- 1913-1989
 - Patents, trade marks, companies, etc registered@ AG's Office
 - No Utility model or industrial design law
- 1989: New independent Law- Industrial Property Act 509
 - Patents, Utility models and Industrial designs.
 - Kenya Industrial Property Office (KIPO) 1990
- 2001: New Law Industrial Property Act
 - TRIPs compliance
 - Kenya Industrial Property Institute (KIPI)
 - Mandate
 - Patents, Industrial Designs, Utility models
 - Trade marks Trade Marks Act of 1956

Utility model


- Innovations that give some utility, advantage, saving or technical effect not available in Kenya before.
- improvements that may not qualify for patent protection.



Utility model requirements

- Filing Requirements
- Similar to patent
 - Request (Form IP3)
 - Specification
 - Description of invention
 - Claims
 - Drawings (where necessary)



Utility model requirements

- Registration procedure
 - Application
 - Formality Examination
 - Publication
 - Registration
- Others
 - Novelty
 - Industrial Applicable
 - No inventive step requirement
 - No substantive examination since 2014



Utility model fees

- Filing fee Ksh. 1000 (± US\$ 10)
- Publication fee Ksh. $3000 (\pm US\$ 30)$
- Registration fee Ksh. $3000 (\pm US\$ 30)$
- Others

– Annual fees Ksh. 1000 (± US\$ 10)

Benefits of Protection

- Exclusive rights to the owner
 to make, use or sell invention in Kenya.
- legal action against another party who infringes the rights.
- Period of protection
 - 10 years
 - Annual fees

- Few applications from Universities



Fields

- Electrical devices
- Advertising/display structures
- Energy efficient cooking apparatus (e.g. biomass stoves)
- Mechanical devices e.g. pumps,
- Chemical preparation/treatment methods
- Food supplements/herbal compositions

Industrial designs

- Generally concern protection of special appearance of products (articles)
 - Shape/configuration
 - Pattern/ornamentation
- What makes an article attractive and appealing
- Adds to the commercial value of a product and increases its marketability





Application requirements

- **Request** (form IP27)
- Graphic representations of the article
 - Drawings or photographs
- Specimen of the article embodying the design
- one application for each design
 No multiple design application



fees

- Filing fee Ksh. 3000 (US\$ 30)
- Publication fee Ksh. 3000 (US\$ 30)
- Certificate fee Ksh. 1000 (US\$ 10)



Requirements for registration

- Design registrable if it is new (novel)
 - Universal novelty
 - Identical or similar design must not have been disclosed before the filing date
- Examination
- Publication in Journal
 - 60 days opposition period
- Registration



Rights conferred

- Right to prevent others from
 - Copying the design
 - Offering for sale articles embodying the design
- Period of protection
 - 5 years
 - renewable after 5 for up to 15 years
 - Note: 10 years under Harare Protocol




