 16 December 1998, South Africa deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT. South Africa will become the 100th Contracting State of the PCT on 16 March 1999. Consequently, in any international application filed on or after 16 March 1999, South Africa

EURO CURRENCY

The Euro has been introduced as a new monetary unit in the countries which are members of the European Monetary Union. Switzerland is not a member of that Union.

PCT-EASY UPDATE

As indicated in *PCT Newsletter* No. 12/1998, one of the three conditions for obtaining the 200 Swiss franc reduction in the international fee is that the international application must be filed with a receiving Office which is prepared to accept the filing of international applications containing requests in *PCT-EASY* format together with *PCT-EASY* diskettes. The receiving Offices which have so far notified the International Bureau that they are prepared to accept the filing of international applications in such format are indicated on page 5.

It is now possible to download the PCT-EASY software, either from the PCT-EASY home page (http://pcteasy.wipo.int) or via the WIPO home page (http://www.wipo.int) on the Internet.

At present, the software is available in English, French, German and Spanish; the Chinese, Japanese and Russian versions will be available shortly. In addition to the software, you can also view and download supporting documentation, including the detailed *PCT-EASY User Reference Manual* and, for quick reference, the *PCT-EASY Mini Guide*. Also available is information on what's new in the development of PCT-EASY, the answers to a number of frequently-asked questions, a form for reporting problems and a user survey, which can be submitted on-line.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Claiming priority in PCT applications designating India

Q: I filed an international application with the United States Patent and Trademark Office on 8 December 1998, claiming priority from an earlier United States application filed on 4 January 1998. The international application includes the designation of India as a country in which patent protection is sought. Will the priority claim in question be recognized under Indian law for the purposes of the national phase in India, even though India did not become bound by the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property until 7 December 1998 (the same day as it became bound by the PCT)?

A: Under the PCT, an international application may contain a declaration claiming the priority of one or more earlier applications filed in or for any country party to the Paris Convention. Such a priority claim will (on the assumption that it is validly made) be recognized in the national phase in any country that was party to the Paris Convention on the priority date concerned.

Even though India was not bound by the Paris Convention prior to 7 December 1998, a priority claim to an application filed before that date may be recognized under certain provisions of the Indian national law. Declarations have been made under those provisions with the result that priority rights have for some time been accorded to applications filed in certain countries which have agreements to that effect with India and to applications filed in countries which are members of the World Trade Organization (WTO).

In January 1995, the Indian Government made such a declaration in relation to the "founding" members of WTO, which included the United States of America. A priority claim to a United States application filed on 4 January 1998, whether made in an Indian national application or in an international application designating India (as in your case), will thus be recognized under Indian law.




Handling fee (Japanese Patent Office)

As from 15 March 1999, there will be a change in the equivalent amount of the handling fee, payable in JPY to the Japanese Patent Office as International Preliminary Examining Authority, as indicated in Table II.

PCT STATISTICS — 1 January to 31 December 1998

In 1998, the International Bureau of WIPO received 67,007 international applications, filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, which is 12,585 (23.1%) more than in 1997. The graph below shows the number

of international applications received each year since 1978.

The 67,007 international applications received in 1998 had the effect of 2,542,343 national applications, and of 169,424 regional applications which would be equivalent to 2,264,654 applications for patent protection in the member States of the regional patent systems, that is, a notional equivalent effect, in total, of 4,806,997 national applications.

The table above shows the top 10 countries of origin of international applications for that period. (Note that 15.6% of the applications received were filed with either the European Patent Office or the International Bureau as receiving Offices; those filings, as well as filings received from the other regional patent Offices as receiving Offices, are included in the figures relating to the country of residence of the applicant.)

The number of demands for international preliminary examination also increased in 1998. The total received was 48,193, which represents an increase over 1997 of 19.3%.

Further statistics, as well as information on the main events which occurred in 1998 in relation to the PCT, are contained in the Information Note "The Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) in 1998," which is inserted in this issue, and which can also be viewed on the WIPO Internet site.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Unavailability of applicant/inventor to sign the international application

Q: I am the agent for a PCT application in which all PCT Contracting States have been designated. The applicant company, which is applicant for all designated States except the United States of America (US), has signed the request, and in so doing, has appointed me as agent. However, the (only) inventor, who must appear in the application as applicant/inventor for the US designation, is no longer employed by the applicant company, and cannot be found. It has therefore not been possible to obtain his signature of the application. Bearing in mind that an international application must be signed by all applicants, is there any action I can take to rectify this situation, or will the application be considered withdrawn for lack of signature?

A: According to PCT Article 14(1)(a)(i) and Rule 4.15(a), the request must be signed by the applicant or, if there is more than one applicant, by all of them. There is, however, a procedure under PCT Rule 4.15(b) which makes an exception to that Rule, PCT Rule 4.15(b) provides that, where there are two or more applicants and where an applicant/inventor for the designation of a State whose national law requires that national applications be filed by the inventor (the United States of America is the only such Contracting State) refused to sign the request or could not be found or reached after diligent effort, the request need not be signed by that applicant/inventor if it is signed by at least one applicant and a statement is furnished explaining, to the satisfaction of the receiving Office, the lack of the signature concerned.

The statement explaining the lack of signature can be furnished together with the

request, in which case the respective check box in the check list of Box No. VIII of the request form should be marked ("statement explaining lack of signature"). Otherwise, it must be furnished in response to the Invitation to Correct Defects (Form PCT/RO/106). insofar as it will relate to the lack of signature (see PCT Article 14(1)(a)(i) and (b)). If a statement explaining the lack of signature is to be furnished instead of the signature, it must be filed within the time limit set in the invitation; this time limit will be at least one month from the date of the invitation, and may be extended by the receiving Office (PCT Rule 26.2). Upon receipt of the statement explaining the lack of signature, the receiving Office will decide whether or not it is satisfactory.

If it decides in the negative (or if no statement is furnished), the international application may be considered withdrawn by the receiving Office (see PCT Article 14(1)(b)).

If it decides in the affirmative, PCT Article 14(1)(a)(i) will be complied with, notwithstanding the lack of the signature concerned. In that case, subsequently filed documents in connection with the application will, in general, also not need to be signed by that applicant.

Note, however, that as far as the national phase in the US is concerned, additional proofs may be required by the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) after entry into the national phase if the required oath or declaration by the inventor (see the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. II/C, National Chapter, Summary (US)) is not signed by all the applicant/inventors. It is recommended, therefore, to keep in mind the requirements of the USPTO already at the time the statement under PCT Rule 4.15(b) is prepared.

For further details on the question of signature of an applicant/inventor for the designation of the US, see PCT Rules 53.8(b), 56.1(c), and 90*bis*.5(b).



INFORMATION NOTE

The Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) in 1998

The World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), Geneva, announces the main events which occurred in 1998 in relation to the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) and the results of operations under the PCT for that year.

___ * ___

- 1. Since 1978, the PCT system has offered inventors and industry an advantageous route for obtaining patent protection internationally. By filing one "international" patent application under the PCT, protection for an invention can be sought simultaneously in each of a large number of countries.
- 2. **Developments in 1998.** The International Bureau of WIPO received 67,007 international applications filed worldwide, which is 12,585 (23.1%) more than in 1997. The 67,007 international applications had the effect of 2,542,343 national applications, and of 169,424 regional applications which would be equivalent to 2,264,654 applications for patent protection in the member States of the regional patent systems, that is, a notional equivalent effect, in total, of 4,806,997 national applications.

3. During 1998, four new Contracting States became bound by the PCT (on the dates shown in parentheses):

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Cyprus (April 1, 1998);
Croatia (July 1, 1998);
Grenada (September 22, 1998);
India (December 7, 1998).
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4. Instruments of accession to the PCT were deposited on December 10, 1998, by the *United Arab Emirates* and on December 16, 1998, by *South Africa*, bringing the number of States which had acceded to the PCT by December 31, 1998, to 100, as follows:

- 5. On April 1, 1998, the date on which Cyprus became bound by the PCT, it also became bound by the European Patent Convention. At the same time, the Government of Cyprus decided to close the national route via the PCT, so that Cyprus could be designated only for the purposes of obtaining a European patent (and not for a national patent).
- 6. On July 8, 1998, the date on which Guinea-Bissau became bound by the Bangui Agreement establishing the African Intellectual Property Organization (OAPI), it became possible for PCT applicants to designate Guinea-Bissau for an OAPI patent. Furthermore, as from that date, it has no longer been possible to designate Guinea-Bissau for a national patent.
- In 1998, many amendments of the Regulations under the PCT, which had been adopted 7. by the Assembly of the PCT Union in October 1997, entered into force. One amendment, which entered into force in January 1998, but whose effective implementation was in April 1998, was the making available of the PCT Gazette in two forms: a bilingual paper form and an electronic form in separate English and French versions (see paragraph 27 for details). Other major changes, which entered into force on July 1, 1998, dealt with: the language in which international applications may be filed and the furnishing of translations; priority claims and the furnishing of priority documents; the presentation of nucleotide and/or amino acid sequence listings; references to deposited biological material; the transmittal of a demand to the competent International Preliminary Examining Authority; the time limits for payment of certain fees together with an extension of the time limits for payment, and the introduction of a late payment fee for Chapter II fees; the circumstances in which international applications may be transmitted by other Offices to the International Bureau as receiving Office (see paragraph 18); and the access by third parties to documents in the files of international applications. As a consequence of the amendments, a number of modifications were made during the course of 1998 to: the Administrative Instructions under the PCT; the request and demand forms, and a number of other forms for use by PCT Offices the PCT Receiving Office Guidelines; the PCT International Search Guidelines; and the PCT International Preliminary Examination Guidelines.
- 8. **Developments in PCT Automation**. In March 1998, the Assemblies of the Member States of WIPO approved a proposed project for the automation of the PCT system. The main features of the project are: automation of the PCT operations of the International Bureau with the introduction of an electronic document management system for handling the increasing number of international applications; the development of electronic filing software; the communication between PCT Offices and Authorities and the International Bureau of documents, notifications and information in electronic form; and the development, where necessary of new standards for electronic filing, coding and transmission of data in order to ensure full compatibility of the system used by the International Bureau with those used by the national and regional Offices.
- 9. In April 1998, a "beta test" was initiated in which some volunteer PCT users were given the option of producing the request form as a computer print-out using the PCT-EASY software. The aim of the software is to enable applicants, through the use of its more than 165 validation checks, to avoid making mistakes on filing international applications. During the course of the year, the software was further improved, taking into account the experiences gained and comments received during the beta test phase. On January 1, 1999, the PCT-EASY software was generally released for the filing of international applications with


those receiving Offices that are prepared to accept international applications containing requests in PCT-EASY format together with diskettes, prepared using the PCT-EASY software, containing the abstract part of the international application. The software is now available, together with supporting documentation, in Chinese, English, French, German, Japanese, Russian and Spanish. 

At a later stage, when the necessary implementation is completed, the PCT-EASY software will also enable receiving Offices to receive entire international applications in electronic form, carry out automated formality checks and transmit international applications to the International Bureau and International Searching Authorities in electronic form.

- 10. **Summary of the procedure under the PCT**. The system of patent cooperation established by the PCT means that, by filing only one international application with one Office, the PCT applicant can obtain the effect of regular national filings in any of the PCT Contracting States being designated without initially having to furnish a translation of the application or pay national fees. The national patent granting procedure and the related high expenses are postponed, in the majority of cases, by up to 18 months (or even longer in the case of some Offices).
- 11. In addition to designations of PCT Contracting States for the purpose of obtaining national patents, an international application may include designations for regional patents: ARIPO (African Regional Industrial Property Organization) patents having effect in those States party to the Harare Protocol on Patents and Industrial Designs which are also Contracting States of the PCT; Eurasian patents having effect in States party to the Eurasian Patent Convention; European patents having effect in States party to the European Patent Convention; and OAPI (African Intellectual Property Organization) patents having effect in States party to the Bangui Agreement.
- 12. Each international application is subjected to an international search carried out by one of the major patent Offices of the world acting as an International Searching Authority under the PCT which establishes a report setting out the relevant prior art. That report is received by the applicant about 16 months after the priority date. The international application is published, together with the international search report, by the International Bureau 18 months after the priority date and is then transmitted to the applicant and the designated Offices.
- 13. If the applicant requests, and most do so (see paragraph 23), the international application is also subjected to international preliminary examination under PCT Chapter II, carried out by one of the Offices which acts as an International Preliminary Examining Authority, and the entry into the national phase of the procedure is postponed from 20 months after the priority date until 30 months after that date. The examination results in a report which includes an opinion as to whether the claimed invention fulfills the criteria of novelty, inventive step and industrial applicability. The international preliminary examination report is usually received by the applicant about 28 months after the priority date, and is also sent to the designated Offices which were elected under Chapter II.

- 14. With the international search report and the international preliminary examination report, the applicant is in a much better position to decide whether to initiate the national patent granting procedure before the various designated patent Offices. If the applicant considers, in the light of such reports, that it is worthwhile to continue seeking patent protection in several countries, he may then decide to pay national fees and professional fees for patent agents abroad, and to incur the cost of preparing translations. This need not be done until 20 months after the priority date (that is, eight months later than under the traditional system), or, if the applicant has filed, in time, a demand for international preliminary examination, until 30 months after the priority date (that is, 18 months later than under the traditional system). At that later time, the applicant is also in a much better position to decide about the need for patent protection having regard to increased knowledge of the technical and economic prospects of the invention.
- 15. *Statistics*. The following graph shows the number of international applications received by the International Bureau in each calendar year since the beginning of PCT operations:

17. In 1998, the average number of designations made per international application was 40.5 (1997: 35.3). This figure is much higher than the number of States for which patent protection will eventually be sought, because the applicants in respect of 55.5% (1997: 47.8%) of all international applications received by the International Bureau in 1998 used the possibility of paying the maximum of 11 designation fees⁴ while making as many as all possible designations. Such applicants extend the effects of their international applications to as many States as might later be of interest to them, deferring a decision as to which States they wish to proceed in. Most applicants make designations for regional patents, which designations themselves have effect in a number of States. For example, in 1998, a European patent was sought in 96.7% of all international applications.

18. In 1998, the International Bureau of WIPO as receiving Office received 2,182 international applications, which is 540 (32.8%) more than in 1997, from applicants from 49 countries. Those applications included 437 which benefited from the safeguard procedure under which international applications are transmitted from another receiving Office to the International Bureau in its capacity as receiving Office while retaining their initial filing date (for example, where they have been filed with a "non-competent" receiving Office, or where they are filed in a language which is not accepted by the other Office).



23. The demands for international preliminary examination received in 1998 relate mainly to international applications filed in 1997. Demands are filed in respect of more than 80% of all applications.

- 24. *Meetings*. The Assembly of the PCT Union held its twenty-sixth (15th ordinary) session in Geneva from September 7 to 15, 1998. The Assembly decided to amend the Schedule of Fees to decrease the maximum number of designation fees payable with effect from January 1, 1999, from 11 to 10. This means that any designation made under PCT Rule 4.9(a) in excess of 10 will not require the payment of a designation fee. The Assembly also adopted an amendment to the Schedule of Fees, with effect from January 1, 1999, to provide for a reduction of 200 Swiss francs (or the equivalent in other currencies) in the total amount payable in respect of the international fee if the following conditions are met: (i) the request is presented as a computer print-out prepared using the PCT-EASY software (see paragraph 9 for details on the PCT-EASY software); (ii) the request is filed together with a computer diskette, prepared using that software, containing a copy in electronic form of the data contained in the request and of the abstract; (iii) the international application is filed with a receiving Office which is prepared to accept the filing of international applications containing requests in PCT-EASY format together with PCT-EASY diskettes.
- 25. *Seminars*. In 1998, officials of the International Bureau participated in 122 seminars which dealt with the use and advantages of the PCT and the promotion of accession to the PCT. In the course of those seminars, which were held in Argentina, Bangladesh, Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, Cameroon, Chile, China, Costa Rica, Cuba, Denmark, Djibouti, Egypt, France, Germany, Ghana, India, Iran, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Norway, Panama, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Republic of Korea, Samoa, Singapore, Slovenia, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand, Tunisia, the United Arab Emirates, the United Kingdom, the United States of America, Uruguay and Zimbabwe, presentations were given in Chinese, English, French, German, Japanese, Korean and Spanish to about 6,650 users and potential users of the PCT system.
- 26. **PCT Information Line.** The PCT Information Line answers general inquiries about the filing of international applications and the procedure during the international phase under the PCT. Where necessary, inquiries are referred to the authorized officer responsible for the particular application, or to the PCT Legal Division. The PCT Information Line can be contacted as follows:

- 27. **Publications under the PCT**. At the beginning of April 1998, the format of the paper version of the *PCT Gazette* changed, the *Gazette* became available on the Internet, and information from the *Gazette* became available on a new CD-ROM. The paper version of the *Gazette* is now bilingual (English and French) and no longer contains abstracts or drawings. Special issues (see paragraph 29) are, however, available in separate English and French versions. The Internet version of the *Gazette* is available, free-of-charge, via the WIPO home page (http://www.wipo.int). It contains, in English and French, the following sections (which are equivalent to the contents of the previous paper version):
 - Section I: Published International Applications (the bibliographic data, the abstract and any drawing, for each international application published). This section is fully searchable, with searches possible by single words or by phrases and by a number of fields.

Section II: Notices and Information Relating to Published International Applications

Section III: Weekly Indexes

Section IV: Notices and Information of a General Character.

- 28. There are now two series of CD-ROMs containing information from the *Gazette*. One is the monthly ESPACE-FIRST CD-ROM which is produced by the European Patent Office (see also paragraph 33). The other series, which has been produced since the beginning of April 1998, was developed by Bundesdruckerei GmbH, in cooperation with WIPO, and is issued every week on the day on which WIPO publishes the corresponding international applications (see also paragraph 36).
- 29. In 1998, the *Gazette* included entries relating to the 59,597 international applications (1997: 50,282) which were published in 1998 in the form of PCT pamphlets (in Chinese, English, French, German, Japanese, Russian or Spanish, depending on the language of filing) on the same day as the relevant issue of the *Gazette*. The *Gazette* also included, in Section IV, a substantial volume of information of a general character concerning new Contracting States and the requirements of the various Offices and International Authorities. In June, a bilingual (English/French) index of the *Gazette* was published for 1997, containing a consolidated version of the indexes published in Section III and an index to Section IV. The following special issues of the *Gazette* were published in 1998:
 - Nos. S-01/1998 (E) and (F) (January) and S-04/1998 (E) and (F) (July)—Consolidated general information relating to PCT Contracting States, national and regional Offices and International Authorities under the PCT;
 - No. S-02/1998 (E) and (F) (June)—Amendments of the PCT Regulations;
 - No. S-03/1998 (E) and (F) (June)—Administrative Instructions under the PCT, as in force from July 1, 1998;
 - No. S-05/1998 (E) and (F) (September)—PCT Receiving Office Guidelines, as in force from August 28, 1998;
 - No. S-06/1998 (E) and (F) (October)—PCT International Search Guidelines, as in force from September 18, 1998;
 - No. S-07/1998 (E) and (F) (October)—PCT International Preliminary Examination Guidelines, as in force from October 9, 1998.

- 31. The *PCT Applicant's Guide*, which contains information on the filing of international applications and the procedure during the international phase as well as information on the national phase and the procedure before the designated (or elected) Offices, was updated twice in 1998 to include the many changes that had occurred during the year. About 500 updating sheets, per language, were sent to each subscriber in 1998.
- 32. Twelve issues of the *PCT Newsletter* were published in 1998. This monthly publication provides up-to-date news for users of the PCT. It contains information on the essential items included in Section IV of the *PCT Gazette* and supplements the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, with practical advice for applicants and agents, a list of forthcoming PCT seminars, consolidated tables of PCT fees in various currencies, and other items of general interest. It also includes tear-out provisional sheets permitting easy inclusion of certain important changes in the *PCT Applicant's Guide* prior to the issuance of six-monthly updates.
- 33. In 1998, the International Bureau continued, in cooperation with the European Patent Office, the weekly production of ESPACE WORLD CD-ROMs, which contain, in facsimile form, the full text and the drawings of all international applications and international search reports published each week, as well as the corresponding bibliographic data in coded, searchable form. All international applications published since 1978 are available in CD-ROM format (a total of 880 CD-ROMs had been produced by the end of 1998).

EPO BOARD OF APPEAL DECISION CONCERNING THE PCT

Lack of unity—multiple request for search fees

As indicated in the following headnote, an EPO Technical Board of Appeal has decided that:

"An invitation of the International Searching Authority to pay additional fees must identify the separate inventions and indicate the amount to be paid. The search report has to cover those separate inventions identified in the invitation for which additional fees have been paid. The PCT does not give a legal basis for successive invitations to pay additional search fees."

(Decision W 1/97 - 3.3.4; Official Journal of the EPO (OJ/EPO), No 1/1999, page 33)

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Eligibility for 75% reduction in certain PCT fees where there is more than one applicant

Q: As a Polish national residing in Poland, I believe I am entitled to the 75% reduction in certain PCT fees. I am going to file a PCT application in which I will be indicated as applicant and inventor for all designated States. My co-inventor, who resides in Poland but who is a national of France, will be named as inventor and also as applicant, but only for the purposes of the designation of United States of America (US). Will I, as a national and resident of a country whose nationals/residents qualify for the fee reduction, still be entitled to the 75% fee reduction?

A: According to the Schedule of Fees which is annexed to the PCT Regulations, the basic fee, the designation fee, the confirmation fee and the handling fee are reduced by 75% for international applications if the applicant is a natural person and is a national of and resides in a State whose per capita national income is below USD 3,000 (according to the average per capita national income figures used by the United Nations for determining its scale of assessments for the contributions payable for the years 1995, 1996 and 1997); if there is more than one applicant, the Schedule of Fees specifically provides that each applicant must satisfy those criteria.

Your co-inventor is applicant even though it is for one designation only (in this case, the US designation). Throughout the Treaty, Regulations and other texts, unless otherwise indicated, the word "applicant" covers both (i) a person, whether a natural person or a legal entity, who is named as applicant" or "applicant only" but who is not an inventor; and (ii) a natural person who, on account of being an inventor, must be indicated as "applicant for the purposes of the United States of America only" and as "applicant and inventor" if the US is designated (see PCT Article 27(3), PCT Rule 18.4 and the request form. Boxes Nos. II and III). Note also that, even if the co-inventor assigned his rights to you, then, irrespective of when such an assignment might take place, as long as the US is designated, it is still required under US national law that the inventor be named as "applicant and inventor" for the US designation.

Consequently, although as a national and resident of Poland you would be entitled to the fee reduction if you were the sole applicant, that reduction will not apply in respect of your application due to the fact that your co-inventor must be included as applicant, and that he is a national of France, a country whose nationals and residents do not qualify for the 75% fee reduction.

It is recalled that where the international application is filed with the International Bureau as receiving Office, a 75% reduction in the transmittal fee is also available under the same conditions as the reduction in the basic, designation, confirmation and handling fees.

Note also that the conditions for applicability of the 75% reduction in the search and examination fees charged by the European Patent Office (EPO) as an International Searching Authority and International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA), respectively, are the same, so far as the nationality and residence of the applicants are concerned, except that in the case of the EPO, the applicant can be a natural person or a legal entity. Note also that, in order to benefit from the fee reduction before the EPO, an express request for reduction (EPO Form 1223/A), signed by the applicants, or on their behalf by their agent, must be filed with the receiving Office and the IPEA, respectively (a copy of that form and corresponding notes were published in the PCT Gazette, No. 46/1996 on page 19814).

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Ensuring that the correct claims are used as the basis for international preliminary examination

Q: I am considering, immediately after filing an international application, submitting a demand for international preliminary examination of that application. I realize, however, that the international preliminary examination may start early as a consequence of the early submission of the demand. I would like to ensure that that examination does not start before I have had the opportunity to file amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19, so that, if I do make any such amendments, the international preliminary examination will start on the basis of the claims as amended, and not as originally filed. How can this be done?

A: Although PCT Article 31(3) requires that the demand be made "separately from" the international application, there is nothing (subject to any applicable national security provision) to prevent it from being submitted immediately after the international application has been filed, which of course, would be before any amendments under PCT Article 19 could be made.

In general, the International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA) can, if it wishes and provided any defects in the demand have been corrected and any required fees have been paid, start the international preliminary examination as soon as it is in possession of both the demand and the international search report (ISR) (or a declaration by the International Searching Authority (ISA) that no ISR will be established) (PCT Rule 69.1(a)). An applicant filing a demand soon after the filing of the international application might not, therefore, have time to file amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19 before the IPEA starts to draw up the international preliminary examination report (IPER). Note that amendments under Article 19 may only be filed after the applicant has received the ISR.

To ensure that any amendments under PCT Article 19 are taken into account as a basis for starting the international preliminary examination and eventually for the purposes of establishing the IPER, and provided the time limit under PCT Article 19 has not yet expired, you should mark the check box in Box No. IV (Basis for International Preliminary Examination) of the demand form (Form PCT/IPEA/401) which states:

"the applicant wishes the start of the international preliminary examination to be

postponed until the expiration of 20 months from the priority date unless the IPEA receives a copy of any amendments made under Article 19 or a notice from the applicant that he does not wish to make such amendments (Rule 69.1(d))".

In accordance with PCT Rule 69.1(d), the IPEA will not, in such a case, start the international preliminary examination before whichever of the following occurs first:

- (1) receipt by the IPEA of a copy of any amendments under PCT Article 19:
- (2) receipt by the IPEA of a notice from the applicant that he does not wish to make amendments under PCT Article 19; or
- (3) the expiration of 20 months from the priority date.

In order to avoid any unnecessary delay in the start of the international preliminary examination procedure, you should ensure that the IPEA is informed promptly of any amendments or of any decision not to file amendments.

If Box No. IV of the demand form is not completed, the international preliminary examination will start on the basis of the international application as originally filed; nevertheless, if a copy of amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19 and/or amendments of the international application under Article 34 are received by the IPEA before it has begun to draw up a written opinion or the IPER,

those amendments will be taken into account. Concerning the latter point, you are reminded that you do also have the opportunity, under PCT Article 34(2)(b), to amend the claims, description and drawings at the start of the international preliminary examination and also during the examination, if time permits, until the preparation of the IPER.

Note that in the case where a demand is submitted after Article 19 amendments have been filed, you should indicate in the demand that the international preliminary examination should start on the basis of the claims as amended under Article 19; the IPEA will not then start the international preliminary examination before it has received a copy of the amendments concerned. You should, in such a case, attach a copy of those amendments to the demand in order to allow as much time as possible for the international preliminary examination procedure. The International Bureau will, in any event, send a copy of those amendments to the IPEA unless it has indicated that it has already received a copy. but waiting for that copy to be sent may delay the start of the international preliminary examination.



NEW PCT CONTRACTING STATE

Costa Rica (country code: CR)

On 3 May 1999, Costa Rica deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT. Costa Rica will become the 101st Contracting State of the PCT on 3 August 1999. Consequently, in any international application filed on or after 3 August 1999, Costa Rica may be designated and, because it will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, may also be elected. Furthermore, nationals and residents of Costa Rica will be entitled from 3 August 1999 to file international applications under the PCT.

SIERRA LEONE JOINS ARIPO

Sierra Leone, which became bound by the PCT on 17 June 1997, deposited, on 25 November 1998, its instrument of accession to the Harare Protocol within the framework of the African Regional Industrial Property Organization (ARIPO) and, as from 25 February 1999, the date on which it became bound by that Protocol, it is possible for PCT applicants to designate Sierra Leone for an ARIPO patent, as well as for a national patent.

PARIS CONVENTION

Accession by Oman

On 14 April 1999, Oman (country code: OM) deposited its instrument of accession to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property. Oman will become bound by that Convention on 14 July 1999.

TIME LIMITS FOR ENTERING THE NATIONAL PHASE

On page 6, an updated version of a table published in PCT Newsletter No. 05/1998, indicates, for each designated/ elected Office, the time limits for entering the national (or regional) phase under Chapter I of the PCT (that is, where the Contracting State concerned has been designated but has not been elected under Chapter II of the PCT within 19 months from the priority date) and under Chapter II (that is, where the Contracting State concerned has been so elected within 19 months from the priority date).

PCT STATISTICS

1 January to 31 March 1999

During the first three months of 1999, the International Bureau of WIPO received 17,659 international applications filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, representing an increase of 7.4% over the same period in 1998.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Priority claim considered not to have been made—possible remedial action by applicant

Q: My company filed an international application on 1 December 1998, indicating a priority claim with an erroneous date of 10 October 1997, instead of the correct date of 10 December 1997, in addition to a priority claim (correctly) dated 5 March 1998. The International Bureau issued an invitation to correct the earlier priority claim because the filing date indicated for that earlier application did not fall within the period of 12 months preceding the international filing date. We prepared a response to that invitation, but unfortunately, due to an oversight, that response was sent after the expiration of the time limit for correcting the priority claim (which was 1 April 1999). Our response crossed in the post with the notification from the International Bureau, dated 15 April 1999, that the priority claim was considered, for the purposes of the procedure under the PCT, not to have been made. We intend to request the designated Offices before which the application is to enter the national phase to reinstate the priority claim of 10 December 1997. Can I still do something within the international phase to safeguard my rights?

A: The finding under PCT Rule 26bis.2(b) that a priority claim is considered, for the purposes of the procedure under the PCT, not to have been made (for example, when

a response to the invitation under PCT Rule 26bis.1(a) is not received within the prescribed time limit) does not prevent any designated Office from recognizing such a priority claim for the purposes of the national procedure if so permitted or required by national law. Certain designated Offices may recognize the priority claim as far as the national phase before them is concerned; other designated Offices may refuse to recognize it.

PCT Rule 26bis.2(c) provides for the possibility of publication, together with the international application, of information about the priority claim which was considered not to have been made. This would serve to alert designated Offices and third parties to the possibility that a request for correction of the priority claim may be made in the national phase. The request for such publication should be filed directly with the International Bureau, together with the special fee payable to the International Bureau for this service, and must be received by the International Bureau prior to the completion of technical preparations for international publication. (The current fee is 50 Swiss francs plus 12 Swiss francs for each sheet in excess of one—see PCT Applicant's Guide, Vol. I/A, Annex B2 (IB)). Note that a copy of the request for such publication will be included in the communication under PCT Article 20 where a copy of the published pamphlet is not used for that communication or where the international application is not published by virtue of PCT Article 64(3).

One very important thing to consider is that you should calculate any time limits which start from the earliest priority date as though the "corrected" priority date applied. For example: you should file a demand for international preliminary examination, if you intend to do so, within 19 months, calculated from 10 December 1997 (not from 5 March 1998); you should enter the national phase before any designated Office which you intend to ask to recognize the priority claim in question within 20 or 30 months, as applicable, from 10 December 1997 (not from 5 March 1998). You should also request the early publication of your international application so that it will take place as soon as possible after 18 months calculated from 10 December 1997 (not from 5 March 1998).





PRACTICAL ADVICE

Late delivery of documents due to delay in the mail service

Q: On 2 April 1999, five weeks after the date of transmittal (26 February 1999) of the international search report, I filed amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19, in relation to an international application claiming the priority of an earlier application filed on 14 November 1997. However, on receipt from the International Bureau of the Notification concerning the filing of amendments of the claims, I was surprised to see that those amendments were received only on 10 May 1999, which was after the expiration of the time limit for submitting amendments under PCT Rule 46.1 (26 April 1999) and even after the completion of technical preparations for publication, which took place, as I later found out from the International Bureau, on 5 May 1999, 15 days before the publication date of 20 May 1999. The amended claims have consequently not been published. Since I feel that I mailed the amendments sufficiently early and that it is due to a delay in the postal service that the amendments were received late, I would like to know whether there is any way in which the delay in the receipt of the amendments can be excused so that they can still be published and be taken into account for further processing during the international and national phases.

A: Under certain conditions, a delay in the delivery of a document may be excused and the time limit in question may be deemed to be met (PCT Article 48(1)). PCT Rule 82 ("Irregularities in the mail service") contains detailed provisions governing the situations where a document or letter arrives late or is lost due to irregularities in the mail service. Evidence that a document or letter has been mailed at least five days prior to the expiration of a time limit may be offered (in your case, this would be five

days prior to the expiration of two months from the date of transmittal of the international search report), provided the following conditions are met:

- the mailing was by airmail (except where surface mail normally arrives at its destination within two days of mailing, or where no airmail service is available); and
- the mail was registered by the postal authorities.

You do not mention how your amendments were mailed, but if your mailing did not meet the above conditions, but you used a delivery service instead, note that some Offices (or organizations), including the International Bureau, will accept evidence of mailing a document where it was registered with a delivery service other than the postal service. The PCT Applicant's Guide, Vol. I/A, Annexes B1 and B2, contains, for each Office, information on whether or not it accepts evidence of mailing a document, in case of loss or delay, where a delivery service other than the postal authorities is used. Some Offices specify particular services which must be used in order for them to accept such evidence. Even if the delivery service is not one of those specified by the Office, or if the Office has not notified the International Bureau that it will accept such evidence, the Office is still not precluded from accepting such evidence.

Any evidence of mailing within the prescribed time limit must be submitted to the Office concerned within one month after the delay was noticed, and in any case within six months from the expiration of the time limit applicable in the particular case (PCT Rule 82.1(c)).

If the addressee, in your case, the International Bureau, is satisfied that the abovementioned conditions have been met, delay in the delivery of the amendments will be excused and they will be published, together with the (republished) front page of the pamphlet, as soon as possible. If the above-mentioned conditions have not been met, the delay in the receipt of your amendments will not be excused. It is recalled, however, that you still have the option of filing amendments under PCT

Article 34 with the International Preliminary Examining Authority, if you have filed or intend to file a demand for international preliminary examination, or of filing amendments under PCT Articles 28 or 41 in the national phase.

Note that, in the case of the loss of a document or letter in the mail, substitution for it of a new copy is permitted, provided that the interested party proves to the satisfaction of the Office concerned that the document or letter offered in substitution is identical with the docu-

ment or letter lost. The time limit for submitting such evidence is the same as that which is applicable when the document or letter is delayed in the mail (see above).

For further information, see the *PCT* Applicant's Guide, Vol. I, paragraphs 465-466, and for details regarding interruptions in the mail service on account of situations such as: war, revolution, civil disorder, strike or natural calamity in the locality where the applicant resides, see PCT Rule 82.2.





PRACTICAL ADVICE

Requesting early national phase examination of an international application in a country which has been elected under Chapter II

Q: I am the agent for an international application, in respect of which a demand for international preliminary examination, electing all designated States, was filed before the expiration of 19 months from the priority date. The applicant has now decided that it would be desirable that a patent be obtained earlier in one of the elected States, and that entry into the national phase therefore take place in that State earlier than the usual 30 months from the priority date provided for under PCT Article 39(1)(a). Is it possible to request that examination in the national phase take place early in any particular State?

A: Generally, if the election of any Contracting State has been effected prior to the expiration of the 19th month from the priority date, examination and other processing of the international application in the national phase does not commence prior to the expiration of the time limit under PCT Article 39(1) (see PCT Article 40(1)). However, PCT

Article 40(2) provides that any elected Office, on the express request of the applicant, may proceed with the examination and other processing of the international application at any time (see the PCT Applicant's Guide, Vol. II/A, general part, paragraph 16.) Note that if such a request is made, the international phase of that international application will continue in respect of all the other elected States.

In your case, provided you have performed the acts necessary for entry into the national phase, that is, paid the national fee, and where applicable, furnished a translation of the international application, you may at any time request the elected Office concerned to start the examination and other processing of the international application earlier than the time limit under PCT Article 39(1). Assuming that your international application has already been published, you do not need to furnish a copy of it since the International Bureau will have made the communication of that application under PCT Article 20 in the form of the published application (PCT pamphlet) (that pamphlet contains the international application itself and any amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19). If, however, at the time of your request for early processing, international publication has not yet taken place, the International Bureau will not have made the communication under PCT Article 20 and you will have to furnish a copy of the international application to the elected Office concerned; as to amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19, you may wish to furnish a copy thereof, together with a translation, if you wish them to be taken into account.

Subsequently, the elected Office concerned will still receive the international preliminary examination report and any annexes thereto.

The provision for making express requests for early examination and other processing of the international application in the national phase does not apply exclusively to elected Offices—it also applies in respect of any designated Office at any time during the international phase (see PCT Article 23(2)).





NEW PCT CONTRACTING STATE

Morocco (country code: MA)

On 8 July 1999, Morocco deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT, and on 8 October 1999, will become bound by the PCT. Consequently, in any international application filed on or after 8 October 1999, Morocco may be designated and, because it will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, may also be elected. Furthermore, nationals and residents of Morocco will be entitled from 8 October 1999 to file international applications under the

SIERRA LEONE: FURTHER INFORMATION ON DESIGNATIONS FOR AN ARIPO PATENT

Further to the accession of Sierra Leone to the Harare Protocol within the framework of the African Regional Industrial Property Organization (ARIPO) (see PCT Newsletter No. 05/1999), all international applications whose international filing date is on or after 25 February 1999 and which contain a designation for an ARIPO patent ("AP") expressed so as to include any State which is a Contracting State of the Harare Protocol and of the PCT are considered to include the designation of Sierra Leone ("SL") for the purposes of obtaining an ARIPO patent. It should be noted that, even where that fact is not reflected in the Notification of receipt of record copy (Form PCT/IB/301),

the records of the International Bureau will be modified accordingly and the international applications concerned, when published in the form of pamphlets and in the *PCT Gazette*, will include that designation. *No action is required on the part of applicants.*

PCT STATISTICS

1 January to 30 June 1999

During the first six months of 1999, the International Bureau of WIPO received 36,097 international applications filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, representing an increase of 7.8% over the same period in 1998.

Of those 36,097 international applications filed, 2,488 (6.9%) were filed using the PCT-EASY software; as many as 30.5% of those 2,488 applications originated from applicants from Japan. As PCT users are becoming more aware of the benefits of using the PCT-EASY software, the share of PCT-EASY filings is showing a steady increase—during the month of June, such filings accounted for 12.9% of all international applications filed.

The number of demands for international preliminary examination filed under Chapter II during the same period amounted to 26,836, representing an increase of 10.9% over the same period last year.

MOST FREQUENT PCT USERS IN 1998

In 1998, 269 PCT applicants accounted for 34.9% (20,884) of the 59,597 international applications published, each with 25 or more such applications. Of these 269 applicants (in general, the first-named applicants in the applications concerned), 49.4% were from the United States of America, 14.9% from Japan, and 12.3% from Germany. There were 44 applicants in each of whose names more than 100 international applications were published. The largest PCT user in 1998 was Siemens Aktiengesellschaft, with 1,061 international applications published that year.

The list of the 269 most frequent PCT users in 1998 appears on pages 9 to 13.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Withdrawal of designations

Q: I am the agent for a company which is the applicant, together with two applicant/inventors, for an international application in which eight PCT Contracting States have been designated (the applicant/inventors are indicated as applicants for the purposes of the US designation only). The company has decided to restrict the number of States designated in the application by withdrawing the designations of three States, including that of the US. Could you explain the procedure for doing this, and tell me whether any fee is payable? Will I be entitled to a refund of those three designation fees, which have already been paid?

A: You may withdraw the designation of any State by way of a notice of withdrawal, preferably addressed to the International Bureau, provided that the notice is received before the expiration of 20 months from the priority date or, where PCT Article 39(1) applies in respect of the States concerned, prior to the expiration of 30 months from the priority date (see below). If you send the notice of withdrawal to the receiving Office (which you have the option to do under PCT Rule 90bis.2(d)), that Office will mark the date of receipt on the notice and will transmit it to the International Bureau; the notice will be considered to have been submitted to the International Bureau on the date marked.

Although you have the option to send the notice of withdrawal to the receiving Office, or, where PCT Article 39(1) applies, to the International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA), it is strongly recommended that any such notices of withdrawal be sent direct to the International Bureau. This is particularly important if the date of completion of technical preparations for international publication of the international application is close, since, in order to prevent the publication of the designations concerned, the notice of withdrawal must reach the International Bureau before those technical preparations have been completed (which is generally by the 15th day prior to the date of publication) (PCT Rule 90bis.2(e)). Sending the notice of withdrawal direct to the International Bureau will also ensure that the designated Offices concerned will be

informed of the withdrawal of the designations as soon as possible.

If you wish to withdraw the designation of a State which has been designated for the purposes of both a national and a regional patent, you should make it clear which of the designations is intended to be withdrawn. If there is no such clarification, the withdrawal of the designation of that State will be taken to mean the withdrawal only of the designation for the purpose of obtaining a national patent (see PCT Rule 90bis.2(b)).

The notice of withdrawal must be signed by all the applicants, including the applicant/inventors. If you have been appointed as agent by all the applicants, you may sign the notice on their behalf. No fee is payable for the withdrawal of designations (as is the case also for the withdrawal of priority claims or of the international application), but you will not be entitled to any refund of designation fees.

Since the applicant/inventors are applicants for the designation of the US only, and the designation of US is to be withdrawn, they will no longer be applicants for any of the designated States. You should therefore, submit, preferably together with the notice of withdrawal, a replacement first sheet of the request indicating the remaining applicant company as the only applicant (for all designated States) and indicating each of the former applicants for the US no longer as "applicant and inventor," but as "inventor only." If you fail to do this, however, it will not be considered as a defect in the application, and the request will be corrected ex officio by the receiving Office or by the International Bureau; whichever authority makes the correction will notify the other and the applicant accordingly. Note that you should not send a replacement second sheet of the request indicating the new status of designations—this will be corrected ex officio by the authority concerned.

Upon receipt of the notice of withdrawal, a confirmation of the withdrawal, including the date of receipt of the notice by the authority concerned, will be sent by the International Bureau to you, and to the designated Offices affected by the withdrawal if they have already been notified of their designation (Administrative Instructions under the PCT, Section 415(a)).

You did not indicate whether you have filed a demand for international preliminary examination, but note that, if you filed a demand before the expiration of 19 months from the priority date and the designated States that you now wish to withdraw were elected, the elections concerned may be withdrawn by way of a notice of withdrawal of those elections, preferably addressed to the International Bureau, provided that the notice is received before the expiration of 30 months from the priority date. If you submit the notice of withdrawal to the IPEA, that Authority will mark the date of receipt of the notice and transmit if to the International Bureau. The notice will be considered to have been submitted to the International Bureau on the date marked.

It is important to note, however, that if elections are withdrawn after the expiration of the time limit under PCT Article 22 for entry into the national phase, the withdrawal will be treated in each of the elected States concerned as a withdrawal of the international application for that State unless the national phase has already started in that State. If the withdrawal is effected before the expiration of that time limit, the international application will not be considered withdrawn in respect of the States concerned, but if the applicant fails to perform the acts referred to in PCT Article 22 within the applicable time limit, the effect of the international application will cease in those States with the same consequences as the withdrawal of any national application in those States (PCT Article 24(1)).

In any designated or elected Office where the processing or examination of the international application has already started under PCT Article 23(2) or 40(2), the withdrawal of the designation or election will have no effect (see PCT Rule 90bis.6(a)).

For further details on the withdrawal of designations and elections, see *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/A, paras. 454–459 and paras. 462—3, respectively.

FORM RELATING TO ENTRY INTO THE REGIONAL PHASE BEFORE THE EUROPEAN PATENT OFFICE

If, in respect of an international application in which EP has been designated, the

European Patent Office (EPO) has not received the fees payable for entry into the regional phase by the expiration of 21 months from the priority date, the practice of the EPO is to send out EPO Form 1217. This form is a communication pursuant to EPC Rule 85a(1) reminding the applicant that he has not paid the required fees within the time limit under EPC Rule 104b(1), and informing him of a one month grace period within which the required fees (together with a 50% surcharge) may be paid.

Note that some PCT applicants may receive this form even when they have filed a demand for international preliminary examination before the expiration of 19 months from the priority date (thereby extending the time limit for entry into the regional phase from 21 to 31 months). This may occur where the EPO has not yet received the notification of its election. Applicants should be aware that EPO Form 1217 contains the following note concerning such cases:

"NOTE: If the present communication is despatched upon expiration of 21 months from the priority date, while the international preliminary examination under PCT Chapter II has been requested within the prescribed time limit and EP has been elected, thereby extending the time limit for entry into the regional phase before the EPO to 31 months, *applicants are invited to inform the EPO immediately* (OJ EPO 1992, 245)."



THE UNITED REPUBLIC OF TANZANIA JOINS ARIPO

The United Republic of Tanzania deposited, on May 3, 1999, its instrument of accession to the Harare Protocol within the framework of the African Regional Industrial Property Organization (ARIPO), and became bound by that Protocol on August 3, 1999. This means that, as from September 14, 1999, the date on which the United Republic of Tanzania will become bound by the PCT, it will be possible for PCT applicants to designate the United Republic of Tanzania for an ARIPO patent, as well as for a national patent.

Note that all international applications whose international filing date is on or after September 14, 1999 and which contain a designation for an ARIPO patent ("AP") expressed so as to include any State which is a Contracting State of the Harare Protocol and of the PCT will be considered to include the designation of the United Republic of Tanzania ("TZ") for the purposes of obtaining an ARIPO patent.

Withdrawal of the designation of a State which has been elected

Q: I read, in the last issue of the PCT Newsletter (No. 08/1999), the practical advice concerning the withdrawal of designations and am a little confused about one point. Please could you tell me whether, if the designation of a State is withdrawn and that State was also elected, it is necessary to make a separate withdrawal of the election of that State, in addition to the withdrawal of the designation of that State?

A: Where the designation of a State is withdrawn and that State was also elected, it is not necessary to withdraw the election of that State as well. PCT Rule 90bis.2 states that "withdrawal of the designation of a State which has been elected shall entail withdrawal of the corresponding election under Rule 90bis.4."

Guidelines on how to present drawings in international applications

Q: I have received an invitation to correct defects (Form PCT/RO/106) in an international application I recently filed. The invitation lists a number of defects in the way in which the drawings are presented, which I was somewhat expecting because my client provided me with the drawings just before the international application had to be filed, and there was no time to formalize them. Apart from the Rules referred to on Form PCT/RO/106, have any guidelines been published on how to present drawings in international applications?

A: The requirements under the PCT for the presentation of drawings are indicated in PCT Rule 11, "Physical Requirements of the International Application" (see, in particular, PCT Rules 11.10, 11.11 and 11.13), but there are other sources of more detailed information on the subject.

In July 1998, a series of guidelines for drawings under the PCT was incorporated into the text of the *PCT Applicant's Guide* (see Vol. I/A, paras. 143–178); those guidelines replace the earlier, separate

publication entitled "Guidelines for drawings under the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT)," which was published in 1978. The guidelines for drawings which are included in the *PCT Applicant's Guide* are a very useful source of information on that subject, and contain detailed replies to the following questions:

- when is the inclusion of drawings required in the international application?
- how must the drawings be presented?
- should figures of drawings be arranged in a particular manner?
- how must drawings be numbered?
- how should drawings be executed?
- may lines of different thicknesses be used in the same drawing?
- how should leading lines be shown?
- how are cross-sections to be represented?
- what should be the scale of figures of the drawings?
- how should numbers, letters, reference signs and like indications be presented and applied to drawings?
- may drawings contain text matter?
- may symbols be used in drawings?
- is the use of shading permitted?
- may a photograph be presented instead of a drawing?
- may a list of reference signs used in the drawings be included in the description?
- how can obvious errors in the drawings be rectified?
- can the drawings be amended during the international phase?

If you are not familiar with the way in which drawings in international applications should be presented, it is highly recommended that you read this section of the *PCT Applicant's Guide*. Note that it can also be viewed free of charge on the Internet (http://www.wipo.int) from the PCT index page ("PCT system") by selecting "PCT Applicant's Guide," —"Vol. I: International phase," —"Chapter V," — "The drawings."

REDUCTIONS IN PCT FEES

The PCT Union Assembly held its twenty-seventh (12th ordinary) session in Geneva during the period from 20 to 29 September 1999, as part of the meetings of the Assemblies of the member States of WIPO, and made the following decisions concerning reductions in PCT fees payable for the benefit of the International Bureau.

Reduction in the amount of the designation fee and in the maximum number of designation fees payable

The Assembly decided to amend the Schedule of Fees to decrease the designation fee, with effect from 1 January 2000, from 150 Swiss francs to 140 Swiss francs. This reduction will apply both to express designations made under PCT Rule 4.9(a) and to precautionary designations under PCT Rule 4.9(b) confirmed under PCT Rule 4.9(c).

In addition, the maximum number of designation fees payable will be decreased, also with effect from 1 January 2000, from 10 to 8. It is recalled that the maximum number of designation fees payable relates only to express designations made under PCT Rule 4.9(a), not to precautionary designations being later confirmed under PCT Rule 4.9(c).

The fee reductions will benefit all applicants since the international fee will be decreased by an amount ranging from 1% for an application containing only one designation to about 17% for an application containing 8 or more designations.

At present, the maximum designation fee is paid in respect of more than half of all PCT applica-

tions. Paying that maximum amount while designating all PCT Contracting States allows applicants to keep all possible options open until the end of the international phase before deciding whether, and in which designated and/or elected States, to proceed with the application into the national/regional phase.

The reduction in the designation fee and in the maximum number of designation fees payable will have the effect that:

(1) for international applications received on or after 1 January 2000: no designation fee will be due for any designation made under PCT Rule 4.9(a) in excess of 8; this means that the maximum amount payable of 1,120 Swiss francs (instead of 1,500 Swiss francs, which is the current maximum amount payable), will cover all possible designations made under PCT Rule 4.9(a);

- (2) for international applications received before 1 January 2000: the maximum number of eight (not ten) designation fees, and the lower designation fee of 140 Swiss francs will also be payable under the following circumstances:
- (a) if the date on which the designation fees are due is later than one month from the date of receipt of the international application (that is, where the time limit under PCT Rule 15.4(b)(i) applies (one year from the priority date)) (see PCT Rule 15.4(c));
- (b) the due date for payment of the designation fees (see item 1) falls on or after 1 January 2000; and
- (c) the designation fees are actually paid on or after 1 January 2000.

NEW EQUIVALENT AMOUNTS OF FEES

The equivalent amounts in other currencies of the new amount of the designation fee will be published in the next issue of the *PCT Newsletter*, along with new equivalent amounts of the basic fee, the supplement per sheet over 30, the PCT-EASY reduction, the international search fee and the handling fee, which will be applicable as from 1 January 2000, but which are still to be confirmed by the Offices concerned.

AMENDMENTS OF THE PCT REGULATIONS CONCERNING PRIORITY CLAIMS

The PCT Union Assembly adopted, at the session referred to above, amendments to PCT Rule 4.10 concerning priority claims, with the result that, with effect from 1 January 2000, it will be possible to claim the priority of an application filed in or for a State which is a Member of the World Trade Organization (WTO), even if that State is not party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property (Paris Convention). The amendments have been adopted in order to bring PCT Rule 4.10 into line with Article 2.1 of the WTO administered Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property (TRIPS Agreement), by which a large number of Members of the WTO will become bound on 1 January 2000. An explanation follows.

Under the present PCT Rules, where an international application contains a priority claim based on an earlier application filed in a Member of the WTO that is not a party to the Paris Convention, such a priority claim will, under PCT Rule 26bis, be considered not to have been made. However, upon request of the applicant and subject to certain conditions, information about such a priority claim is published together with the international application, which makes it easier for the designated States that are bound by Article 2.1 of the TRIPS Agreement to fulfil their obligation, under that Article, to recognize the priority regardless of the procedural treatment of that priority claim for the purposes of the PCT international phase.

In view of the fact that a large number of the Members of the WTO that are not yet bound

by Article 2.1 of the TRIPS Agreement will become bound by that Article on 1 January 2000, and in order to ease the burden on applicants claiming priority which many PCT Contracting States must recognize if they are bound by Article 2.1 of the TRIPS Agreement, it is appropriate to permit applicants, as from that date, to include in their international applications claims to priority based on an earlier filing in a WTO Member which is not party to the Paris Convention. However, a PCT Contracting State that is not a Member of the WTO would not be obliged to recognize the effects of such a priority claim.

If the amendments to PCT Rule 4.10 (paragraphs (a) and (b)) which are to enter into force on 1 January 2000 are not compatible with the national law applied by a designated Office, those paragraphs as in force until 31 December 1999 will, according to new PCT Rule 4.10(d), continue to apply after that date in respect of that designated Office for as long as the said paragraphs as amended continue not to be compatible with that law, provided that the said Office informs the International Bureau accordingly by 31 October 1999. The names of any Offices which so inform the International Bureau will be published in the PCT Gazette and in the PCT Newsletter.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Filing amendments to the description, claims or drawings after the late filing of a demand for international preliminary examination

Q: I have just filed a demand for international preliminary examination of an international application and just missed the 19-month time limit which is required for postponement of the national phase from 20 to 30 months. I have, nevertheless, paid the required Chapter II fees and wish to proceed with the international preliminary examination of the application. Please could you confirm that the elected Offices will still receive the international preliminary examination report. Also, if I decide to make any amendments to the description, claims or drawings during the course of the international preliminary examination procedure, will the Offices that I elected receive a copy of those amendments, and if so, will they take them into account?

A: Even if you have filed a demand after the 19-month time limit, the international preliminary examination will, provided you have paid the required Chapter II fees on time, still take place and the international preliminary examination report (IPER) will still be established by the International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA) and sent to you and to the International Bureau, which will send copies to the Offices that you elected. That IPER will contain, as annexes, any amendments to the description, claims or drawings made under PCT Article 34 which have served as a basis for international preliminary examination (PCT Rule 70.16) (not including any amendments which were superseded by later amendments).

In the circumstances you describe, you would have to enter the national phase under PCT

Article 22(1), that is, within 20 (or 21) months from the priority date, and the IPER would not, of course, have been established by that time. The IPER is established by the expiration of whichever of the time limits under PCT Rule 69.2 expires last:

- 28 months from the priority date;
- eight months from the date of payment of Chapter II fees; or
- (if applicable) eight months from the date of receipt by the International Preliminary Examining Authority of the translation of the international application.

This means that the amendments contained in the annexes to the IPER would not reach the Offices until some time after the national phase had been entered before them as designated Offices.

However, even though the national/regional phase has been entered under PCT Article 22 before an Office as a *designated Office*, nothing under the PCT prevents that Office (having been elected, albeit belatedly) from taking into account the IPER and its annexes in the course of its national examination—it is up to each Office to decide whether it will do so or not.

If you wish to guarantee that your amendments are received in time to be taken into account for the purposes of the national phase procedure, however, you should also file them directly with the Offices concerned in the prescribed language and within the time limit applicable in each Office.

According to PCT Rule 78.2, where an election has been effected after the expiration of the 19th month from the priority date and the applicant wishes to make amendments, it is the time limit for making amendments under PCT Article 28 which applies (in general, one month from the fulfillment of the requirements for entering the national phase under PCT Article 22; see PCT Rule 52.1(a)), noting that in respect of many national/regional Offices, much later time limits apply.

For details of the time limits for filing amendments of the application before each national/regional Office, see the corresponding National Chapter of the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. II.

PCT FEE TABLES



PUBLICATION OF INTER-NATIONAL APPLICATIONS IN THE NEW YEAR; NON-WORKING DAYS DURING THE HOLIDAY PERIOD

Special date for completion of technical preparations for publication

WIPO has made a concerted effort, by way of the revision of many of its computer programs and of thorough testing, to ensure that all of its systems are "year 2000 (Y2K) compliant." Although the risks of problems associated with Y2K have been minimized, the possibility, at the beginning of the year, of unforeseen problems with the computer systems of WIPO, as well as with those of other PCT Offices and of PCT applicants, cannot be ruled out. There could also be problems with fax machines, be it those of WIPO, other PCT Offices or applicants, which could prevent the International Bureau from being notified of lastminute changes affecting the publication of international applications.

The International Bureau has therefore decided, as an ex-

ceptional precautionary measure, to work on the basis of an earlier date for the completion of technical preparations for publication of those international applications which are due to be published during the month of January 2000, that is, for those applications which are due to be published on 6, 13, 20 and 27 January 2000. Any information which should be reflected in any issue of the *PCT Gazette* and any PCT

PCT STATISTICS

1 January to 30 September 1999

During the first nine months of 1999, the International Bureau of WIPO received 54,473 international applications filed with PCT receiving Offices worldwide, representing an increase of 9.3% over the same period in 1998.

The number of demands for international preliminary examination filed under Chapter II during the same period amounted to 38,371, representing an increase of 7% over the same period last year.

MODIFIED REQUEST AND DEMAND FORMS

Request Form (PCT/RO/101)

The Request Form, the Notes to the request form, the Fee Calculation Sheet (Annex to the request form) as well as the Notes to the fee calculation sheet, have been modified with effect from 1 January 2000.

The following new PCT Contracting States have become bound by the PCT since the last revision of the form in July 1999 and have been added to Box No. V under National Patent: CR Costa Rica, DM Dominica, MA Morocco and TZ Tanzania. TZ Tanzania has also been added to the AP ARIPO box under Regional Patent, following its accession to the Harare Protocol within the framework of the African Regional Industrial Property Organization (ARIPO). Other modifications have also been made to the Notes to the request form, namely, to the Notes to Box No. V, in respect of certain kinds of protection for certain States, and to the Notes to Box No. VI, to take into account the amendments of the Regulations under the PCT which will enter into force on 1 January 2000, which provide for the possibility of claiming priority on the basis of applications filed in any member of the

World Trade Organization that is not party to the Paris Convention.

The Fee Calculation Sheet, which is annexed to the Request Form, has been modified to take into account the reduction, effective 1 January 2000, in the maximum number of designation fees payable, from 10 to 8. The Notes to the fee calculation sheet have been modified accordingly, and have also been modified to take into account the fact that the residents and nationals (natural persons) of the above-mentioned new PCT Contracting States are eligible for a reduction in the basic, designation and confirmation fees.

The other sheets of the Request Form have not been modified except for the inclusion on each sheet of an indication of the date of reprinting.

Modified versions of the second sheet of the Request Form (which includes Box No. V) in English and French are included in this issue as white tear-out sheets for insertion in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/B, Annex X. Demand Form (PCT/IPEA/401)

The Demand Form has not been modified except for the inclusion of the date of reprinting (January 2000) on each sheet.

There is one modification to the Notes to the fee calculation sheet, which are annexed to the Demand Form, in respect of the above-mentioned new PCT Contracting States whose residents and nationals (natural persons) are eligible for a reduction in the handling fee.

How to obtain copies of the Request and Demand Forms

Consolidated versions, in English and French, of the modified Request and Demand Forms, together with their respective accompanying notes, will be included in the January 2000 update of the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/B, Annexes X

and Y. As from the end of December 1999, copies of the Request Form in English, French, German and Spanish can also be obtained, free of charge, from receiving Offices and the International Bureau, and copies of the Demand Form in those languages can also be obtained, free of charge, from receiving Offices, International Preliminary Examining Authorities and the International Bureau. Due to translation requirements, there may be a slight delay in the availability of those forms in other languages.

The January 2000 versions of the Request and Demand Forms in English, French, German and Spanish will also be included, in PDF format, on the WIPO Internet site (http://www.wipo.int) at the beginning of the new year.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Amount applicable when the amount of the designation fee has changed; time limit for payment of the designation fee

Q: I filed an international application on 1 July 1999, claiming the priority of an earlier application filed on 11 January 1999 and designating all PCT Contracting States. Since the designation fee is due within one year from the priority date, that is, by 11 January 2000, I decided not to pay that fee at the same time as I paid the basic fee, and have not yet paid it. I read in the October issue of the PCT Newsletter that, with effect from 1 January 2000, there is to be a reduction in the designation fee and a reduction in the maximum number of designation fees payable. If I pay the fee on or after 1 January 2000. will I have to pay the amount which was applicable when the international application was filed, or can I pay the new, lower amount of the designation fee and the lower maximum of eight designation fees? Also, what would be the situation if, to ensure that the fee is paid on time, I pay it a little earlier, towards the end of December?

A: The time limit for the payment of the designation fee is, in respect of your

international application, and in accordance with PCT Rule 15.4(b)(i), one year from the priority date, that is, by 11 January 2000. Since it is the time limit under PCT Rule 15.4(b)(i) which applies (the time limit under PCT Rule 15.4(b)(ii) not being applicable since one month from the date of receipt of the application does not expire later than one year from the priority date), the amount payable will be that which is applicable *on the date of payment* (PCT Rule 15.4(c)).

Therefore, if your payment reaches the receiving Office on or after 1 January 2000, the amount payable will be the new, lower, amount of the designation fee-that is, 140 Swiss francs (or the equivalent amount in the currency accepted by your receiving Office), and the maximum number of designation fees payable will be 8 (that is, a total of 1,120 Swiss francs (or equivalent)). If, however, your payment reaches the receiving Office before that date, the current, higher, amount of 150 Swiss francs (or equivalent) and the current higher maximum of 10 designations will apply (that is, a total of 1500 Swiss francs (or equivalent)).

If you send your payment too close to the expiration of the time limit for the payment of the fee, and your payment is not received in time, you might receive an invitation under PCT Rule 16bis.1(b) to pay the missing amount. Since, as in your case, the time limit under PCT Rule 15.4(b)(i) applies, the amount that you would be invited to pay would, according to PCT Rule 16bis.1(b), be the amount applicable on the last day of the one-year period from the priority date, that is, the new, lower amount. The receiving Office may, however, also charge you a late payment fee, which would be payable in addition to the missing amount (PCT Rule 16bis.2).

Note, however, that, according to PCT Rule 16*bis*.1(d), if your payment is received by the receiving Office before it sends the above-mentioned invitation under PCT Rule 16*bis*.1(b), your payment will be considered to have been received in time: no invitation to pay the missing fee will be sent to you and no late payment fee will be charged.



AMENDED PCT RULE 4.10 AND PCT SCHEDULE OF FEES

As indicated in *PCT Newsletter* No. 10/1999, PCT Rule 4.10, as amended with effect from 1 January 2000, will enable applicants to claim the priority of an earlier application filed in or for a Member of the World Trade Organization that is not party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property.

NOTIFICATIONS OF INCOMPATIBILITY WITH PCT RULE 4.10, AS IN FORCE FROM 1 JANUARY 2000

New paragraph (d) of PCT Rule 4.10, as in force from 1 January 2000, provides that if, on 29 September 1999, amended paragraphs (a) and (b) of Rule 4.10 are not compatible with the national law applied by any designated Office, those paragraphs as

amended will not apply to that Office but those paragraphs as in force until 31 December 1999 will continue to apply after that date in respect of that Office for as long as the incompatibility continues to exist, provided that the said Office informs the International Bureau accordingly by 31 October 1999.

Due to the introduction of a new pricing structure which will be applied from January 2000, the basic price, not including mailing costs, for a subscription to the PCT Newsletter for January to December 2000 is 50 Swiss francs. In addition, you must pay 10 Swiss francs for regular mail and 20 Swiss francs for priority mail. Therefore, the regular mail (previously referred to as "surface mail") subscription price of 60 francs remains the same and the new priority mail (previously referred to as "airmail") subscription price of 70 Swiss francs represents a 12.5% reduction in the price. The equivalent amounts in US dollars will be 42 US dollars for the basic price, 50.40 US dollars by regular mail and 58.80 US dollars by priority mail.

The price of the *PCT Newsletter* binder is now 13.20 Swiss francs or 9.60 US dollars by regular mail, or 15.40 Swiss francs or 11.20 US dollars by priority mail.

If you are already a subscriber, it is not necessary to return the form since, unless notification to the contrary is received from you by WIPO, subscription renewal is automatic; subscribers will shortly receive an invoice for year 2000 subscriptions. You are reminded that, for subscriptions to more than one copy, you are entitled to a 25% discount off the basic price for each copy subscribed to (including the first). BUDAPEST TREATY ACCESSION

Croatia

On 25 November 1999, Croatia deposited its instrument of accession to the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure. That Treaty will enter into force with respect to Croatia on 25 February 2000.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

Indication of dates and numbering of international applications in the year 2000

Q: I know that, at present, dates in an international application, for example, the filing dates of earlier applications (in Box No. VI "Priority Claim" of the Request Form) should be repeated in parentheses by indicating a sequence of three two-digit Arabic numbers: for the date, the number of the month and for the last two numbers of the year. Will the number of the year, as from 1 January 2000, continue to be indicated by two-digit Arabic numerals, in other words "00" for the year 2000, or will it have to be indicated as a four-digit number, as is the case in certain other situations?

A: For the time being, the two-digit system of indicating dates, so far as international applications are concerned, at the International Bureau *will remain unchanged*. The shorter date which should be indicated, for example in Box No. VI, in

parentheses after, above or below the longer date (the latter consisting of the Arabic number of the day, the name of the month and the (complete) Arabic number of the year) will, for the year 2000 onwards, continue to be indicated as prescribed in Section 110 of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT. Hence, the shorter date will continue to be written as two-digit Arabic numbers, each for the number of the day, for the number of the month and for the last two numbers of the year, with the number of the day, month and year separated by a period, a slant or a hyphen. For example, a priority date of 3 January 2000 will be followed by the shortened, numeric version of that

date: "(03.01.00)," "(03/01/00)" or "(03-01-00)."

Similarly, the system of numbering of international applications will, for the time being, continue to be as prescribed in Section 307 of the *Administrative Instructions under the PCT*, that is, they will continue to be composed of the letters "PCT," a slant, the two-letter code of the receiving Office, a *two-digit* indication of the last two numbers of the year in which the international application was received, a slant, and a five-digit number. For example, the first international application number which will be given by the International Bureau as receiving Office in the year 2000 series will be: PCT/IBOO/00001.

PCT FEE TABLES

The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Vol. I/B, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The total amount of the basic fee and designation fee may be reduced by CHF 200 under certain circumstances where the request is prepared using the PCT-EASY software; see footnote 2 for details. A 75% reduction in the basic fee, the supplement per sheet over 30, the designation fee and the handling fee, as well as the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States; see footnote 3 for details. (Note that if both the CHF 200 reduction and the 75% reduction are applicable, the 75% reduction is calculated *after* the CHF 200 reduction.) - (i) the date on which the earlier application was filed, being a date falling within the period of 12 months preceding the international filing date;
 - (ii) the number of the earlier application;

"4.10 Priority Claim

- (ii) where the earlier application is a regional application and the countries party to the regional patent treaty are not all party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property, the priority claim shall indicate at least one country party to that Convention for which that earlier application was filed."
