Part I Introduction of DGIPR

- Directorate General of IPR (DGIPR) established in 1998 as a specialized organization for integrated IP management
- The organization placed under the Ministry of Law and Human Rights
- DGIPR (537) consist of Secretariat (111), Directorate for Copyright, ID, LDIC, Trade Secret (72 including 12 examiners), Directorate for Patent (134 including 72 examiners), Directorate for Trademark (148 including 45 examiners), Directorate for Cooperation & Development (36) & Directorate for Information Technology (36).
- As a regulator, DGIPR has several laws on IP: Copyright Act No.19, 2002; Patent Act No.14, 2001; Trademark Act No.15, 2001; Trade Secret Act No.30, 2000; Industrial Design Act No.31, 2000; Integrated Circuit Act No.32, 2000
- Assistance Fund is provided by the Government to operate the organization on modern and administers IP system by granting protection, promoting technology and encouraging an innovative








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NATIONAL & INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION IN IP TRAINING AND EDUCATION
