Changes in the Structure of the Publication of International Applications

As part of an ongoing effort to improve the availability of patent information, the International Bureau (IB) will publish international applications with an international filing date on or after 1 January 2008, in a slightly different manner. In respect of those international applications, certain documents which, under PCT Rule 48.2(a), are to be “contained” in the publication of the international application, will be presented and disseminated as separate documents. In respect of those international applications, the publication of the international application, available through WIPO’s PATENTSCOPE® Search Service and on PCT Article 20 and PCT Rule 87 DVDs, will consist of the following documents:

1. A single document, containing:
 - the standardized front page;
 - description, claims and drawings (if any);
 - the international search report, or the declaration under Article 17.2(a);
 - amended claims and the associated statement filed under Article 19, if any; and
2. the following documents which form part of the publication of the international application but which are presented and disseminated as separate documents:
 - the sequence listing part of the description, whether filed on paper or filed in electronic form;
 - indications relating to the deposited biological material filed separately from the description;
 - requests from the applicant under PCT Rule 91.3(d) to publish information concerning the request for the rectification of an obvious mistake where the International Searching Authority has refused to authorize the rectification;
 - requests from the applicant under PCT Rule 26*bis*.2(e) to publish information concerning priority claims which the applicant wished to correct or add but for which the time limit under PCT Rule 26*bis*.1 had expired;
 - declarations under PCT Rule 4.17;
 - information concerning a priority claim referred to in PCT Rule 26*bis*.2(d);
 - information concerning a request under PCT Rule 26*bis*.3 for the restoration of right of priority;
 - information concerning incorporation by reference of missing parts and/or elements (Form PCT/RO/114);
 - information concerning one or more priority claims considered void (Form PCT/IB/318); and
 - information concerning authorization of a rectification of an obvious mistake under PCT Rule 91.1.

All of the documents listed above will be made available, where applicable, in the PATENTSCOPE® Search Service (www.wipo.int/pctdb/en/) on the “Documents” tab of the international application concerned.

Note that, while the changes are applicable to international applications filed on or after 1 January 2008, the majority of those applications will, pursuant to the normal PCT publication timeline, not be published before the expiration of 18 months from the priority date, that is, not before 1 July 2008. However, in the exceptional case that the applicant requests early publication under PCT Article 21(2)(b), the IB would publish the international application before 1 July 2008, using the revised structure.

PCT-SAFE Update

Release of new version of the PCT-SAFE Client software

A new version of the PCT-SAFE Client software (version 3.51.026.201), dated 1 January 2008, may now be downloaded from the PCT-SAFE website at:

This version ("build 201") includes the following changes:

- Croatia (HR) and Norway (NO) are included in the EP designation;
- Information on the Nordic Patent Institute as International Searching Authority (ISA/XN);
- New PCT Contracting State Angola (AO) as from 27 December 2007;
- All fee schedules have been updated;
- Compatibility with Windows® Vista; and
- Other minor functionality and graphic user interface enhancements and PCT updates.

Important:

It is necessary to install this new build to be able to file fully electronic applications with the International Bureau as receiving Office (RO/IB) as of 6 January 2008, on which date the RO/IB server digital certificate enabling secure communications changed.

Note concerning PCT applications in Japanese prepared using the Windows® Vista environment

Following the release of the new Windows® Vista-compliant PCT-SAFE client build 201 (see above), applicants filing international applications containing Japanese characters prepared using the PCT-SAFE software in a Windows® Vista environment or a JIS2004 environment are advised that the Microsoft Corporation has changed the appearance of some of the Japanese Kanji characters to comply with the JIS2004 standard. Since the PCT-SAFE client software uses the font information available on the applicant's computer, the appearance of the Japanese Kanji on the computer screen and on printouts will comply with JIS2004, but will be different from those which are contained in the published international application. This is due to the fact that, for the time being, the JIS2004 Kanji characters will be replaced by JIS90 Kanji

characters in the published application. Furthermore, levels 3 and 4 Kanji characters will not be shown in the JIS90 environment.

Practical Advice

Consequence of excluding a designation of a State under PCT Rule 4.9(b) where there is no claim of priority of an earlier national application filed in that State

Q: I filed a number of international applications claiming the priority of earlier applications filed in Germany. In those applications, the relevant check-box in Box No. V of the request form was marked, in accordance with the provisions of PCT Rule 4.9(b), to exclude the designation of Germany. I subsequently filed another international application in which that box was marked, even though the international application did not claim the priority of an earlier application filed in Germany (it claimed the priority of an application filed in Austria). What will be the consequence of the box being checked? Is it still possible to designate Germany?

A: It is recalled that PCT Rule 4.9(b) was adopted to accommodate the situation where the national law of certain countries (at the time of writing this: Germany, Japan, the Republic of Korea and the Russian Federation) provides for automatic withdrawal of an earlier national application if a later-filed international application claims the priority of that earlier national application and designates that State; in such cases, the applicant can exclude the State concerned from the automatic and all-inclusive designation of all PCT Contracting States under PCT Rule 4.9(a), thereby maintaining the priority application.

Even though you have excluded the designation of Germany, under PCT Rule 4.9(b) you may only exclude the designation of such a State in Box No. V **if the priority of an earlier national application filed in that State is claimed in Box No. VI**. Therefore, if, on the date of filing, the request part of your international application contains an indication under Rule 4.9(b) that the designation of Germany is not made, but does not contain a priority claim to an earlier national application filed in that State, you should be notified by the receiving Office, and your attention drawn to Rule 26*bis* ("Correction or Addition of Priority Claim") to give you the opportunity to add any missing priority claim, in case the lack of priority claim is due to an omission on your behalf. In accordance with Section 319 of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT, if, by the expiration of the time limit under Rule 26*bis*.1(a), the receiving Office has not received any notice correcting or adding a priority claim to an earlier national application filed in Germany, it will cancel *ex officio* the indication in Box No. V, and the designation of Germany would thereby be reinstated. The receiving Office would then notify you and the International Bureau, by way of PCT Form PCT/RO/146, that it had cancelled *ex officio* the indication in Box No. V. It would therefore not be necessary for you to take any action in this situation.

Notwithstanding, there would be nothing to prevent you from notifying the receiving Office as soon as you realize that the designation of Germany has been erroneously excluded, and confirming to them that the international application does not claim the priority of an earlier national application filed in Germany. This would streamline the correction procedure (the receiving Office would not have to issue the first notice referred to in the preceding paragraph) and ensure that the receiving Office applied Section 319(b) of the Administrative Instructions directly.

Note that the above would equally apply should a similar situation arise where the designations of Japan, the Republic of Korea or the Russian Federation have been erroneously excluded.

The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 3(a), (b), (c) and (d) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 202(A). A 75% reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 2 and 12. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 75% reduction are applicable, the 75% reduction is calculated **after** the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.

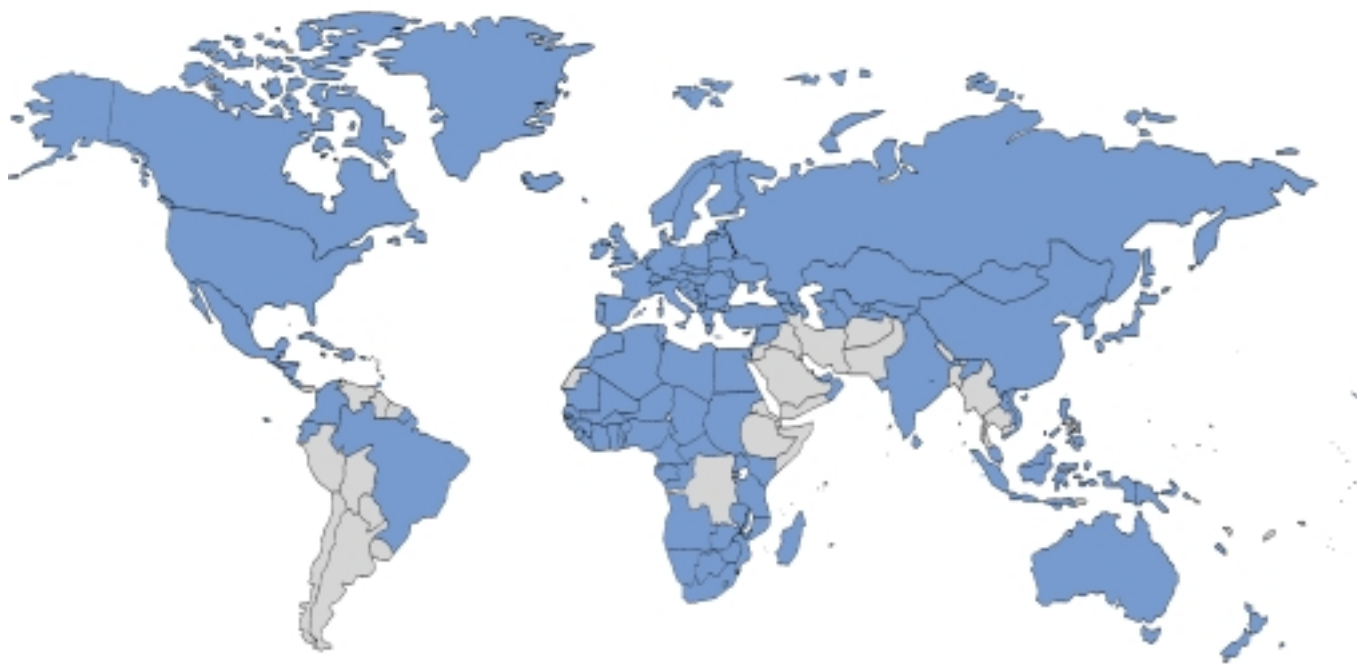

Practical Advice

Filing an international application with a national receiving Office, and relying on that Office to transmit the application to the International Bureau as receiving Office under PCT Rule 19.4

Q: I am a US agent and have been asked by my client, who is resident in US and is a national of Mexico, to file an international application (which does not claim the priority of an earlier national application). The description and claims of the application are in Spanish, but the United States Patent and Trademark Office as receiving Office (RO/US) only accepts international applications filed in English. Since we do not wish to incur the expense of translating the international application into English at this stage of the procedure, I will be filing it with the International Bureau as receiving Office (RO/IB), which accepts international applications in any language. Can I nevertheless file the international application with RO/US on the presumption that it will, in any case, transmit the application to RO/IB under PCT Rule 19.4, or should I file directly with RO/IB?

A: Where an international application is filed with a national (or regional) Office that acts as a PCT receiving Office but the application is not in a language accepted under Rule 12.1(a) by that Office, the safeguard procedure under PCT Rule 19.4 applies. Under this procedure the national Office transmits the international application to RO/IB unless prescriptions concerning national security prevent the international application from being so transmitted. Filing with RO/IB gives applicants more flexibility as it accepts international applications filed in any language (noting that in some cases a translation may have to be furnished for the purposes of international search, depending on the competent International Searching Authority (ISA) and the language(s) accepted by the ISA concerned) and nationals and residents of any PCT Contracting State may file an international application with it. If the international application is filed with a national Office and is then transmitted to RO/IB under PCT Rule 19.4, the application is considered to have been received by the national Office concerned on behalf of RO/IB and the date of receipt of the international application by the national Office is considered to be the date of receipt for the purposes of the international filing date (PCT Rule 19.4(b)). The same procedure applies where an international application is filed with a PCT receiving Office which is not competent on account of the nationality and residence of the applicant(s) under Rule 19.1 or 19.2, or in cases where the national Office and the IB agree, for any reason other than those specified above, and with the authorization of the applicant, that the procedure under Rule 19.4 should apply.

If you file your international application with a national receiving Office, and that Office transmits the application to RO/IB under PCT Rule 19.4, you may have to pay the equivalent of two transmittal fees – one to RO/IB, and also the national receiving Office may require the applicant to pay a fee equal to the transmittal fee charged by that Office under PCT Rule 14 (see PCT Rule 19.4(b)). At the time of writing, the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) charges this fee. If the applicant has already paid the international filing fee and international search fee to the national Office, those fees will be refunded to the applicant, who will then have to pay them, together with the (second) transmittal fee, to RO/IB. Note that, for the calculation of

the time limit for payment of fees, the date of receipt of the international application will be considered to be the date on which the international application was actually received at RO/IB and not the date on which it was received by the national Office. If you file with a national receiving Office, it will be in a position, where applicable, to check the application for compliance with national security prescriptions before transmitting it to RO/IB (see below for information in this respect if the international application is filed directly with RO/IB).

If you know that the national receiving Office cannot accept your international application (for example, for language reasons), it is recommended that you file it directly with RO/IB rather than relying on it being processed under PCT Rule 19.4. If you file directly, you will only pay one transmittal fee. Also, by filing directly, time will be saved in the processing of the international application: there are fewer administrative steps involved, for example, the issuing of a notification to the applicant informing him/her that the application is being transmitted to RO/IB under PCT Rule 19.4 (Form PCT/RO/151), the refunding of fees paid to the national Office, and although the national receiving Office should transmit the international application to RO/IB promptly, there is a risk that there may be a delay in such transmittal. However, it is the applicant's responsibility to comply with any national security provisions before filing an international application with RO/IB, since RO/IB will not check for such compliance. Before filing the international application, you should therefore check with the national Office(s) that is (are) competent on account of the nationality and residence of the applicant.

In addition, please note the following about filing with RO/IB in general:

- Although RO/IB does not require the applicant to be represented by an agent, if any agent is appointed, he or she must be a person who has the right to practice before the national Office of, or acting for, a Contracting State of which the applicant (or, if there are two or more applicants, any of the applicants) is a resident or national. (You would meet these requirements since, presumably, you have the right to practice before the Office of the country of residence of the applicant, the USPTO.)
- The International Searching Authority(ies) and International Preliminary Examining Authority(ies) which would be competent for searching/examining the international application are those which would have been competent if the international application had been filed with any other receiving Office of, or acting for, the PCT Contracting State of which the applicant is (or applicants are) a resident or national. In your case, the applicant is a resident of US and a national of Mexico; the competent ISAs and IPEAs for the USPTO are: the USPTO, the European Patent Office (subject to certain restrictions) or the Korean Intellectual Property Office. Those competent for the Mexican Institute of Industrial Property are: the European Patent Office, the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office, the Swedish Patent and Registration Office or the USPTO. The only one of the aforementioned ISAs and IPEAs which will search and examine applications in Spanish is the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office. If you want to choose another ISA and/or IPEA, you would have to translate the international application into another language accepted by your chosen Authority. Information on the competence of the various ISAs and IPEAs and languages accepted by those authorities can be found in Annexes C, D and E of the *PCT Applicant's Guide* (www.wipo.int/pct/guide/en/).

Note that, being a national of Mexico, the applicant would also be entitled to file an international application in Spanish with the Mexican Institute of Industrial Property, however, you would not be entitled to act as agent before that Office (it requires that the agent be resident in or a national of Mexico), but rather, you would be considered as an address for correspondence (for further details on this kind of situation, see the "Practical Advice" published in *PCT Newsletter*

No. 06/2006 entitled: “Consequence of the agent not being entitled to practice before the Office of the country of residence and/or nationality of the applicant”).

A 75% reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 2 and 12. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 75% reduction are applicable, the 75% reduction is calculated **after** the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.

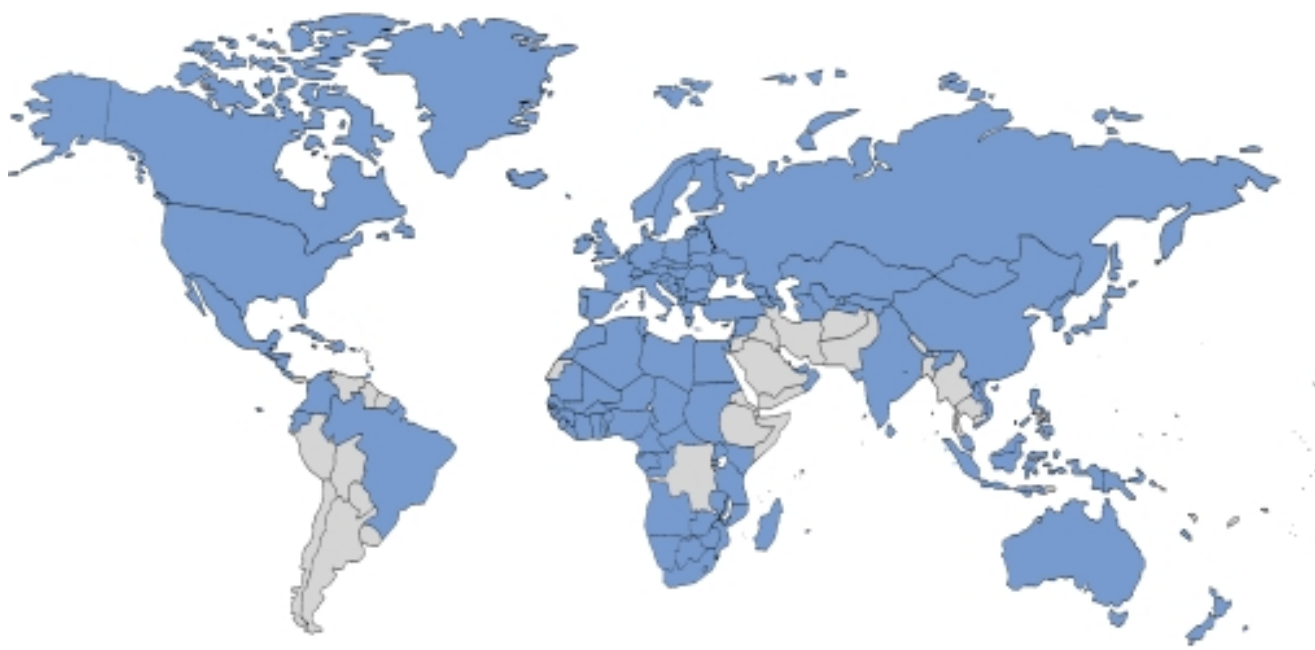

PCT Filings in 2007

The number of applications filed under the PCT in 2007 reached approximately 156,100, representing an increase of 4.7% over 2006. These and the following figures are estimates as the International Bureau continues to receive, throughout the first half of 2008, PCT applications which were filed with national and regional Offices in 2007.

Applicants from the United States of America filed the largest number of applications (52,280, which represents 33.5% of all applications), followed by Japan (17.8%), Germany (11.6%), the Republic of Korea (4.5%) and France (4.1%). Applicants from the member States of the European Patent Convention, when grouped together, filed 34% of all international applications.

There was continued high growth in filings from north east Asia, in particular from the Republic of Korea (18.8% increase) and China (38.1% increase), and Japan again held second position with 27,731 international applications.

Applicants are increasingly submitting their international applications electronically – filings in electronic form made up about 67.4% of all filings in 2007 (compared to 57.4% in 2006), 52.6% being filed fully electronically and 14.8% being filed using the PCT-EASY functionality of the PCT-SAFE software. Only 32.6% of applications filed in 2007 were filed entirely on paper (compared to 42.6% in 2006).

The Japanese company Matsushita became the top user of the PCT system in 2007 (Philips had been the top user since 2001). The top 10 applicants, together with the number of international applications published in their name, were as follows:

The main fields of technology under which PCT applications published in 2007 fell related to telecommunications (10.5% of all applications), information technology (10.1%) and pharmaceuticals (9.3%). The fastest growing areas of technology were nuclear engineering (24.5% increase over 2006) and telecommunications (15.5% increase).

PCT applicants and agents should note that it is the IB alone which publishes all PCT applications promptly after the expiration of 18 months from the priority date (see PCT Article 21(2)(a)); there is no separate fee for such international publication, and the legal effects of international publication are set out in PCT Article 29.

Practical Advice

Right to practice before an International Searching Authority and International Preliminary Examining Authority (where the agent is appointed for the whole of the international phase)

Q: I read in the “Practical Advice” in the February 2008 issue of the PCT Newsletter about a situation where a US agent was going to file, on behalf of an applicant who is a resident of the United States of America and a national of Mexico, an international application with the RO/IB. As a result of the applicant’s Mexican nationality, it was possible to choose the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office as International Searching Authority (ISA) and International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA) (which has been specified as a competent ISA/IPEA by the Mexican Institute of Industrial Property in its capacity as receiving Office). Would the US agent have the right to practice before the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office in its capacity as ISA and IPEA?

A: If the US agent is being appointed for the whole of the international phase, he is also entitled to represent the applicant before the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office as ISA and IPEA (see PCT Rules 90.1(a) and 83.1 bis(a) and (b)).

In principle, the question of who is entitled to represent the applicant(s) for a specific international application during the whole of the international phase is linked to the receiving Office with which the application was filed, and not to the Office which acts as ISA and/or IPEA. Each receiving Office determines who may practice before that Office. According to PCT Rule 90.1(a), a person having the right to practice before the national (or regional) Office with which the international application is filed may be appointed by the applicant as agent to represent him/her before the receiving Office (RO), the International Bureau (IB), the ISA and the IPEA.

As far as international applications filed with the IB as receiving Office (RO/IB) are concerned, any person who has the right to practice before the national (or regional) Office of, or acting for, a Contracting State of which the applicant is a resident or national may be appointed as agent in respect of the international application before RO/IB, the IB in any other capacity, and before the competent ISA and IPEA (see PCT Rule 83.1 bis(b)).

Thus, in the case referred to in last month’s “Practical Advice” where the international application was to be filed with RO/IB, the applicant would have been able to appoint as agent any person who has the right to practice before the Mexican Institute of Industrial Property or the United States Patent and Trademark Office as receiving Office, and that person would automatically be entitled to act before the IB, the ISA and/or IPEA, whichever Authority is chosen.

Notwithstanding, it is possible to appoint a second agent to represent the applicant specifically before the ISA and/or IPEA, although in such a case, the right to practice would no longer be determined by the receiving Office, but rather, would be determined by the rules applicable in the national or regional Office acting as ISA or IPEA (see PCT Rule 90.1(b) and (c)). For information on the right to practice before national Offices, see the relevant National Chapter Summary of the *PCT Applicant’s Guide* (www.wipo.int/pct/guide/en/index.html). In case of uncertainty, the Authority in question should be contacted directly.

A 75% reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 2 and 12. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 75% reduction are applicable, the 75% reduction is calculated **after** the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) PCT NEWSLETTER

Amendments to the Schedule of Fees

An Extraordinary Session of the Assembly of the PCT Union was held in Geneva on 31 March 2008 to discuss proposed amendments of the Schedule of Fees annexed to the PCT Regulations. The Assembly approved the amendments, which will enter into force on 1 July 2008, and will apply to any international application which is received by the receiving Office on or after 1 July 2008. The amendments are as follows:

Reduction in the international filing fee

The international filing fee will be reduced by 5%, from 1,400 to 1,330 Swiss francs. Equivalent amounts in other currencies will be announced once, following consultation with interested Offices, they have been established. Note that the amount payable for each sheet of the international application in excess of 30 sheets will not change.

Increase in the fee reduction accorded to applicants from certain States

The reduction in the international filing fee and the handling fee accorded to applicants who meet the criteria indicated in Item 4(a)¹ or (b)² of the Schedule of Fees has been increased from 75% to 90%.

Extension of the scope of the fee reduction accorded to applicants from certain States

An applicant who is a natural person and who is a national of and resides in one of the following nine States will also be entitled to the above-mentioned reduction in the international filing fee and the handling fee:

Antigua and Barbuda
Bahrain
Barbados
Libyan Arab Jamahiriya
Oman
Seychelles
Singapore

¹ If the international application is filed by an applicant who is a natural person and who is a national of and resides in a State whose per capita national income is below 3,000 US dollars (according to the average per capita national income figures used by the United Nations for determining its scale of assessments for the contributions payable for the years 1995, 1996 and 1997).

² If the international application is filed by an applicant, whether a natural person or not, who is a national of and resides in a State that is classed as a least developed country by the United Nations.

Trinidad and Tobago

United Arab Emirates

The PCT Assembly will consider a study on the eligibility criteria for the fee reductions in item 4 at its next session, and discuss further possible changes.

New PCT Contracting State

Sao Tome and Principe (country code: ST)

On 3 April 2008, Sao Tome and Principe deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT, and on 3 July 2008, will become bound by the PCT. Consequently, any international application filed on or after 3 July 2008 will automatically include the designation of Sao Tome and Principe.

Also, because Sao Tome and Principe will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, it will automatically be elected in any demand filed in respect of an international application filed on or after 3 July 2008. Furthermore, nationals and residents of Sao Tome and Principe will be entitled, as from 3 July 2008, to file international applications under the PCT.

Practical Advice

Appointing agents before the International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authority

Q: The firm of European patent attorneys with which I work erroneously filed an international application, for which the only applicant was neither a resident nor a national of a member State of the European Patent Convention, with the European Patent Office (EPO) as receiving Office. The application was subsequently transmitted by the EPO to the International Bureau as receiving Office (RO/IB) under PCT Rule 19.4(a)(i). Is it possible for my firm to act as agent for the applicant before RO/IB, or will the applicant have to appoint an agent from his country of nationality or residence? If we cannot act as agent before RO/IB, can we be appointed as agent before the EPO in its capacity as International Searching Authority (ISA) and International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA), specifically for the purposes of international search and preliminary examination? (The EPO is a competent ISA and IPEA for this application.)

A: It is recalled that, under PCT Rule 83.1 *bis*(a), in order to be able to represent the applicant before RO/IB, the agent must have the right to practice before the national (or regional) Office of, or acting for, a Contracting State of which the applicant is a resident or national. It is unlikely that your firm of patent attorneys would be entitled to represent the applicant unless there is somebody who is a patent attorney or patent agent registered before the Office concerned (see under the relevant receiving Office in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Receiving Offices, Annex C) (www.wipo.int/pct/guide/en/index.html), and so if the applicant is going to appoint an agent, it must be one who fulfils that requirement.

You do, however, have the option of being appointed, under PCT Rule 90.1(b) and (c), as agent specifically for the purposes of search and examination before an ISA and IPEA. Any agent may be so appointed, irrespective of the receiving Office with which the application was filed and irrespective of any agent who is entitled to act for the application concerned under PCT Rule 90.1(a) for the entire international phase, provided that he/she has the right to practice before the national Office or intergovernmental organization which acts as ISA/IPEA (for information on who has the right to practice before a national or regional Office, see the relevant National Chapter (Summary) of the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, or contact the Office concerned). In your case, since you have the right to practice before the EPO in its capacity as ISA and IPEA, the applicant could appoint you as agent specifically before the EPO.

In practice, it is not absolutely necessary to appoint an agent specifically for the purposes of international search since there is no dialogue with the ISA during the search procedure and an agent would not normally file any document directly with the ISA (amendments under PCT Article 19 are filed with the IB by the applicant or the agent entitled to act before the receiving Office). Such an agent would simply receive the international search report and the written opinion of the ISA. During the international preliminary examination procedure, however, the agent may need to respond to the written opinion of the IPEA or have a dialogue with the examiner. In the case where an additional person is appointed specifically for the procedure before the IPEA, all notifications issued by the IPEA will be addressed only to that additional person, and not to any agent appointed in general for the purposes of the international phase. Note, however, that such an agent would only be able to take action concerning the international preliminary examination procedure, and would not be entitled, for example, to withdraw the international application.

In order for you to be appointed in this way, a separate power of attorney would normally have to be submitted directly to the ISA and/or IPEA, as the case may be (see PCT Rule 90.4(b)). Note, however, that a power of attorney may not be required where the ISA/IPEA has waived the requirement to furnish a power of attorney (PCT Rule 90.4(d))—see the table entitled “Waivers: Powers of Attorney” at:

Instead of submitting a power of attorney to appoint an agent before the IPEA, the appointment can also be made simply by way of the applicant signing the demand for international preliminary examination (Form PCT/IPEA/401) in which the agent is named in Box No. III as “agent specifically for the procedure before the IPEA”.

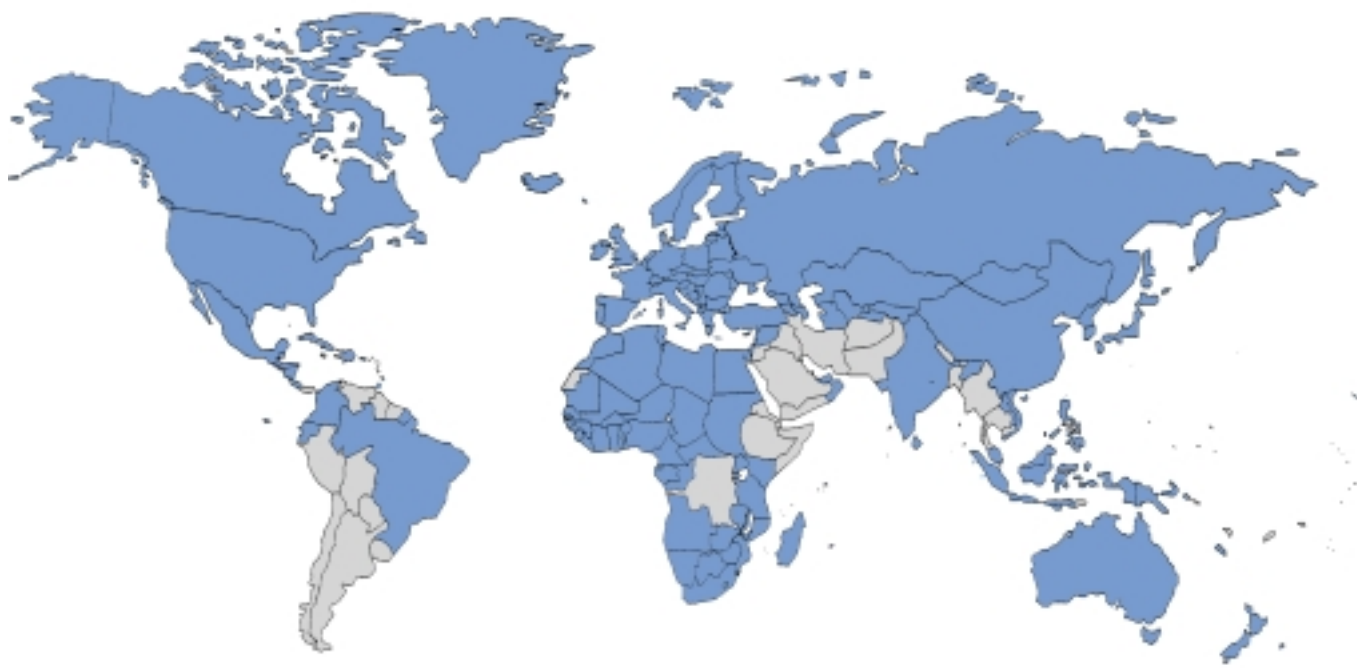

An updated consolidated version of the PCT Regulations, as in force from 1 July 2008, will be available on the PCT Resources page of PATENTSCOPE® once the amendments have entered into force. In view of the relatively limited number of changes that have been made to the Regulations, however, the paper version of the *Patent Cooperation Treaty and Regulations* (WIPO Publication No. 274) will not be reprinted on this occasion. Instead, a booklet containing the amended rules will be published on the PCT Resources page of PATENTSCOPE® – an announcement will be made as soon as this becomes available. It will be of the size that it can be inserted into the paper version of the *Patent Cooperation Treaty and Regulations*.

Note that further information about the changes subsequent to the entry into force of new PCT Rules 4.12 and 12*bis* (relating to the possibility, as from 1 July 2008, for the applicant to request the International Searching Authority (ISA) to take into account, in carrying out the international search, not only, as at present, the results of an earlier search carried out by that Authority, but also the results of an earlier search carried out by another ISA or any other national Office) will be given in the *PCT Newsletter* shortly.

Modified PCT Forms

Following consultations with the relevant PCT Offices and Authorities, a number of PCT forms for use by receiving Offices, International Searching Authorities (ISAs), International Preliminary Examining Authorities and the International Bureau have been amended with effect from 1 July 2008. The request form (PCT/RO/101) has been amended with effect from 1 July 2008 to take into account, in particular:

- the amendments to the Schedule of Fees;
- the new possibility for the applicant to request the ISA, when carrying out the international search, to take into consideration the results of an earlier search carried out either by that Authority, by another ISA or by any national Office; and
- the new possibility of including an e-mail address for the applicant or agent, and an authorization to be sent advance copies of notifications in respect of the international application by e-mail (in Boxes Nos. II and III) (for further information, see the “Practical advice” in this issue).

The demand form (PCT/IPEA/401) has also been amended with effect from 1 July 2008 to take into account the new possibility of including an e-mail address for the applicant or agent, and an authorization to be sent advance copies of notifications in respect of the international application by e-mail (for further information on the furnishing by the applicant of an e-mail address, see the “Practical advice” in this issue).

Filing and Processing of International Applications in Electronic Form

Attaching pre-conversion files to international applications filed electronically

Many international applications which are filed in electronic form are initially prepared in a particular electronic document format (for example, MS-Word) and are subsequently converted, for the purposes of filing, into another electronic document format (for example, PDF or XML). Since it is known that, in the process of converting from one document format to another, the international application data may accidentally be modified or altered, amended Sections 706 and 710 of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT (applicable as of 1 July 2008) expressly provide for the submission of a copy of the international application in the “pre-conversion” format at the time of filing the international application. Should data have been accidentally modified or altered in the conversion process, the applicant has the opportunity to correct the international application as filed so as to bring it into conformity with the copy of the international application in the pre-conversion format.

Note however that, in order for applicants to take advantage of this option, the receiving Office must permit the submission generally of the international application in “pre-conversion” format and the specific pre-conversion format used by the applicant must also be accepted by the receiving Office. To the extent that the receiving Office of choice does accept the submission of the international application in “pre-conversion” format, applicants are strongly encouraged to make use of this possibility. In the case of a conversion-related issue, applicants would then have up to 30 months from the priority date to correct the international application with the receiving Office.

PCT Meetings

Meeting of International Authorities

The 15th session of the Meeting of International Authorities under the PCT was held in Vienna at the Austrian Patent Office from 7 to 9 April 2008. The report and working documents can be found on the WIPO website at:

The Meeting noted reports on the quality frameworks of all the Authorities. These will shortly be made available, together with those submitted last year, on the PATENTSCOPE® website at:

Following a presentation by one Authority, discussions focused on how best to allow feedback from operational reviews of individual cases to be used to improve general guidance for all examiners. The Spanish Patent and Trademark Office announced the launch of a “Microsite on Quality” at: www.oepm-calidad.es. The Meeting reiterated the importance of sharing of information on quality and agreed on a timetable for review of the quality framework set out in Chapter 21 of the PCT International Search and Preliminary Examination Guidelines.

The Meeting welcomed a preliminary working paper proposed by the International Bureau (IB) entitled “Enhancing the Value of International Search and Preliminary Examination under the PCT” (PCT/MIA/15/2) as important, timely and useful. It agreed that action was needed in the context of backlogs growing in both number and application pendency time. Some of the necessary work was already under way, for example, in relation to the quality framework. Other actions would require consideration by individual Offices, the International Authorities collectively, the Contracting States and users of the system. The same document will be considered by the PCT Working Group at its first session, to be held in Geneva from 26 to 30 May 2008 (see “PCT Working Group”, below, and document PCT/WG/1/3).

Several Authorities (the Austrian Patent Office, the Federal Service for Intellectual Property, Patents and Trademarks (Russian Federation) and the Nordic Patent Institute) reported that they expected to be ready to offer a supplementary international search service from 1 January 2009; the Swedish Patent and Registration Office reported that it may possibly be ready to do so by that date. Others (the European Patent Office and the National Board of Patents and Registration of Finland) indicated that it was likely that they would be able to offer such a service in due course from 1 January 2010. Others indicated a general support for the principle but were not in a position to report any provisional plans for offering such a service; and some Authorities have no plans to offer this service.

The Japan Patent Office, on behalf of the Trilateral Offices (the European Patent Office, the Japan Patent Office and the United States Patent and Trademark Office) gave an overview of the so-called “Common Application Format” which has recently been agreed upon by the Trilateral Offices (see: www.trilateral.net/news/20071130/index.php) and introduced proposals for corresponding modifications to the Administrative Instructions under the PCT.

The Meeting discussed a proposal relating to the possibility of permitting claims fees under the PCT, similar to those which have been introduced in a number of national systems, and proposals to limit the number of claims per category to be searched.

The Meeting recognized that there was still an unacceptably large number of international applications being published without classification. Some improvements were expected shortly, following efforts to reduce backlogs at certain receiving Offices. The Meeting also requested the IB to investigate the possibility of providing access to the record copy to assist International Searching Authorities (ISAs) in providing classification of international applications for which delivery of the search copy had been delayed.

The Korean Journal of Traditional Knowledge was added to the list of non-patent literature forming part of the PCT minimum documentation. It was also decided to reinvigorate work on a comprehensive review of the minimum documentation.

The Meeting discussed a proposal to permit ISAs to send advance copies of international search reports by e-mail but concluded that work should concentrate on offering such information using a secure file inspection service.

The Meeting also discussed details of implementation of the new rules relating to use of searches by Offices other than the one acting as ISA, draft criteria which might be considered for adoption by the PCT Assembly in relation to the addition of any further PCT languages of publication, and proposals for encouraging the filing of sequence listings in searchable ST.25 text file format.

PCT Working Group

In September 2007, the PCT Assembly decided that the work of the Committee on Reform of the PCT and the Working Group on Reform of the PCT had been completed and that the mandate of both bodies had come to an end (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 10/2007). Recognizing the need for a body to perform preparatory work for any future matters requiring submission to the Assembly, it approved the convening of a new Working Group. The first session of the PCT Working Group will be held in Geneva from 26 to 30 May 2008. Practical Advice

The transmittal of notifications to applicants by e-mail

Q: I am going to file a number of international applications on behalf of several applicants in the next few months. Later in the year, I will have to spend a few months away on business, and am worried about whether being away from my office will hinder my ability to properly follow-up the progress of the applications concerned. Is there any way that I can request that correspondence relating to the international application be sent to my e-mail address, and that I can deal with any follow-up matters by e-mail?

A: Until now, it has not been possible for the International Bureau (IB) to use e-mail as a form of communication in respect of specific international applications.

However, **as of 1 July 2008**, the request form (PCT/RO/101) will contain a new field in Boxes Nos. II and IV that will allow applicants or agents to include an e-mail address with their international applications. Next to that field will be a check-box, which, if marked, will authorize any PCT Authority (the receiving Office (RO), the IB, the International Searching Authority (ISA) and the International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA)) to send by e-mail, if they so wish, advance copies of notifications in respect of the international application to the applicant or agent. This authorization will also be added to the request form which is completed when using the PCT-SAFE software. Upon receipt of such an authorization, the IB would be in a position to send you such advance copies of any notifications or invitations by e-mail. Whether other PCT Authorities will also do so will depend on the PCT Authority concerned. The IB will notify PCT users which Authorities have announced their willingness to participate in this form of advance communication, to the extent that it is informed of this.

Note that if the checkbox referred to above is not marked, or the applicant or agent’s express authorization is not given in some other way, for example, in a separate letter, the e-mail address can only be used for communications for which telephones or fax would otherwise have been used (for example, rapid informal communications with applicants (see PCT Rule 4.4(c), third sentence).

Such advance e-mail communications will not replace paper notifications sent by mail as usual, which will remain the legal copy of the notifications. The e-mail communication will be an additional service to the applicant, which will, in effect, serve as an advance warning of any possible action to be taken, and will help to reduce the effects of delays in the dispatching and delivery of the paper notification to the recipient. It may also give the applicant extra time in view of the fact that the time limit given for responding to an invitation is calculated from the date of mailing of the paper version of the communication.

The IB is planning to send such advance communications only to a single e-mail address (per international application). This means that, where the e-mail authorization is given in respect of both an applicant and an agent, the IB will send e-mail communications only to the appointed agent (or common representative where no agent has been appointed). The recipient of the e-mail will be responsible for forwarding the contents of that e-mail to any other person who may need to receive it.

It is very important to note that, for the moment, it will not be possible for you, as agent (or the applicant) to reply by e-mail to the IB, and any such e-mail received by the IB would not be accepted by it. For the time being, you will be obliged to continue to reply by mail, or where accepted by the Authority concerned, by fax. Information on the forms of telecommunication, if any, by which PCT Offices and Authorities are prepared to receive documents, is published in the *PCT Applicants Guide*, Annex B (General Information) at:

www.wipo.int/pct/guide/en/index.html

Please also note that, for technical reasons, the IB will begin by only sending certain forms by advance e-mail. Some of the forms which you can expect to receive in this way initially are: Forms PCT/IB/301, PCT/IB/306, PCT/IB/307 and PCT/IB/345. Progressively, additional forms will be added towards the end of the year, for example, Forms PCT/IB/304, PCT/IB/308 and PCT/IB/311.

For any international applications filed before 1 July 2008, it will be possible, **on or after 1 July 2008 only**, to submit to the IB an e-mail address for that application, together with an express authorization for the RO, the ISA, the IB and IPEA to use the e-mail address to send advance copies of notifications in respect of the international application. The addition of the e-mail address can be requested under PCT Rule 92*bis* (recording of changes in certain indications in the request or the demand). If the e-mail address is to be registered for multiple cases, you may wish to send a single letter to the IB listing each international application concerned, noting that a separate letter should be written for each appointed agent (unless a group of agents has been appointed together). Similarly, if you wish later to change the e-mail address already given in the request form, it will be possible to do this by requesting the IB to record a change under PCT Rule 92*bis*. For further information on requesting the recording of a change under PCT Rule 92*bis*, see the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraphs 427 to 431 (www.wipo.int/pct/guide/en/gdvol1/pdf/gdvol1.pdf), and the "Practical Advice" in *PCT Newsletter* Nos. 05/2002, 08/2002, and 07/2005 (www.wipo.int/pct/en/newslett/year.jsp).

This new advance notification service is, in effect, a precursor to a new system that WIPO is in the process of developing whereby PCT applicants will be able to securely log in to a private file inspection system, which will allow them to inspect the file of their international application and obtain correspondence in this way, prompted by an e-mail notifying them that such correspondence has been issued. Further information on this private file inspection system will be given later, when it is at a more advanced stage of its development.

Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 3(a), (b), (c) and (d) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 202(A). A 75%¹ reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 3 and 13. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 75%¹ reduction are applicable, the 75%¹ reduction is calculated **after** the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.

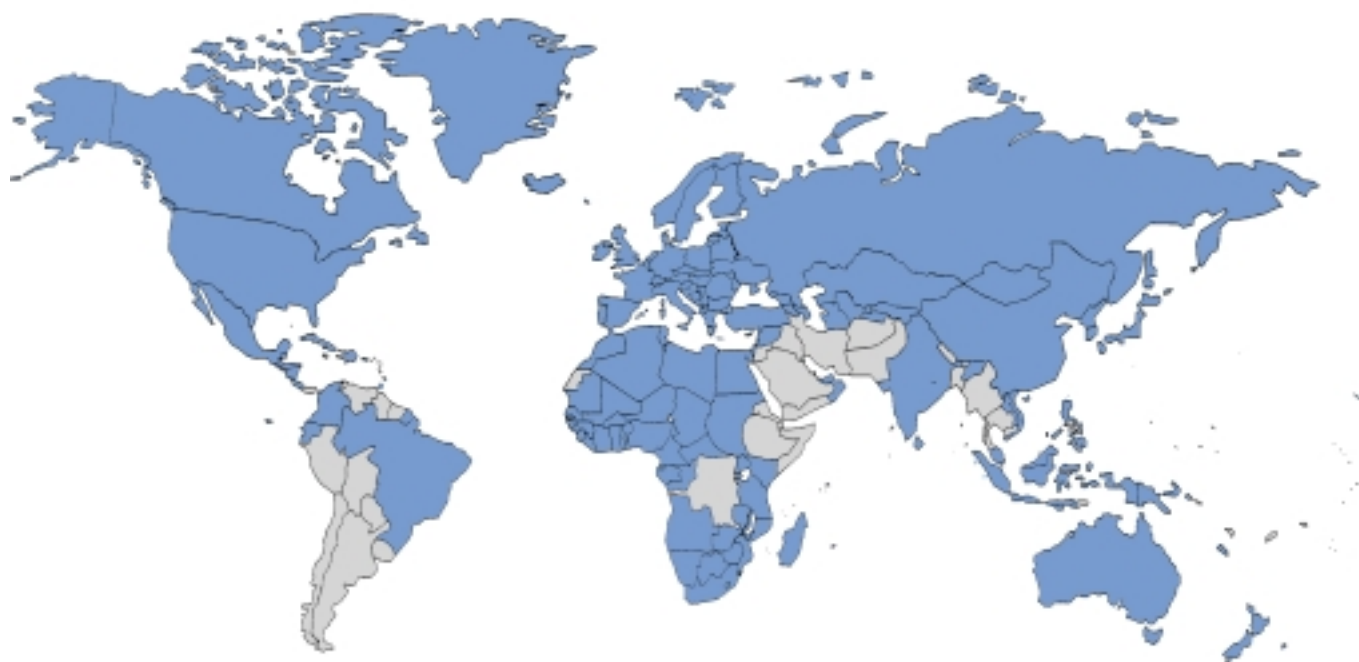

PCT NEWSLETTER

Francis Gurry Nominated as next WIPO Director General

Francis Gurry, current WIPO Deputy Director General and a national of Australia, was nominated at a meeting of the WIPO Coordination Committee on 13 May 2008, to become the next Director General of WIPO. The Director General-elect will assume his duties on 1 October 2008, following appointment by the WIPO General Assembly at its next meeting scheduled from 22 to 30 September 2008.

Mr. Gurry was selected from a list which originally included 15 candidates. He will become the fourth Director General of WIPO, following Georg Bodenhausen of the Netherlands (1970-1973) Arpad Bogsch of the United States (1973-1997) and Kamil Idris of Sudan (1997-2008).

Mr. Gurry has been responsible for the Patent Cooperation Treaty since 2002, as well as other areas of intellectual property, including patent law and policy and the International Patent Classification (IPC). Mr. Gurry's full curriculum vitae is available at:

PCT Working Group

The first session of the PCT Working Group was held in Geneva from 26 to 30 May 2008. The background to the creation of this body was explained in *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008.

The Working Group approved proposed amendments of the PCT Regulations with a view to their submission to the PCT Assembly for consideration at its next session, in September/October 2008, as follows:

- (a) proposed amendments of PCT Rules 45*bis* (as in force from January 1, 2009), 90 and 90*bis* concerning refund of the supplementary search handling fee and the supplementary search fee, the right of agents to practice before any International Authority specified to carry out a supplementary international search, and the effects of a withdrawal of a request for supplementary international search, respectively (see document PCT/WG/1/7); in this context, it was observed that at least three International Authorities were expected to offer supplementary international searches as from 1 January 2009 and that some others hoped to do so by 2010;
- (b) proposed amendments of PCT Rule 29.4 concerning timing and procedure where a receiving Office finds, after having accorded an international filing date, that the requirements for according an international filing date had not been met (document PCT/WG/1/11; see also revised proposed amendments in the report (document PCT/WG/1/16) (which will be available shortly));

(c) proposed amendments of PCT Rules 46.5 and 66.8 so as to require that, where applicants submit amendments to the claims (whether under Article 19 or 34), a complete new set of claims is to be submitted (document PCT/WG/1/13).

Various proposals for change to the physical requirements of international applications (document PCT/WG/1/5) were referred to technical task forces to ensure that they were appropriate for ensuring accurate optical character recognition of text and to establish the technical requirements for filing and processing color drawings.

While noting some difficulties which had been faced in certain cases, the Working Group considered that further experience was required with regard to the procedure of incorporation by reference of missing elements and parts of the international application before making any changes to the Rules in this area (document PCT/WG/1/9). However, a clarification to the PCT Receiving Office Guidelines was recommended to assist proper processing by International Searching Authorities (ISAs). Notably, where a complete correct set of claims was incorporated by reference, it should be placed before an accidentally filed incorrect set of claims so that the correct set of claims can more easily be recognized and searched as the “main” invention.

There was broad support for further consideration of the proposal by the European Patent Office for the introduction of claims fees within the PCT, in the same way as in many national and regional systems (document PCT/WG/1/14), but little support for the proposal to permit ISAs to limit international searches to one independent claim per category.

There was no agreement in the Working Group to proceed with a proposal for amendment of Rule 91 to allow the contents of the request to be taken into account in deciding whether a mistake in the description, claims and drawings was obvious (document PCT/WG/1/10).

The Working Group generally supported various proposed modifications of the PCT Administrative Instructions, subject to further consultation on the details, as follows:

(a) proposals to abolish “mixed mode” sequence listing applications, to charge no page fees for sequence listings which are included in the appropriate ST.25 text format in the international application filed in electronic form, but to charge full page fees for those filed on paper or in an image format (including PDF), and to make available, on the publication date, copies of any sequence listings not included in the international application as filed, but which are furnished in the ST.25 text format, only for the purpose of international search (document PCT/WG/1/4);

(b) proposals to supplement the recommended headings to be used in the description and claims of international applications by alternatives aimed at clear compatibility with the “Common Application Format” which has been established by the Trilateral Offices (document PCT/WG/1/15).

The Working Group also discussed a paper (document PCT/WG/1/3) originally drafted for the Meeting of International Authorities under the PCT (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008) entitled “Enhancing the Value of International Search and Preliminary Examination under the PCT”. In response to this paper and to a proposal by Israel (document PCT/WG/1/2) in relation to the problems for applicants when the international search report is established very late, the Working Group agreed that the quality and timeliness of international search reports were key to the value of the PCT system and that action was required by receiving Offices, International Authorities and the International Bureau (IB) alike to ensure that the system met applicants’ needs. The IB outlined a pilot system (document PCT/WG/1/8) aimed at reducing the delays in transmission of documents from the receiving Office to the ISA and at providing additional

information to the latter to assist with the international search. Various other matters were discussed, including the matters of trust in work performed during the international phase (so that it is not repeated unnecessarily in each national phase) and making the international preliminary examination procedure under Chapter II more useful so as to minimize work and costs for applicants and Offices alike.

Following a further proposal by Israel (document PCT/WG/1/2), the IB agreed to resume a study on the possibility of the establishment of a standardized form for national phase entry.

It was agreed that the PCT Receiving Office Guidelines should be modified to better deal with a procedure when, at the time of filing, material was presented such that it was not apparent whether it was supposed to form part of the international application or not (document PCT/WG/1/12).

The Working Group noted a set of draft criteria prepared by the IB for the addition of any further languages of publication to the PCT system (document PCT/WG/1/6), to be submitted for consideration by the PCT Assembly in September/October 2008.

The Working Group further noted the IB's plan to offer a service whereby the receiving Office would be able (with the agreement of the IB and the ISA) to transmit the search copy and other documents necessary for international search to the ISA in electronic form via the IB, using the receiving Office's existing PCT Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) communication link to the IB, and to offer ISAs access to the full text of international applications captured using optical character recognition (OCR).

Notice to Users of the PCT-SAFE Software, the EPO's *epoline*® Online Filing Software and the JPO-PAS Electronic Filing Software

The following information concerns applicants who will be filing international applications in electronic form on or after 1 July 2008 via the PCT-SAFE software with certain receiving Offices¹ (both fully electronic and PCT-EASY mode filings), the European Patent Office's *epoline*® Online Filing software, or the Japan Patent Office's JPO-PAS electronic filing software. Applicants using any other electronic filing software are advised to enquire with their respective receiving Offices. Note, however, that applicants filing with the United States Patent and Trademark Office as receiving Office via the EFS-Web filing system will not be affected by this information.

A PCT-SAFE software update will be released by early July 2008, which will enable the preparation of request forms in compliance with the July 2008 rule changes for filing international applications, both in fully electronic and in PCT-EASY mode, with the International Bureau as receiving Office, as well as with any other receiving Office which is not listed in the footnote. However, the updated software will not be available on time for international applications filed with the receiving Offices which are listed in the footnote, as it has not yet

been possible to make the necessary technical modifications to the respective receiving Office servers.

Note that, in view of the time needed to incorporate into other filing software packages the necessary updates resulting from those rule changes, updates of certain software, for example, the *epoline*® Online Filing software and the JPO-PAS electronic filing software, may also not be available as of 1 July 2008, but will be available as soon as the changes have been incorporated into the respective software.

The consequence of this delay is that users of the above-mentioned client software packages will not easily be able to take advantage of the following new features of the July 2008 rule changes until such time as the updated software becomes available:

- the possibility for applicants to request the International Searching Authority (ISA), when carrying out the international search, to take into consideration the results not only of an earlier search it has carried out, but also the earlier search carried out by another ISA or a national or regional Office;
- the possibility for applicants to authorize the various PCT Offices and Authorities, if the Office or Authority concerned so wishes, to send advance copies of notifications using the e-mail address provided by the applicant for this purpose (for further information, see the “Practical advice” in *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008); or
- the possibility, in the case of international applications filed in fully electronic form, of submitting the international application in the pre-conversion format together with the corresponding statement on the request form, following the amendment of Section 706 of the PCT Administrative Instructions (for further information, see *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008, page 2).

E-mail Notifications

Reminder

It is recalled that, as from 1 July 2008, it will be possible for the International Bureau (IB) to transmit certain PCT forms to either the applicant or agent (hereinafter: “the applicant”) by e-mail. The request form (PCT/RO/101), as modified with effect from 1 July 2008, will contain a new field in Boxes Nos. II and IV that will allow applicants to include one e-mail address with their international applications. Next to that field will be a check-box, which, if marked, will authorize any PCT Authority (the receiving Office (RO), the IB, the International Searching Authority (ISA) and the International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA)) to send by e-mail, if they so wish, advance copies of notifications in respect of the international application to the e-mail address indicated. The IB and the IB as RO plan to make use of this facility, but whether any other PCT Authorities will do so will depend on the PCT Authority concerned.

It is recalled that:

- Such advance e-mails will not replace paper notifications sent by mail as usual, which will remain the legal copy of the notifications, but rather, will be an additional service to the applicant;
- For the moment, it will not be possible for applicants to reply to the IB by e-mail;
- For technical reasons, the IB will begin by only sending certain forms by e-mail, adding other forms later in the year.

Full-text search in Japanese

As from 3 July 2008, the PATENTSCOPE® search service will support keyword searches in the Japanese language. The searchable Japanese text data will include the descriptions and claims of published international applications electronically filed in Japanese and published on or after 3 July 2008, as well as all the titles and the majority of abstracts of international applications published in text since 2004. The Japanese text data will also be available, on a weekly basis, via the FTP data delivery service, for all Offices and companies that have subscribed to this service.

This enhancement improves access to Japanese international applications, which make up 16% of all applications filed in the past four years. Japanese is the second most used language of filing after English, and several of the most frequent users of the PCT system are Japanese companies.

This brings to six the number of languages in which full-text data search is possible; the other languages being: English, French, German, Spanish and Russian.

New interface in Spanish

The web pages available in Spanish include the search interface, search results and all supporting web pages, including on-line help and related pages. This enhancement is a consequence of technical cooperation between WIPO and Spanish-language patent Offices regarding the future integration of additional patent data into the PATENTSCOPE® search service.

New PCT National Phase Information

The PATENTSCOPE® Search Service now includes PCT national phase information for Egypt and Poland, and regional phase information for the European Patent Office, thus bringing the total number of Offices which furnish such information to 33. It is recalled that information on whether an international application has entered the national/regional phase, as well as other information relating to the national/regional phase can, where the designated or elected Office has furnished the relevant information to the IB, be accessed by clicking on the “national phase” tab of the international application concerned. Ukraine becomes a Member

On 16 May 2008, Ukraine (country code: UA), which is already party to the PCT and the Paris Convention, became a Member of the WTO, thus bringing the total number of Members to 152. It is recalled that under PCT Rule 4.10(a), it is possible to claim in an international application the priority of one or more earlier applications filed in, or for, any country party to the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property or in, or for, any Member of the World Trade Organization (WTO) that is not party to that Convention.

Practical Advice

Signature requirements for withdrawals of designations

Q: When I, as agent, filed an international application two months ago, claiming the priority of a national application filed in Japan (JP), I forgot to check the box under Box No. V "Designations" to the effect that JP is not designated for any kind of national protection, which I should have done in order to avoid the ceasing of the effect, under the national law, of the earlier application. I must therefore withdraw the designation of JP within 15 months from the earlier filing date, which leaves me very little time to do this. Bearing in mind that the only applicant for the purposes of the designation of JP is the corporate applicant, I presume that, for the purposes of the signature of the notice of withdrawal, it is not also necessary to obtain the signatures of the applicant/inventors who are only applicants for the designation of the United States of America (US)? Is my presumption correct, according to the PCT? (Note that the request form was not signed by the applicants and, in view of the fact that the receiving Office has made a waiver of the requirement to furnish a power of attorney, a power of attorney has not been furnished.)

A: According to PCT Rule 90*bis*.5(a), any notice of withdrawal, including the withdrawal of a designation, must be signed by the applicant or, if there are two or more applicants, **by all of them**. The notice of withdrawal of the JP designation would therefore require the signature of all applicants, regardless of the fact that the applicant/inventors are only applicants for the US designation, and are not also applicants for the JP designation. Even if the corporate applicant is considered to be the common representative under PCT Rule 90.2(b) (the "deemed common representative"), it cannot sign a notice of withdrawal on behalf of the other applicants.

Note that even though a waiver has been made by the Japan Patent Office in its capacity as receiving Office, a waiver never applies in respect of any notice of withdrawal under PCT Rules 90*bis*.1 to 90*bis*.4 (see PCT Rule 90.4(e)); if a notice of withdrawal is not signed by all applicants, a power of attorney is required, signed by all applicants.

The only exception to the requirement that the applicant/inventors must sign the notice of withdrawal of the designation mentioned above is as follows: according to PCT Rule 90*bis*.5(b), where the applicant/inventors concerned had designated a State whose national law requires that national applications be filed by the inventor (namely, the US), and where the applicant for that designated State who is an inventor could not be found or reached after diligent effort, the notice of withdrawal under PCT Rule 90*bis*.2 need not be signed by that applicant if it is signed by at least one applicant, and

- a statement is furnished explaining, to the satisfaction of the receiving Office or the International Bureau, as the case may be, the lack of signature of the applicant concerned; or
- if the request was signed by at least one applicant and a statement was furnished explaining, to the satisfaction of the receiving Office, the lack of signature of the request.

Even though the requirement to submit a power of attorney may have been waived by the receiving Office, and even though it is acceptable for only one of several applicants to sign the request to satisfy the signature requirement (see PCT Rules 4.15(a) and 26.2*bis*(a)), agents or common representatives should carefully consider whether they should in any case obtain the signatures of all applicants, either by way of signing a power of attorney or by way of signing the request. By obtaining those signatures in advance, any withdrawal, which requires the

signatures of all of the applicants or a power of attorney signed by all of the applicants, could be dealt with by the relevant office/authority immediately, and delays caused by waiting for signatures would not be incurred. Even if those signatures are not actually submitted by the agent/common representative, but are merely kept in the file of the agent/common representative, at least they would be available if they were needed later.

The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 3(a), (b), (c) and (d) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 202(A). A 75%¹ reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 3 and 13. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 75%¹ reduction are applicable, the 75%¹ reduction is calculated **after** the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.

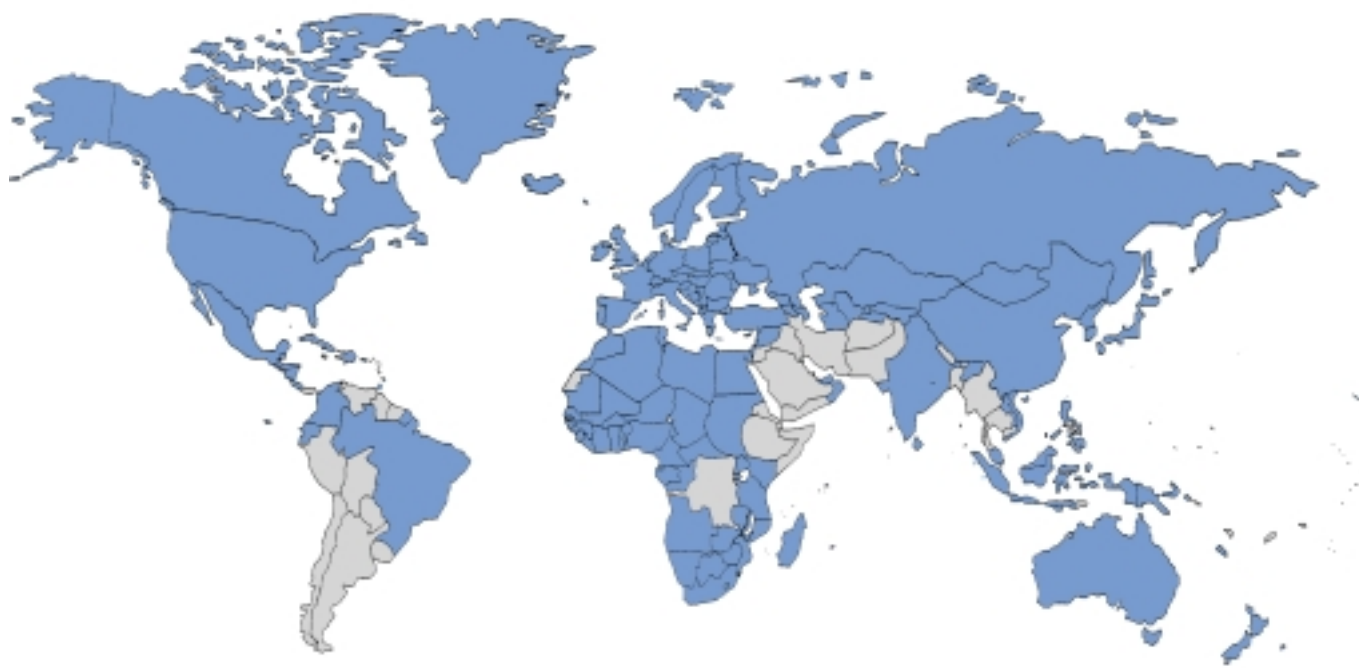

PCT NEWSLETTER

Reminder about the Main Changes to PCT Regulations and Procedure Effective 1 July 2008

It is recalled that a number of changes to the PCT Regulations and procedure entered into effect on 1 July 2008, including:

Amendments to the Schedule of Fees

As well as a 5% reduction in the amount of the international filing fee¹, there has also been an increase from 75% to 90% in the reduction in the international filing fee and the handling fee accorded to applicants who meet the criteria indicated in Item 4(a) or (b) of the Schedule of fees, and the scope of the fee reduction has been extended to applicants from certain additional States (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 04/2008, page 1).

E-mail

Applicants can authorize the various PCT Offices and Authorities, if the Office or Authority concerned so wishes, to send advance copies of notifications using the e-mail address provided by the applicant for this purpose (for further information, see the "Practical advice" in *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008, page 9).

Filing and processing of international applications in electronic form

Following the modifications to Sections 706 and 710 of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT, where international applications are filed in fully electronic form, applicants may, if the receiving Office so permits, include the application documents in a pre-conversion format (together with the international application), accompanied by a statement that the international application as filed in electronic form is a complete and accurate copy of the document in the pre-conversion format (for further information, see *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008, page 2).

Requesting the ISA to take into consideration the results of an earlier search carried out by another Authority

Applicants can request the International Searching Authority (ISA), when carrying out the international search, to take into consideration the results not only of an earlier search it has carried out, but also of an earlier search carried out by another ISA or a national or regional Office (see PCT Rules 4.12, 12*bis*.1 and 41.1).

Requesting restoration of the right of priority

The receiving Office may now extend, for a period of up to two months, the time limit for paying a fee for requesting restoration of the right of priority (see amended PCT Rule 26*bis*.3(d)).

1. Note that, even though there have been consequential changes in the equivalent amounts in most currencies (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008, page 5), due to fluctuations in the applicable exchange rates, the amounts payable in certain currencies, for example in EUR, might not have actually changed.

International applications considered withdrawn

A clarification has been made to PCT Rule 29 that, where the receiving Office (RO) declares the international application withdrawn, international publication of that application can only be prevented if the notification of the said declaration transmitted by the RO reaches the International Bureau before the technical preparations for international publication have been completed (PCT Rule 29.1(v)).

Withdrawal of Notifications of Incompatibility of Certain PCT Articles and Rules with National Laws

Switzerland (PCT Article 22(1), PCT Rule 51bis.1(e), 51bis.2(a)(i), (ii) and (iii) and 51bis.3(a))

Further to its notification of incompatibility of PCT Article 22(1) as modified with effect from 1 April 2002, with its national law (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 02/2002, cover page), the Swiss Federal Institute of Intellectual Property, in its capacity as designated Office, has notified the International Bureau (IB) that it has withdrawn its notification with effect from 1 July 2008. The 30-month time limit under PCT Article 22(1) therefore applies as from 1 July 2008 in respect of international applications for which the 20-month time limit expires on or after that date and in respect of which the acts referred to in PCT Article 22(1) have not yet been performed by the applicant. The table of time limits for entering the national phase has been updated accordingly on the PCT Resources page of PATENTSCOPE® at:

That Office has also notified the IB that it has withdrawn, with effect from 1 July 2008, its notification of incompatibility of the following PCT Rules with its national law (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 02/2001, page 2):

- PCT Rule 51bis.1(e) – concerning the furnishing of a translation of the priority document;
- PCT Rule 51bis.2(a)(i) – concerning certain circumstances in which documents or evidence relating to the identity of the inventor may not be required;
- PCT Rule 51bis.2(a)(ii) – concerning certain circumstances in which documents or evidence relating to the applicant's entitlement, as at the international filing date, to apply for and be granted a patent may not be required;
- PCT Rule 51bis.2(a)(iii) – concerning certain circumstances in which documents or evidence relating to the applicant's entitlement, as at the international filing date, to claim priority of an earlier application may not be required; and
- PCT Rule 51bis.3(a) – concerning the opportunity to comply with national requirements referred to in PCT Rule 51bis.1(a)(i) to (iv) and (c) to (e).

The above-mentioned Rules will therefore be applicable to the Office as from 1 July 2008.

Modifications to the Administrative Instructions

In addition to the modifications to the Administrative Instructions under the PCT which were announced in *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008, new Section 337 has now been included, with effect from 1 July 2008. Section 337 clarifies that the receiving Office is to transmit to the International Searching Authority any copy of the results of an earlier search which that Office has received from, or prepared on request of, the applicant, and will apply to international applications filed on or after 1 July 2008. Filing and Processing of International Applications in Electronic Form

Attaching pre-conversion files to international applications filed electronically

Following the promulgation of modifications to Sections 706 and 710 of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT (relating to the electronic filing and processing of international applications) with effect from 1 July 2008 (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008, page 2, and *Official Notices (PCT Gazette)* of 24 April 2008, pages 45 *et seq.*), the International Bureau (IB) has notified, in its capacity as receiving Office, and the Offices listed below have notified the IB, in their capacity as receiving Offices, of the replacement, in their notifications pertaining to the filing and processing in electronic form of international applications (see the *PCT Gazette* reference following the name of each Office/State), of the paragraph relating to the filing of backup copies by a text relating to the inclusion of documents in pre-conversion format.

The relevant paragraph of the notification made by those Offices will read as follows:

DK Denmark (PCT Gazette No. 35/2005, pages 22816 et seq.)

As to the filing of documents in pre-conversion format (Section 710(a)(iv)):

The Danish Patent and Trademark Office will accept filing of documents in any pre-conversion format together with the international application.

EP European Patent Office (PCT Gazette No. 47/2002, pages 23832 et seq.)

As to the filing of documents in pre-conversion format (Section 710(a)(iv)):

The European Patent Office will accept the filing of documents in pre-conversion format under Section 706(a) and (f) of the Administrative Instructions under the conditions set out in Article 3 of the Decision of the President of the EPO dated 12 July 2007 (Special Edition No. 3, *OJ EPO* 2007, page 17).

In particular, the files should be archived in ZIP format and contain either plain ASCII text or be created with one of the following word processing programs:

- Microsoft 97 and later releases
- Corel WordPerfect 6.1, 8 & 10 and later releases
- Writer of OpenOffice 2.0 and later releases (including the corresponding StarOffice products).

Any objects originating from other programs may be embedded into documents being generated by the word processing programs mentioned above as long as they can be viewed without loss of the information being contained in these objects.

Documents in a format other than those mentioned above may be attached in that format only if the applicant informs the EPO at the time of filing where it can within reason acquire the relevant software.

IB International Bureau (PCT Gazette No. 34/2003, pages 19248 et seq.)

As to the filing of documents in pre-conversion format (Section 710(a)(iv)):

The International Bureau will accept filing of documents in any pre-conversion format together with the international application.

JP Japan (PCT Gazette No. 50/2006, pages 19184 et seq.)

As to the filing of documents in pre-conversion format (Section 710(a)(iv)):

The Japan Patent Office will accept no filing of documents in pre-conversion format together with the international application.

MY Malaysia (PCT Gazette No. 44/2006, pages 19118 et seq.)

As to the filing of documents in pre-conversion format (Section 710(a)(iv)):

The Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia will accept filing of documents in any pre-conversion format together with the international application.

SE Sweden (PCT Gazette No. 47/2005, pages 31398 et seq.)

As to the filing of documents in pre-conversion format (Section 710(a)(iv)):

The Swedish Patent and Registration Office will accept filing of documents in any pre-conversion format together with the international application.

SK Slovakia (PCT Gazette No. 46/2005, pages 30684 et seq.)

As to the filing of documents in pre-conversion format (Section 710(a)(iv)):

The Industrial Property Office (Slovakia) will accept filing of documents in any pre-conversion format together with the international application.

Notice to users of the PCT-SAFE software and the EPO Online Filing Software

It is recalled that a PCT-SAFE software update will be released at the beginning of July 2008, which will enable the preparation of request forms in compliance with the July 2008 rule changes for filing international applications, both in fully electronic and in PCT-EASY mode, with the International Bureau as receiving Office, as well as with certain other receiving Offices. However, the July rule changes are not available with some receiving Offices, as it has not yet been possible to make the necessary technical modifications to the respective receiving Office servers – for further details on which Offices are affected, and the consequences of this delay, see *PCT Newsletter* No. 06/2008, page 3.

It is also recalled that, in view of the time needed to incorporate into other filing software packages the necessary updates resulting from those rule changes, updates of certain software, for example, the EPO Online Filing software and the JPO PAS electronic filing software, may also not be available as of 1 July 2008, but will be available as soon as the changes have been incorporated into the respective software. Please contact the Offices concerned for further details.

With regard to the PCT-SAFE software and the EPO Online Filing Software, information concerning measures to work around the problem during the time that it exists have been published on WIPO's "Electronic Filing (PCT-SAFE)" homepage at:

It should be noted that not all of the features introduced by the July rule changes might be available with all PCT Authorities. Applicants are therefore advised to check with the Authorities concerned as to their availability.

Practical Advice

Withdrawal of an international application after international publication but before the issuance of the ISR.

Q: I recently tried to withdraw an international application before it was published, but, unfortunately, my notice of withdrawal was received by the International Bureau (IB) too late to prevent its publication. Since the International Searching Authority (ISA) had not yet issued the international search report (ISR) when the international application was published, it was published without the ISR. Given that international applications published prior to the issuance of the ISR are normally republished later with the ISR, would it be possible, in my case, to prevent publication of the ISR in view of the fact that the international application has been withdrawn?

A: Once your international application has been published, you cannot prevent the later publication of the ISR – the ISR must, according to PCT Rule 48.2(a)(v), form part of the published international application, regardless of whether there has been an intervening notice of withdrawal of the application. Your international application will have been published with an annotation to the effect that the ISR (or declaration by the ISA to the effect that no ISR will be established) was not available at the time of completion of technical preparations for publication, and the ISR (or declaration) will be published separately after it has been received by the IB (PCT Rule 48.2(g)).

The only way in which you could have been certain of stopping the publication of the ISR, as well as the publication of the rest of the international application, would have been to ensure that your notice of withdrawal reached the IB before the completion of technical preparations for international publication (PCT Rule 90*bis*.1(c)). It is recalled that this is normally 15 calendar days before the actual publication date. (For a good indication of the earliest potential date for international publication for a given application – which, in accordance with PCT Article 21.1(a), is normally promptly after the expiration of 18 months from the priority date – refer to the PCT Time Limit Calculator at: www.wipo.int/pct/en/calculator/pct-calculator.html). It is always recommended that applicants notify the IB of any withdrawal as early as possible before completion of technical preparations for publication, preferably by using Form PCT/IB/372 “Notice of withdrawal” and sending it by fax, making sure that the notice of withdrawal is signed by all applicants, or if signed by the agent, that the agent has been duly appointed by all applicants.

Notwithstanding, when the ISA is informed by the IB that the international application has been withdrawn (Form PCT/IB/307), the ISA is entitled to immediately discontinue the processing of the application and is no longer obliged to establish an ISR. In such a situation, if the ISA does

not establish an ISR, the IB would not request the ISA to do so, and no republication of the international application would take place. There is no guarantee that this would be the outcome in any given case, however. (For information on refunds, where applicable, of the search fee where the international application has been withdrawn before the start of the international search, see the relevant part of Annex D of the *PCT Applicant's Guide*.)

Note that a withdrawal of an international application can be made on the condition that it is to be effective only if the notice of withdrawal is received by the IB before completion of the technical preparations for international publication, and therefore in time to stop international publication of the application (see *PCT Applicant's Guide*, International Phase, paragraph 453) – Form PCT/IB/372 contains a special check box for this purpose.

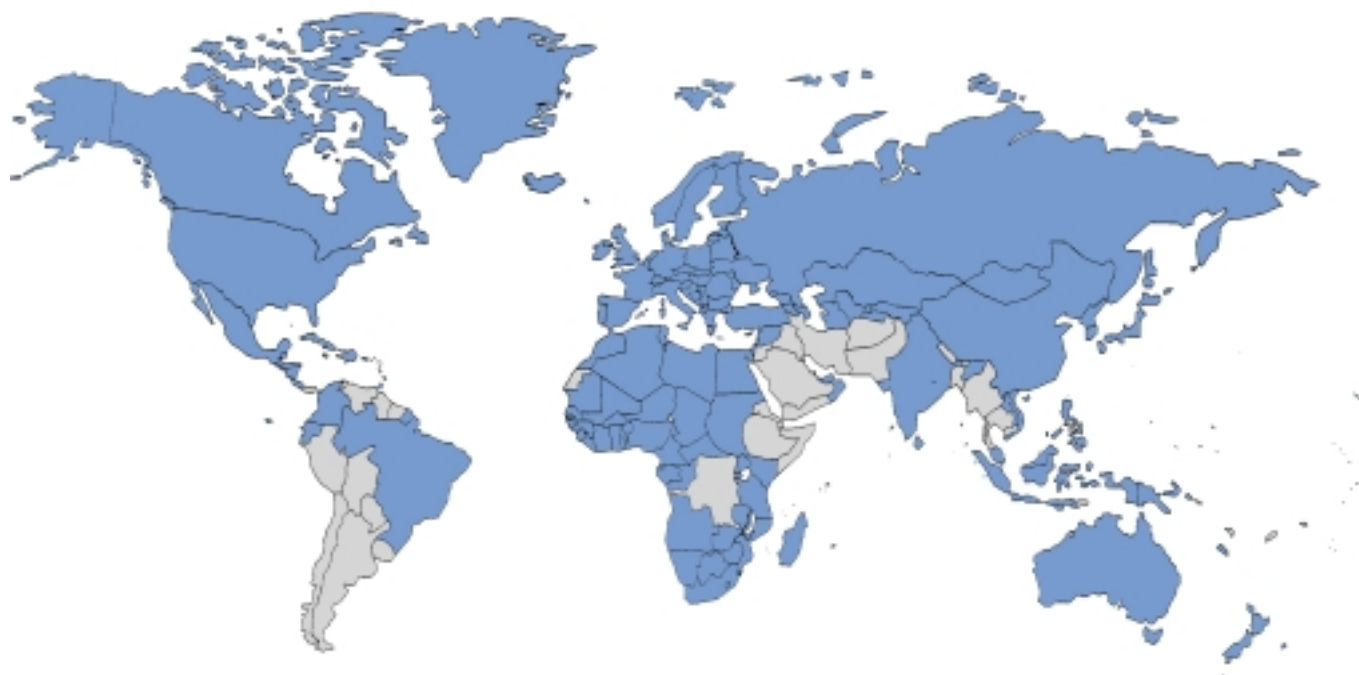

World Patent Report 2008 Now Available

WIPO has recently published the 2008 edition of the annual publication, *World Patent Report – A Statistical Review* at:

The publication of this report is part of a continuing effort at WIPO to improve statistical information on patent activity, including the PCT, covering as many countries as possible, and to develop and provide new indicators that are relevant to current intellectual property issues. It allows users to analyze and monitor the latest trends in patent activity.

This edition, based on 2006 figures (the last year for which complete worldwide patent statistics are available) and 2007 figures where available, contains a wide range of indicators, some of which are published for the first time. Statistics specifically relating to the PCT cover areas such as:

- trends in PCT filings since 1985 and filings by country of origin in 2007 (see D.1.1.);
- distribution of PCT filings by sector of the economy, for example, businesses, universities or governments, and top applicants by business sector and by university sector (see D.1.2.); and
- breakdown of international phase filings in 2007 and PCT national phase entries in 2006 (wherever the statistics have been provided by the national offices) (see Table A2).

Practical Advice

The consequences of a finding by the ISA of lack of unity of invention

Q: I have received Form PCT/ISA/206 (“Invitation to pay additional fees and, where applicable, protest fee”) from the International Searching Authority (ISA) in respect of an international application, stating that there are three inventions claimed in the application. I have therefore been invited to pay two additional search fees to cover each additional invention. I do not agree with the finding by the ISA of lack of unity of invention. What will happen if I fail to pay the additional search fees? If I pay only one additional fee, can I choose which additional invention I wish to be searched? Is it possible to protest against the ISA’s finding of lack of unity?

A: According to PCT Rule 13.1, the international application must relate to one invention only or to a group of inventions so linked as to form a single general inventive concept (“requirement of unity of invention”). The search fee is intended to cover the cost for the ISA to carry out an international search on the international application, but only to the extent that the international application meets the requirement of “unity of invention”. Therefore, if that requirement is not met, the ISA is entitled to request the applicant to pay an additional search fee for each invention beyond the first which is to be searched (see PCT Rule 40.1). Consequence of the failure to pay the additional search fees

As in your case, ISAs will invite the applicant to pay additional search fees by way of Form PCT/ISA/206. Some ISAs will attach to that invitation the results of a “partial” international search (this is not to be confused with the international search report (ISR)), limited to the invention first mentioned in the claims (the “main invention”) (see PCT Article 17(3)(a)).

If you fail to pay the additional search fees within one month from the date of mailing of the invitation (note that this time limit cannot be extended), no searches of additional inventions will be made and the ISR, when it is established, will only cover the first claimed invention (where a partial search was furnished to the applicant, the results of that partial search only will be included in the ISR). If you do not pay all requested additional search fees, the ISA will only search the number of inventions covered by the payment — upon payment, it should be possible for you to specify to the ISA which claims you wish to be searched. If you pay all the additional fees within the applicable time limit, the ISR will include the results of the search of all inventions in the application.

If you disagree with the ISA’s finding under PCT Rule 40 of lack of unity of invention (or, in the number of additional search fees that you have been invited to pay), you may, under PCT Rule 40.2(c), protest against that finding, as explained below.

Protest procedure and, where applicable, protest fee

In order to initiate the protest procedure, you must pay the additional search fees within the time limit fixed by the ISA in Form PCT/ISA/206 (one month) for all inventions in respect of which you are still interested in receiving an ISR, and send a reasoned statement explaining why you consider that unity of invention has been complied with, or that the number of additional fees required is excessive. After payment of the fees, your protest will then be examined by a review body constituted in the framework of the ISA, which, if it finds your protest justified, would order the total or partial reimbursement to you of the additional fees.

In accordance with PCT Rule 40.2(e), such a protest may also be subjected by the ISA to the payment of a “protest fee” (currently, only five International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities charge such a fee. For details, consult the *PCT Applicant’s Guide*, Annex D, for the ISA concerned). Note however that, although an additional search fee is required for each separate invention, only one protest fee is payable, where applicable, regardless of the number of additional search fees that you have been invited to pay. The protest fee is refunded if the review finds that the protest was fully justified. If you fail to pay the protest fee within the applicable time limit, the ISA will declare that the protest has been considered not to have been made.

The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 3(a), (b), (c) and (d) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 202(A). A 90%¹ reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 3 and 13. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 90% reduction are applicable, the 90% reduction is calculated **after** the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.

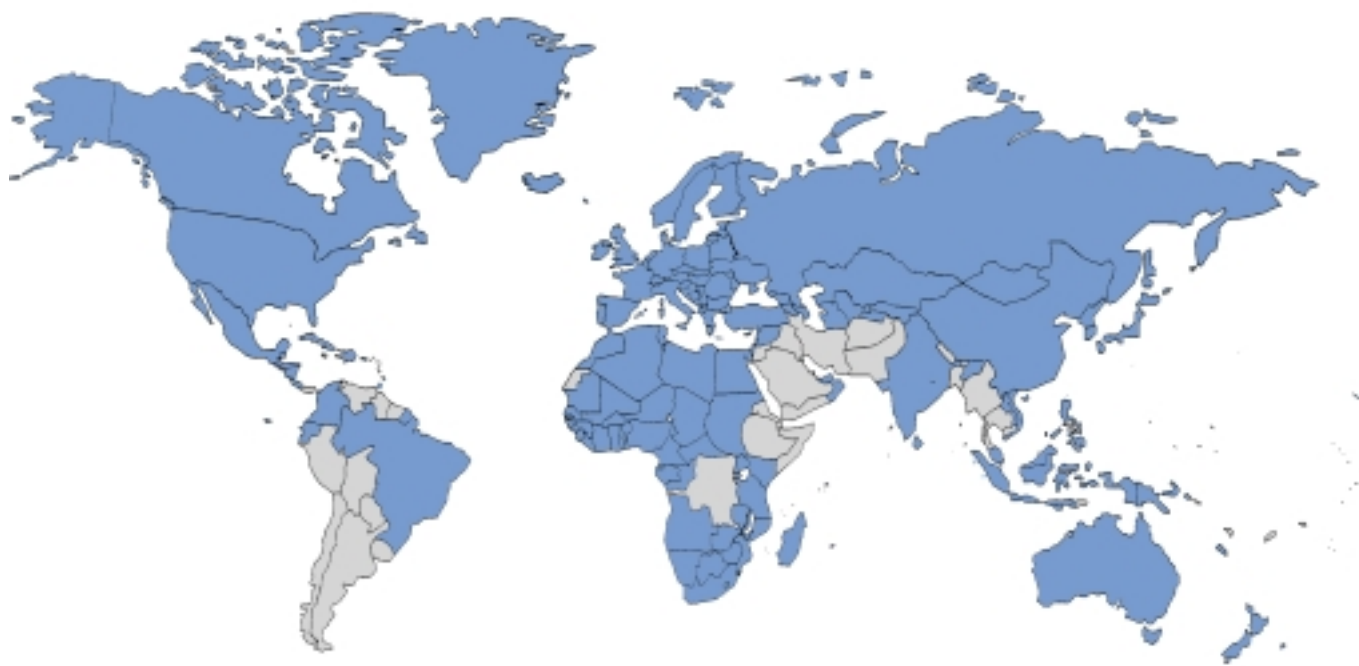

Information on the Upcoming Session of the PCT Assembly

The thirty-eighth session of the Assembly of the PCT Union (PCT Assembly) will be held in Geneva from 22 to 30 September 2008, as part of the meetings of the Assemblies of the Member States of WIPO. All documents mentioned below, which have been submitted to the PCT Assembly for discussion at its next session, are available at:

At this year's meeting, the PCT Assembly will be invited to adopt proposed amendments to the PCT Regulations (documents PCT/A/38/2 and PCT/A/38/2 Add.) in relation to the following:

- supplementary international search: clarification concerning refund of the supplementary search handling fee and the supplementary search fee; the right of agents to practice before any International Authority specified to carry out a supplementary international search; and the effects of a withdrawal of a request for supplementary international search;
- processing of the international application under PCT Article 14(4): clarification of the procedure to be followed by the receiving Office where it has accorded, albeit mistakenly, an international filing date and intends to issue a declaration under PCT Article 14(4) that the international application is to be considered withdrawn because it does not contain the claim(s) element or the description element (PCT Article 11(1)(iii)(d) and (e)); and
- amendment of claims: in the case of amendments of the claims under PCT Articles 19 and 34, the requirement for applicants to submit a replacement sheet or sheets containing a complete set of claims rather than, as at present, replacement sheets only for those sheets of claims which differ from sheets previously filed.

It is proposed that the amendments concerning the supplementary international search system enter into force on 1 January 2009 (at the same time as the main provisions enter into force – see below), and that the other amendments enter into force on 1 July 2009.

The Assembly will also be invited to:

- adopt, in the form of an understanding, criteria for any future addition of further languages of publication under the PCT (document PCT/A/38/4); and
- consider the options for determining the countries whose applicants will benefit from a reduction of certain PCT fees (following a study on the matter which has been carried out by the International Bureau), adopt the corresponding proposed amendments of the Schedule of Fees annexed to the Regulations under the PCT, and adopt proposed directives of the Assembly relating to the updating of the lists of States meeting the criteria for such reductions (document PCT/A/38/5).

Furthermore, the Assembly will be invited to take note of the report of the first session of the PCT Working Group (document PCT/A/38/1), which was held in Geneva from 26 to 30 May

2008¹, to approve a recommendation concerning further work of the Working Group and to take note of a document relating to discussions of the Meeting of International Authorities at its 15th session, held in Vienna, Austria, from 7 to 9 April 2008, relating to quality management systems for PCT International Authorities (document PCT/A/38/3)².

Information on the outcome of the Assembly will be published in the October issue of the *PCT Newsletter* (No. 10/2008).

It is recalled that other amendments, adopted by the PCT Assembly in October 2007, will also enter into force on 1 January 2009. The amendments provide for the new possibility for applicants to request that a supplementary international search be carried out by a different International Searching Authority and for the publication of international applications in Korean and Portuguese. Updated consolidated versions of the PCT Regulations in English and French, as in force from 1 January 2009, incorporating the above-mentioned amendments as well as any further amendments that are adopted at the upcoming session of the PCT Assembly and which will enter into force on that date, will be available on the PCT Resources page of PATENTSCOPE® towards the end of 2008.

Advance E-mail Communications from the International Bureau

It is recalled that the International Bureau (IB) has begun sending advance copies of notifications (PCT/IB forms) in respect of international applications to the applicant (or agent), where an e-mail address has been notified and where the IB (and any other International Authority which so wishes to send notifications by e-mail) has been authorized to do so by the applicant (or agent) (for further information on how to do this, please refer to the “Practical Advice” section of *PCT Newsletter* No. 05/2008).

Initially, for technical reasons, the IB was able to send only certain of the PCT/IB forms in this way, but as of 1 September 2008, advance copies by e-mail of all PCT/IB forms are now being sent. Note that the paper version of all notifications will continue to be sent and remains the legal copy. Applicants are reminded that it is not possible to reply to such e-mails received from the IB (that is, those which are sent from “no.reply@wipo.int”).

Budapest Treaty

Accession by Jordan

On 14 August 2008, Jordan (country code: JO) deposited its instrument of accession to the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure, thus bringing the total number of States party to that Treaty to 70. Practical Advice

The consequences of a finding of lack of unity of invention of an international application on (i) the international preliminary examination and (ii) the national phase

Q: The International Searching Authority (ISA), when searching an international application filed by my company, found that it did not fulfill the requirements of unity of invention and invited me to pay several additional search fees. Although we wanted, nevertheless, to proceed with the international application, we were not in a position to pay the extra fees, a consequence of which is that certain parts of the application were not searched. What will be the consequences of such a partial search if we file a demand for international application in respect of the application, and what will be the consequences for the national phase?

A: As was explained in the “Practical advice” in *PCT Newsletter* No. 08/2008, the international application must relate to one invention only or to a group of inventions so linked as to form a single general inventive concept (PCT Rule 13). For further information on the finding of lack of unity by the ISA, please refer to that item.

Lack of unity of invention where a demand is filed

If you file a demand for international preliminary examination, the International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA) will check the claims for unity of invention, even where some or all additional search fees have been paid and the international search report (ISR) has been established on more than just the main invention.

However, the IPEA need not, and generally will not, examine any claims relating to unsearched inventions (see PCT Rule 66.1(e)), even where you have requested the IPEA to base the examination on any amendments under PCT Articles 19 and/or 34.

If the IPEA considers that the international application does not comply with the unity of invention requirements, it may, using Form PCT/IPEA/405, inform you why there is a lack of unity of invention and, in accordance with PCT Rule 68.2, invite you within one month from the invitation either to:

- a) restrict the claims to those which have been searched and which meet the requirements of unity of invention (in which case the IPEA must specify at least one possibility of restriction), or
- b) pay additional preliminary examination fees.

Any additional preliminary examination fee may, in accordance with PCT Rule 68.3(c), be paid under protest, in which case procedures similar to those explained in relation to the international search apply – see the “Practical advice” in *PCT Newsletter* No. 08/2008. The examination of such a protest may be subjected by the IPEA to the payment to it of a protest fee (PCT Rule 68.3(e)) (for details, consult the *PCT Applicant’s Guide*, Annex E, for the IPEA concerned). If you neither restrict the claims nor pay additional fees, the examination will be carried out on the main invention only, unless you request otherwise.

Alternatively, there are cases of lack of unity of invention where, compared with the procedure of inviting the applicant to restrict claims or to pay additional fees, no or little additional effort is involved in establishing the international preliminary examination report (IPER) for the entire international application. Then, for reasons of economy, the examiner may avail himself/herself of the option referred to in PCT Rule 68.1 by choosing not to invite the applicant to restrict the claims or to pay additional fees, but rather, to carry out the international preliminary examination

on the entire international application and express his/her views on the lack of unity of invention in the IPER, specifying the reasons therefor.

Possible negative consequences in the national phase

The fact that not all claims were searched by the ISA does not, in itself, have any influence on the validity of the international application, the processing of which, including its communication to the designated (or elected) Offices, continues in respect of all claims. Nevertheless, the national law of any State may provide that such unsearched and/or unexamined parts of the international application will be considered withdrawn as far as that State is concerned unless a special fee is paid by the applicant to its national Office (PCT Articles 17(3)(b) and 34(3)(c)) – note, however, that there are only a few States which directly apply such provisions (for example, China and Sweden) though others may charge further fees for the establishment of searches before any patent can be granted. Similar fees may apply in accordance with PCT Article 34(3)(b) if the applicant chooses to restrict the claims during international preliminary examination but then wishes to pursue the claims during the national phase which were not the subject of international preliminary examination.

In the national phase, it is possible that designated Offices may review the conclusions of the International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities and come to different conclusions regarding unity of invention. These Offices may also require additional inventions to be removed from the application or to be continued in a divisional application if necessary. However, in accordance with PCT Articles 27(1) and 27(4), the Offices must form their views based on the criteria set out in PCT Rule 13, unless the result of alternative national criteria is more favorable to the applicant (meaning that fewer fees, amendments and divisional applications would be required).

The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 3(a), (b), (c) and (d) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 202(A). A 90%¹ reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 3 and 13. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 90% reduction are applicable, the 90% reduction is calculated **after** the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.

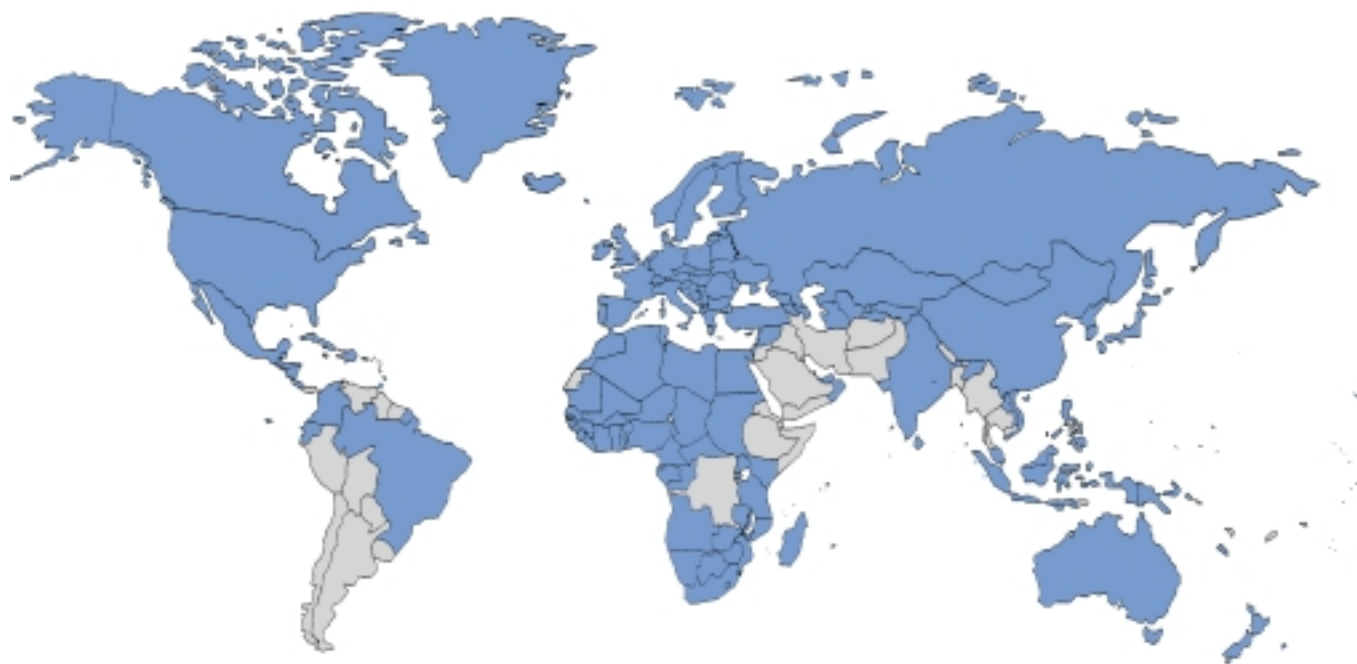

PCT NEWSLETTER

Assemblies of the Member States of WIPO

The Assemblies of the member States of WIPO, including the 38th session of the Assembly of the PCT Union, were held in Geneva from 22 to 30 September 2008.

Appointment of new Director General

Following his nomination by the WIPO Coordination Committee on 13 May 2008, the WIPO General Assembly appointed Mr. Francis Gurry, on 22 September 2008, as Director General of WIPO for a six-year term that began on 1 October.

Mr. Gurry, a national of Australia, is the fourth Director General of WIPO, following Georg Bodenhausen of the Netherlands (1970-1973), Arpad Bogsch of the United States of America (1973-1997) and Kamil Idris of Sudan (1997-2008).

Representatives of the WIPO member States congratulated Mr. Gurry on his appointment and highlighted his wealth of experience in intellectual property and the professionalism that he brings to this position.

In his acceptance speech, Mr. Gurry highlighted the importance of the patent system as well as the problems which had been brought on by its own success, and expressed the belief that the PCT provides a better basis for constructing a solution to those problems than any other solution under consideration or in the range of current imagination.

Assembly of the PCT Union

The PCT Assembly adopted amendments to the PCT Regulations relating to three subjects:

- supplementary international search: clarification concerning refund of the supplementary search handling fee and the supplementary search fee; the right of agents to practice before any International Authority specified to carry out a supplementary international search; and the effects of a withdrawal of a request for supplementary international search;
- processing of the international application under PCT Article 14(4): clarification of the procedure to be followed by the receiving Office where it has accorded, albeit mistakenly, an international filing date and intends to issue a declaration under PCT Article 14(4) that the international application is to be considered withdrawn because it does not contain the claim(s) element or the description element (PCT Article 11(1)(iii)(d) and (e)); and
- amendment of claims: in the case of amendments of the claims under PCT Articles 19 and 34, the requirement for applicants to submit a replacement sheet or sheets containing a complete set of claims rather than, as at present, replacement sheets only for those sheets of claims which differ from sheets previously filed.

The amendments relating to supplementary international search will come into force 1 January 2009 at the same time as the service itself begins. Three offices (the Federal Service for Intellectual Property, Patents and Trademarks (Russian Federation), the Swedish Patent and Registration Office and the Nordic Patent Institute) intend to offer supplementary international searches as of that date. Furthermore, the Austrian Patent Office intends to offer the service from later in 2009 and the National Board of Patents and Registration of Finland and the European Patent Office from 2010. Several Offices have not yet decided when they will offer this service.

The other amendments will come into force 1 July 2009. Minor corrections to the proposals in the working documents (PCT/A/38/2 and 2 Add.) were agreed upon, and the final texts will be available in Annexes I and II of the report of the session (PCT/A/38/6).

The Assembly also adopted an understanding on criteria which would be applied when deciding whether to add further languages of publication under PCT Rule 48.3 in the future (PCT/A/38/4), and noted reports on the first session of the PCT Working Group (PCT/A/38/1) and the quality management systems of PCT International Authorities (PCT/A/38/3).

A report and proposal on eligibility criteria for reductions in PCT fees (PCT/A/38/5) for certain applicants from developing countries was remitted to the PCT Working Group for further consideration.

In a joint session with the Paris Union Assembly and the Patent Law Treaty Assembly, the PCT Assembly also noted a status report (A/45/2) on the WIPO Digital Access Service for Priority Documents, which is expected to become available for practical use next year.

Other Assemblies

The PLT Union Assembly adopted modifications to the Model International Request Form and decided that certain modifications of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT would apply for the purposes of the PLT and its Regulations, both with immediate effect (PLT/A/5/1).

The General Assembly noted a report on the work of the Standing Committee on the Law of Patents (WO/GA/36/10), including:

- a non-exhaustive list of matters for future discussion;

- a request for the preparation of preliminary studies by the Secretariat on the topics of dissemination of patent information (including, *inter alia*, the establishment of a database on search and examination reports); exceptions from patentable subject matter and limitations to the rights, *inter alia*, research exemption and compulsory licenses; patents and standards; and client-attorney privilege – it was emphasized that the commissioning of these studies did not mean that they were prioritized over the other issues; and
- a recommendation to the Director General to make provision in the revised Program and Budget for 2009 for a conference on issues relating to the implications, including public policy implications, of patents on certain areas of public policy, such as health, the environment, climate change and food security.

Publication Schedule and Non-Working Days at the IB at the end of the year

Non-working days at the IB

The non-working days at the International Bureau (IB) during December 2008 and January 2009, in addition to the weekends, will be 8, 25 and 26 December 2008, and 1 and 2 January 2009. The IB will be open for business on 29, 30 and 31 December 2008, and will then be open as usual as from Monday, 5 January 2009.

Closing dates of the PCT Information Service

The PCT Information Service will be closed from Wednesday, 24 December 2008 to Sunday, 4 January 2009, inclusive. It will reopen on Monday, 5 January 2009, at 9.00 a.m., Geneva (local) time.

Please note, however, that if you call the PCT Information Service (telephone number: (+41-22) 338 83 38) during the holiday period, there will be a message service and a telephone number will be provided for cases requiring urgent attention. It is recalled that the PCT

Information Service answers general inquiries about the filing of international applications and the procedure to be followed during the international phase of the PCT.

Note that calls relating to specific international applications should be directed to the relevant processing team, the number for which is provided on the IB forms. Correspondence relating to specific applications should be addressed to the fax number indicated on the IB forms or to the PCT Document Section fax number: (+41-22) 338 82 70.

Publication schedule and technical preparations for publication

During the forthcoming holiday period, PCT applications which would normally have been published on Thursday, 25 December 2008 and Thursday, 1 January 2009, which are non-working days at WIPO, will be published a day earlier, on Wednesday, 24 December and 31 December 2008, respectively.

As from the publication date of 27 November 2008, the completion of technical preparations for publication will take place earlier than the usual 15 days before publication; the schedule for the completion of technical preparations will return to normal for international applications that will be published on 22 January 2009. For further details, see the following table, which gives the schedule for the publications that will be affected, and the respective dates by which any changes should be received by the IB.

Any applicant who, in respect of an international application to be published during the above-mentioned period, wishes to make any change which should be taken into account for the purposes of international publication, should be aware of the above-mentioned dates. For example, if the applicant wishes to withdraw the international application, a designation or a priority claim under PCT Rules 90*bis*.1(c), 90*bis*.2(e) or 90*bis*.3(e), in sufficient time to prevent international publication thereof, or if the applicant wishes to submit amendments to the claims under PCT Article 19 and the time limit under PCT Rule 46.1 will expire soon, or wishes to change an indication concerning the applicant, agent, common representative or inventor under

PCT Rule 92*bis* – any such notice must reach the IB by the date indicated in the right hand column of the table if the changes are to be reflected in the international publication.

It is, as always, strongly recommended that applicants notify the IB of any change as early as possible before completion of technical preparations for publication, preferably by fax.

Reminder about Availability of Inventors' Addresses to Third Parties

It might be a matter of concern for certain inventors in certain situations that their name and address, once the international application has been published, is available to third parties by way of the bibliographical data that is published on the PATENTSCOPE® search service, and that such information may, in particular, be found by entering the inventor's family name in an Internet search engine. Note also that even if an inventor's address is changed before international publication, that address will be available in the file of the international application, and will be accessible to third parties after publication of the international application (see PCT Rule 94.1(b)). It is therefore advisable that applicants or their agents inform inventors, prior to filing the international application, that their name and address will be published and available to third parties, if it is included in the request form.

It is recalled that there is no requirement under the PCT that the address indicated in the request form (and subsequently published as part of the international application) be the inventor's **home address**. Various alternatives exist, including, where possible:

- using the address of the inventor's employer
- using a post office box number, or
- using the agent's address

Whatever address is chosen would ultimately be a matter for the applicants and inventors to decide, and may depend on the national law of the relevant designated Offices, however, for the purposes of the international phase, the International Bureau would not object to the use of an address which is not the inventor's home address.

Another option, where the address of at least one applicant has been furnished, for example where the international application has been filed by a corporate applicant, would be to not furnish an address for the inventor(s) at all (see PCT Rule 26.2*bis*(b)). For an explanation of what may happen if this option is chosen, as well as other information relating to the matter of the furnishing of the inventor's name and address, see the "Practical Advice" published in *PCT Newsletter* No. 08/2007 at:

PATENTSCOPE® Search Service: PCT File Contents Available Soon

The complete file contents of published PCT international applications (with the exception of certain documents, the communication of which the PCT does not permit (see, for example, PCT Article 38)) will soon be available online through the PATENTSCOPE® search service.

As a first step, the PCT Request Form (PCT/RO/101) is now available for PCT applications with an international filing date as from January 2006. Further documents, such as correspondence, copies of forms issued by Offices and other documents, will be added in the coming months. It is recalled that access to files of PCT applications is given according to PCT Rule 94.

Until now, access to the file has been on request only and subject to reimbursement of the cost of the service. However, access to the complete file contents of published PCT international applications is now available:

- Online and automatically via the PATENTSCOPE® search service
- Free of charge

Note, however, that it will not be possible to obtain certified copies in this way; these will continue to be available only upon request and on paper, and will remain subject to the payment of a fee.

Withdrawal of Notifications of Incompatibility of Certain Modified PCT Rules with National Laws

Further to its notification of incompatibility under PCT Rules 26bis.3(j) (restoration of right of priority by receiving Office), 49ter.1(g) (effect of restoration of right of priority by receiving Office) and 49ter.2 (h) (restoration of right of priority by designated Office), as modified with effect from 1 April 2007, with its national law (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 06/2006), the National Institute of Industrial Property (Portugal), in its capacities as receiving Office and designated Office, has notified the International Bureau that it has withdrawn the said notification with effect from 1 October 2008. PCT Rules 26bis.3(a) to (i), 49ter.1(a) to (f) and 49ter.2(a) to (g) therefore apply with respect to the Office with effect from that date.

Practical Advice

Seeking patent protection via the PCT in respect of States which have recently joined a regional patent organization

Q: On 5 December 2007, I filed an international application claiming the priority of an earlier application filed on 15 December 2006. I will be entering the national phase in the various States that interest me before 15 June 2009. In view of the fact that Norway, which was designated in my application for a national patent, became a member State of the European Patent Organisation on 1 January 2008, is it possible to obtain a European patent for Norway, instead of entering the Norwegian national phase separately before the Norwegian Industrial Property Office?

A: Under PCT Rule 4.9(a), the filing of the request constitutes the designation of all Contracting States that are bound by the PCT on the international filing date, for the grant of each kind of protection available, and for the grant of both regional and national patents. Since your international application was filed on 5 December 2007, a regional designation for a European patent ("EP designation") and a national designation for Norway will have been included; the EP designation does not, however, include Norway as it was not a member State of the European Patent Organisation at that time. Although Norway became a member of the European Patent Organisation on 1 January 2008, before the date on which you will enter the national phase under PCT Article 22(1) (or 39(1)), it is the international filing date which determines which States are designated, which type(s) of protection is/are being sought, and which national or regional patents are being sought (PCT Rule 4.9(a)). An EP designation is, in effect, the designation of those States that are, at the date of filing of the PCT application, members of both the European Patent Organisation and the PCT – it is not possible to add a State to a regional designation after the international filing date of the application concerned (in the same way that it is not possible to add a designation for the purposes of obtaining a national patent).

If you wish to obtain patent protection in Norway on the basis of your PCT application, it will be necessary to pursue a national patent by entering the national phase directly before the Norwegian Industrial Property Office¹.

Any PCT application filed on or after 1 January 2008, the date on which Norway became a member of the European Patent Organisation, will automatically include the designation of Norway for the purposes of obtaining a European patent as well as a national patent, and applicants of those applications have the choice of whether to enter the national phase in Norway or whether to seek protection in that State via a European patent.

1. Note that the situation regarding the EP designation is the same for Croatia, which also became a member State of the European Patent Organisation on 1 January 2008. However, for international applications filed prior to that date, it is still possible, in the national phase, to extend European patent applications to Croatia, provided that the international application includes the designation of Croatia for a national patent, as well as an EP designation (that is, that the automatic designations of Croatia and EP have not been withdrawn). It is important that applicants and their agents be vigilant as to which Contracting States are covered by a regional patent when they enter the national phase, to ensure that they do not make the mistake of presuming that they will be able to obtain a regional patent in a particular State, when they should in fact be taking the necessary steps to enter the national phase in that State directly with the national Office concerned.

(Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 90% reduction are applicable, the 90% reduction is calculated **after** the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) 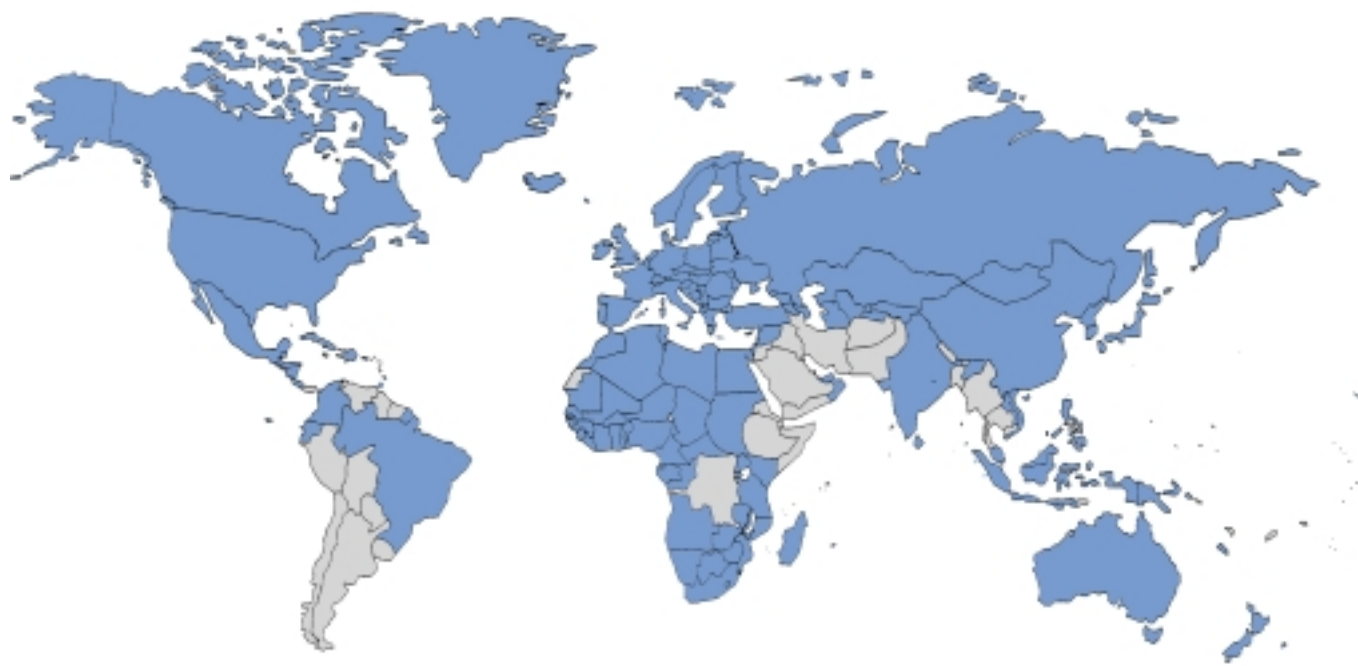

Budapest Treaty

Accession by Bosnia and Herzegovina and Peru

Peru (country code: PE) (which is not a PCT Contracting State) and Bosnia and Herzegovina (country code: BA) (which is a PCT Contracting State), deposited, on 20 and 27 October 2008, respectively, their instruments of accession to the Budapest Treaty on the International Recognition of the Deposit of Microorganisms for the Purposes of Patent Procedure, thus bringing the total number of States party to that Treaty to 72. The Budapest Treaty will enter into force with respect to those States on 20 and 27 January 2009, respectively. An updated table of States party to the Budapest Treaty is available at:

It is recalled that the Budapest Treaty permits the disclosure of an invention involving a microorganism, or the use of a microorganism or other biological material, by effecting a deposit of a sample of the microorganism with a specialized institution. It thus eliminates, before the national patent Offices of the Contracting States of the Budapest Treaty and the regional Offices that have filed a declaration of acceptance under Article 9(1)(a) of the Treaty, the need to deposit such a sample in each country in which protection is sought.

Warning about Requests for Payment of Fees

Reference is made to the many warnings that have been published in the *PCT Newsletter* about invitations to PCT applicants and agents to pay fees that do not come from the International Bureau of WIPO and are unrelated to the processing of international applications under the PCT.

Practical Advice

Payment of fees to the International Bureau as receiving Office when filing international applications with that Office on a regular basis

Q: The company I work for files several international applications a month, and since our usual receiving Office does not accept international applications filed electronically, we have decided to start filing our international applications electronically with the International Bureau as receiving Office; by doing this, we will be able to benefit from the fee reductions associated with filing applications electronically. Given that we will have to pay fees to the International Bureau as receiving Office on a regular basis, is it possible to open an account with the International Bureau for that purpose, and would that account serve for the payment of other fees to WIPO?

A: It is possible to open a current account in Swiss francs with WIPO, and to authorize the charging of that account when paying fees to the International Bureau as receiving Office (RO/IB), and may be worthwhile to do so if you file international applications on a regular basis with the RO/IB. Please be aware that the holding of an account at another receiving Office is

not sufficient to enable payments to be made to the RO/IB – you must hold an account with WIPO.

One advantage of having a current account with WIPO is that it facilitates fee payments as there is a section on the fee calculation sheet annexed to the request form specifically for authorizing the receiving Office to charge the applicant's account at WIPO. If the filing is made using the PCT-SAFE software, whether filing in fully electronic form or on paper with the request in PCT-EASY format, the PCT-SAFE software also allows applicants to authorize the charging of their WIPO account (see the "Payment" page of the Electronic Request).

Furthermore, if you have a WIPO current account and have marked the appropriate check-box of the fee calculation sheet (the second check-box in the authorization section) or selected the appropriate box in the above-mentioned payment page of the PCT-SAFE software, and there is a mistake in the calculation of the fees due upon filing, the receiving Office will be authorized to charge any deficiency (or credit any overpayment, as the case may be) in the fees you have calculated, without the need for it to invite you to pay the extra amount, and for you to arrange for a second payment. This saves time and effort for both parties, and reduces the risk of loss of rights for the applicant. Each time fees have been charged to your account, you will receive confirmation of payment by way of Form PCT/RO/102.

Note that, although current accounts at WIPO are held in Swiss francs only, deposits are accepted in other currencies, provided that that currency is freely convertible into Swiss francs – the amount of that deposit would then be converted into Swiss francs according to the prevailing rate of exchange.

If you hold a current account, you must ensure that you have adequate funds to cover all charged fees. Thus, the amount that you credit to the account will need to be sufficient to cover international filing and search fees.

A current account at WIPO can also be used for other purposes, for example:

- the payment of other RO/IB fees, such as the fee for the establishment of a priority document by that Office (PCT Rule 21.2);
- the payment of fees to the IB other than in its capacity as receiving Office, such as the early publication fee (PCT Rule 48.4(a));
- the payment of fees related to other forms of intellectual property protection, for example the registration of marks under the Madrid System or the registration of industrial designs under the Hague System; or
- the purchase of WIPO publications.

If you wish to make use of your WIPO current account to pay fees other than those which are due upon filing a PCT application (and are therefore not making use of the authorization boxes on the fee calculation sheet or in the PCT-SAFE software), a written authorization must be made which should clearly identify the purpose of the payment, the number of your WIPO current account, and, where applicable, any particulars necessary to identify the application in respect of which payment is being made, namely: the name of the applicant, the file reference or, if known, the international application number.

Note that the following modes of payment to WIPO are also possible:

- by bank transfer to WIPO's bank account (for payments in Swiss francs, US dollars or euro);

- by credit card (in the case of PCT applications filed with the RO/IB, using Form PCT/RO/197; if using the PCT-SAFE software, that software provides for a secure means for furnishing the credit card details to the RO/IB);
- by transfer to WIPO's postal account (for payments in Swiss francs only);
- by check made payable to the World Intellectual Property Organization (for payments in Swiss francs, US dollars or euro) (consideration is currently being given to the elimination of this payment method).

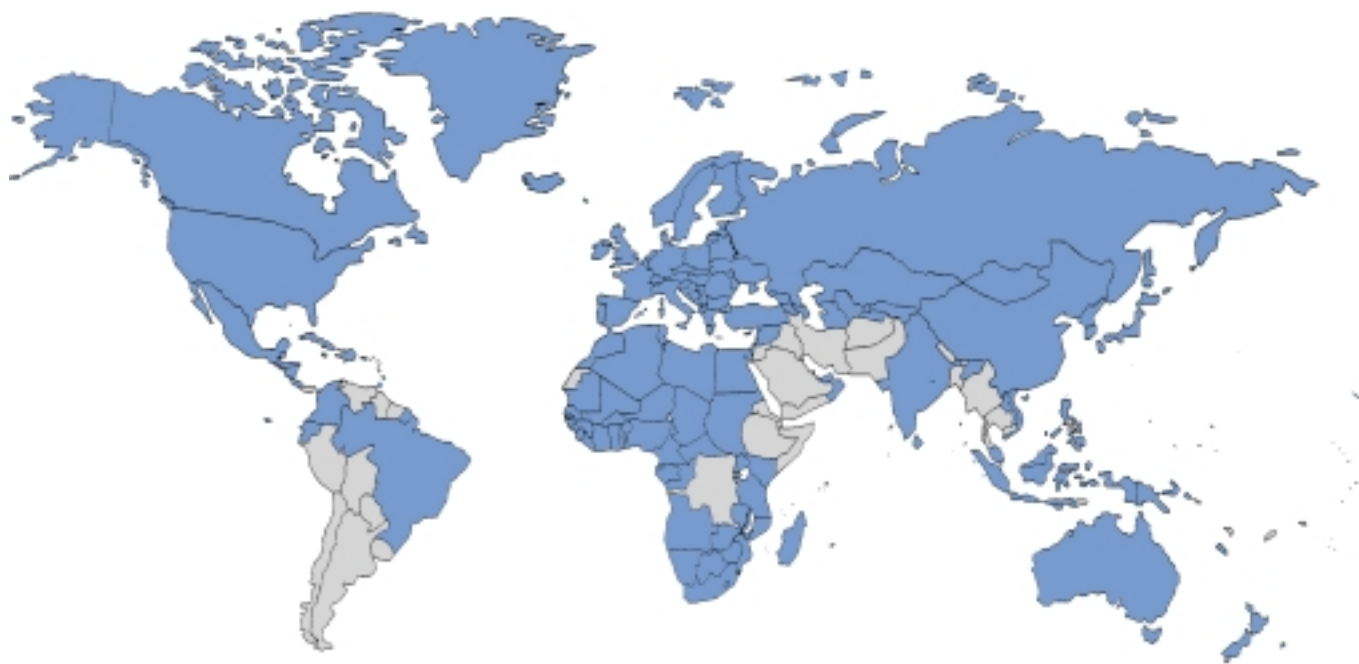

New PCT Service: Supplementary International Search

On 1 January 2009, PCT Rule 45*bis* will come into effect and the new PCT supplementary international search (SIS) service will be available to all applicants. This is an optional service, developed at the request of applicants, that allows additional searches to be performed during the international phase, in addition to the search prepared by the applicant's "usual" International Searching Authority (ISA). Three Authorities (the Federal Service for Intellectual Property, Patents and Trademarks (Russian Federation), the Swedish Patent and Registration Office and the Nordic Patent Institute) will offer the service as from 1 January 2009; at least three more Authorities are expected to begin offering the service later in 2009 and in 2010.

Why is the new service being introduced?

It has always been recognized that no search can be guaranteed to find all of the relevant prior art. The main international search is intended to be of a high quality and to cover not only the PCT minimum documentation but also the additional range of documentation which would be searched by the ISA in its role as a national Office. Furthermore, Offices are working on technical systems to assist examiners in conducting an effective, broad search, as well as on quality management systems to encourage good practice. Nevertheless, there remain cases where highly relevant citations are only found during the national phase, once considerable additional expenditure has been incurred.

One of the major problems in finding relevant prior art is that the range of languages in which original technical disclosures are made is constantly increasing; no single Office is capable of searching even the whole of the PCT minimum documentation in its original language, let alone the large volume of other patent and non-patent literature containing original disclosures. Machine translation goes some way towards addressing this problem, but is still a long way from being a substitute for consideration of disclosures by an examiner who understands the original language.

The SIS service will thus allow applicants to reduce the risk of being faced with new citations during the national phase. It is not expected that SIS will be requested routinely, but rather as a strategic decision by the applicant, taken after consideration of the results of the main international search, the commercial importance of the particular application and the amount of prior art in the particular technical field which is known to be published in a language in which the main ISA is not skilled.

Moreover, it is up to the individual Authorities offering SIS to define the scope of the service which they are offering, and for the applicant to decide which (if any) of those services meets the needs of the particular application. Some Authorities may offer a search which is focused on documentation in languages in which they specialize, while others may offer a full search, covering their entire documentation as they would do if they were conducting a "normal" (main) international search. Each Authority also sets its own fees for the service and it is up to the applicant to decide whether SIS is desirable in any particular case. The applicant is permitted to request more than one SIS on the same international application, if this is desired.

Which Authority can I use to carry out the supplementary international search?

In principle, subject to any limitations which may be set out by the Authority concerned, an ISA which has announced that it will act as an Authority specified for supplementary search will be able to act in such a capacity for any international application, irrespective of the receiving Office with which the application has been filed (as distinct from the international searching and preliminary examining authorities, which, under PCT Rules 35 and 59.1, depend on the receiving Office with which the application was filed).

What does a supplementary international search cover?

As regards the scope of documentation searched, each participating Authority defines the scope of its service. The services available from January 2009 are summarized in the table, below.

The SIS will be carried out on the application as filed (amendments under PCT Article 19 and/or 34 will not be considered) and will only cover one invention or group of inventions having unity of invention – there is no option for paying additional fees for the searching of multiple inventions. However, if the main ISA has identified a lack of unity before SIS is requested, the latter can be requested to concentrate on an invention which is not necessarily the first one claimed (PCT Rule 45*bis*.1(d)).

If not established in English, the resulting supplementary international search report will be translated into English by the International Bureau (IB).

How much will it cost?

Requests for SIS must be submitted directly to the IB and not to individual Authorities. There is a supplementary search handling fee of 200 Swiss francs to cover the costs of the IB and a supplementary search fee set by each Authority offering the service. These fees must be paid to the IB in Swiss francs within one month of filing the request for SIS. Applicants from certain States may be eligible for a 90% reduction in the supplementary search handling fee (please refer to the PCT Schedule of Fees, as in force from 1 January 2009, at: http://www.wipo.int/pct/en/texts/pdf/pct_regs2009.pdf).

Although there is no opportunity to pay for searches of additional inventions, it is permitted to request a review of any finding of lack of unity. The Authority may require a fee for this, which in this case is payable directly to the Authority in (one of) its accepted currency(ies).

Limitations of the service

The Authority may, subject to any special provisions, refuse to issue a supplementary search report for some or all of the claims in the following circumstances (in which case there is no refund of the fees):

- if the main ISA declares that no international search report will be established; or
- if the Authority would not carry out a main international search in the same case, for reasons of subject matter, clarity or failure to provide a sequence listing in the appropriate form.

The Authority may, according to PCT Rule 45*bis*.9, set out any limitations and conditions of the service in its agreement with the IB, for example, it may limit itself to a maximum number of

searches per year, or may only offer the service for certain technical fields. If no search is performed because of such a special limitation, the supplementary search fee will be refunded.

Note that the applicant may withdraw a request for SIS at any time prior to the issuance of either the supplementary international search report or the declaration by the Authority that no report will be established. As long as the IB has not yet transmitted the request for SIS to the Authority in question, both the handling fee and the supplementary search fee will be refunded to the applicant.

Application of the Patent Cooperation Treaty in Montenegro

It is recalled that, following the adoption by the National Assembly of the Republic of Montenegro of a declaration of independence on 3 June 2006, Montenegro deposited, on 4 December 2006, a declaration that the PCT continues to be applicable, as from 3 June 2006, as far as Montenegro is concerned (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 01/2007 at: http://www.wipo.int/edocs/pctdocs/en/2007/pct_news_2007_1.pdf).

The Intellectual Property Office of the Republic of Montenegro (Montenegrin Office) has informed the International Bureau (IB) that it started operations on 28 May 2008. Whereas the Government of the Republic of Montenegro has delegated, under PCT Rule 19.1(b), the functions of receiving Office under the PCT, in relation to international applications filed by nationals or residents of Montenegro, to the International Bureau in its capacity as receiving Office under the PCT, the Montenegrin Office has taken up its functions as designated and elected Office under the PCT as from 28 May 2008.

Effect in Montenegro of international applications under the Patent Cooperation Treaty

(1) Pursuant to the deposit of the declaration of continuation referred to above, nationals and residents of Montenegro may file international applications, and Montenegro is automatically designated in all international applications filed on or after 3 June 2006.

(2) The conditions under which international applications, or patents resulting therefrom, may continue to have effect in Montenegro are the following:

- (a) any rights granted before 3 June 2006 by the Intellectual Property Office of Serbia and Montenegro on the basis of an international application shall have effect in Montenegro until the expiration of its term of protection or the term for which maintenance fees have been paid, without any additional registration or payment of any additional fees;

(b) any rights granted by the Serbian Office on or after 3 June 2006 but prior to the commencement of operation of the Montenegrin Office on the basis of an international application shall have effect in Montenegro until the expiration of its term of protection or the term for which maintenance fees have been paid, without any additional registration or payment of any additional fees;

(c) international applications which have entered the national phase and were pending before the Intellectual Property Office of Serbia and Montenegro or the Serbian Office at the time of the commencement of operation of the Montenegrin Office shall have effect in Montenegro as of the international filing date, provided that the applicant:

- i) files with the Montenegrin Office a request for the grant of the right not later than one year after the commencement of operation of the Montenegrin Office;
- ii) submits to the Montenegrin Office a copy of the application and of any attachment thereto, filed with the Intellectual Property Office of Serbia and Montenegro or the Serbian Office, together with the certificate of receipt of the application by the Office with which it was previously filed; and
- iii) pays the prescribed fee.

(d) international applications which have not entered the national phase before the Serbian Office and for which on 3 June 2006, the time limit under PCT Article 22 or 39(1) had not yet expired, shall have effect in Montenegro as of the international filing date, provided that the applicant:

- i) files with the Montenegrin Office a request for the grant of the right not later than one year after the commencement of operation of the Montenegrin Office or within the time limit under Article 22 or 39(1), whichever time limit expires later;
- ii) submits to the Montenegrin Office, where applicable, a translation of the application; and
- iii) pays the prescribed fee.

Modifications to Administrative Instructions and to certain PCT Forms

Following the adoption of amendments to the Regulations under the PCT which will enter into force on 1 January 2009, a number of modifications have been made to Sections 102, 415, 420, 425 and 515 of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT and new Sections 436, 519 and 520 have been added. Furthermore, modifications to Section 204 have been made and a new Section 204*bis* has been added, modifying the recommended headings for certain sections of the international application and introducing recommendations for the presentation of the title of the invention and numbering of claims for consistency with the “Common Application Format” adopted in November 2007 by the European Patent Office, the Japan Patent Office and the United States Patent and Trademark Office (see: <http://www.trilateral.net/news/20071130/index.php>). All new/modified Sections will apply to international applications filed on or after 1 January 2009.

Modifications have also been made to certain forms used by the applicant, the International Searching Authority, the International Bureau and the International Preliminary Examining Authority, and new forms have been introduced for use by the Authority specified for supplementary search.

European Patent Convention

Accession by the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia

The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia deposited its instrument of accession to the European Patent Convention (EPC) on 28 October 2008, and will become bound by that Convention on 1 January 2009.

Therefore, any international application filed on or after 1 January 2009 will include the designation of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia for a European patent (applicants should be aware that any international application filed before that date **will not include the designation of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia for a European Patent**, however, the extension system, as explained below, will continue to apply to all international applications filed prior to that date). Moreover, as from 1 January 2009, it will be possible for nationals and residents of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia to file international applications with the European Patent Office (EPO) as receiving Office, in addition to the State Office of Industrial Property (the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia) or the International Bureau of WIPO.

This accession brings the number of Contracting States of the EPC to 35.

Effect on the extension agreement between the EPO and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia

The extension agreement between the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and the European Patent Organisation will terminate with the entry into force of the EPC in the former

Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia on 1 January 2009. It will thereafter no longer be possible to extend European patent applications and patents to the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia. The extension system will, however, continue to apply to all European and international applications filed prior to 1 January 2009, as well as to all European patents granted in respect of such applications.

EPO: Change in the Conditions for Entitlement to the 75% Reduction in PCT Search and Preliminary Examination Fees

On 21 October 2008, the Administrative Council of the European Patent Organisation made a decision concerning the reduction of the fees for international search and preliminary examination carried out on international applications in favor of nationals of certain States. That decision supersedes the decision of 11 October 2000 which was published in the *Official Journal of the EPO*, No. 10/2000 (see also *PCT Newsletter* No. 11/2000, page 3).

As a result of that decision, there will be a change, as from 1 January 2009, in the conditions for a 75% reduction in the search fee, the additional search fee, the preliminary examination fee and the additional preliminary examination fee, payable to the European Patent Office (EPO). As from that date, the fees will be reduced by 75% if the international application or the demand for international preliminary examination is filed by a natural person who is a national of and resident in a State which is not a Contracting State of the European Patent Convention, and which, on the date of filing of the application or of the demand, is listed as a low-income or lower-middle-income economy by the World Bank¹. If there are several applicants, each must satisfy these criteria.

The new conditions will apply, with respect to the reduction in the search fee, to all international applications filed on or after 1 January 2009, and, with respect to the reduction in the preliminary examination fee, to all demands filed on or after that date.

Modification of kind codes

As from 1 January 2009, publication codes ("kind codes"), which are used to distinguish PCT international applications published by the International Bureau (IB), will be modified.

International applications republished with alterations, amendments, corrections or supplements will be specifically distinguished from other documents by additional publication codes not previously used. The purpose of this change is to improve the usability of published PCT data and documents by more clearly identifying the reasons for republication of international applications.

In compliance with WIPO Standard ST.16, the following publication codes will be used (additional codes are denoted by bold italics):

A1	International application published with ISR
A2	International application published without ISR
A2	International application published with declaration under PCT Article 17(2)(a)
A3	Later publication of ISR with revised front page
A4	Later publication of amended claims and/or statement (PCT Article 19) with revised front page

A9	International application or ISR republished with corrections, alterations or supplements (see also WIPO Standard ST.50)

For example: under the present system, an international application published with an ISR would retain the publication code A1 after republication for any reason; under the new system, the application would be assigned the publication code A4 if republished with amended claims.

Changes in publication codes will be reflected in all international applications published or republished by the IB on or after 1 January 2009. International applications published or republished before that date will not be affected and will retain their original publication codes.

Practical Advice**International applications in respect of which a supplementary international search may be requested; how to request such a search.**

Q: I have filed an international application claiming the priority of an earlier application filed on 11 June 2007. Will it be possible for me to take advantage of the new supplementary international search service that will start up on 1 January 2009, or is it only available for

international applications filed on or after that date? If I am eligible to request a supplementary search, please could you tell me how to do this?

A: The new supplementary international search service will be available not only to international applications filed on or after 1 January 2009, but also to existing international applications where the time limit for requesting supplementary international search (SIS) has not yet expired (PCT Rule 45*bis*.1(a)). The time limit for requesting SIS is 19 months from the priority date (or international filing date, if the application does not claim the priority of an earlier-filed application). Therefore, this new service will be available for any international application with a priority date on or after 1 June 2007.

It is expected that requests for SIS will normally be made after the applicant has received and assessed the main international search report, but this does not necessarily have to be the case (and will, unfortunately, sometimes not be possible where the main international search report is issued late). You should request SIS using Form PCT/IB/375, which should be filed with the IB and not sent directly to any of the Authorities specified for SIS. Form PCT/IB/375 is now available, in editable PDF format, on the PCT Resources page at:

http://www.wipo.int/pct/en/forms/2009/ed_ib375.pdf

When completing the supplementary search request form, you should select the International Searching Authority (ISA) which is to carry out the SIS, noting that this must be one of the three ISAs which are offering the SIS service from 1 January 2009, and that it cannot be the ISA which has carried out the “main search” under PCT Article 16(1). It is possible to have more than one SIS carried out on the same application (PCT Rule 45*bis*.1(a)), however, if you want to do this, a separate supplementary search request should be submitted for each SIS requested.

The fees for SIS, the supplementary search fee and the supplementary search handling fee, should be paid to the IB, in Swiss francs, within one month from the date on which the supplementary search request is received by the IB.

This request may need to be accompanied by:

- a translation of the international application into a language accepted by the Authority if the international application is not in such a language and the receiving Office has not yet forwarded a translation under PCT Rule 12.3 or 12.4; and/or
- a copy of any sequence listing in an acceptable electronic form if such a listing was not originally provided in the international application.

In accordance with PCT Rule 92.2(d), you must file the supplementary search request in English or French.

If your supplementary search request is received by the IB after the expiration of the applicable time limit, it will be considered not to have been submitted and there are no provisions for extending this time limit.

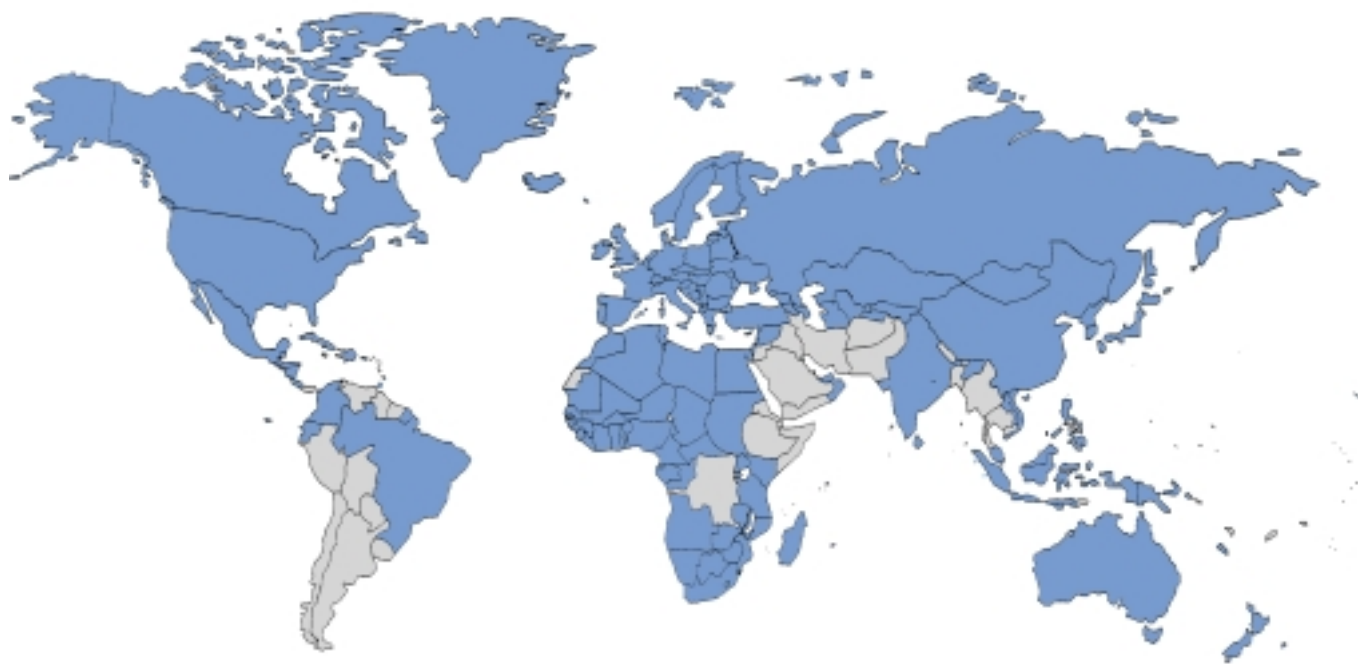
