GENERAL STATEMENT 2024 - NORWAY - WIPO Assemblies, 65th Series of Meetings

The Norwegian Delegation wishes to express its satisfaction of seeing the Chair on the podium and wishes the best of luck in guiding this Assembly to a successful conclusion. We also welcome and congratulate the Vice-Chairs. We commend the Secretariat and Director General Daren Tang for their excellent preparatory work for these assemblies.

Norway maintains the importance of improving the Member States' ability to monitor the economy and administration of WIPO and welcomes the continued efforts and cooperation to this end.

The Norwegian delegation commends the International Bureau for its continued focus on securing the best available global services under the PCT, Madrid and Hague systems. At the event we highlighted how a responsible IP-strategy can be a key to a sustainable innovation.
