- 2008: Central Business Registry Establishment
 - Business Registration
 - Business License Issuing Authority
- 2012: Took over IP Registration from Commercial Court
- Became OSS (One-Stop-Shop) in 2013
- Laws Developed So far
 - Implemented/Enforced Laws
 - Trademark Registration
 - Resource Required for Implementation
 - Patent
 - Integrated Circuits
 - Industrial Designs
 - Geographical Indications

- IP Certificate Issued: 18743
- Avg # of Monthly Applications: approx. 560
- Allowed Multiple Class Under Single Application Until September 2017
- Current: Single Class Registration for New and Renewals
- Total Business License Issued Approx. 175000
