#### FINANCIAL REFORT FOR THE YEAR 1963

### Introduction

- 1. The Management Report of BIRFI for 1963 covers the management and financial position for the year 1963. This report has already been distributed to Member tates. For reasons of convenience, it is annexed to the present document and should be considered as an integral part of the present report.
- The present document is primarily intended to complete the information contained in the Management Report by giving additional details. It might be thought that the present document is too detailed, i.e., that it contains many details which are of no interest to Member States. One thing is certain, this document is far more detailed than those customarily prepared in comparable organizations. The fact that 1963 has been an exceptional year insofar as the financial management of BIRPI is concerned explains why all these details are given: new Financial Regulations have come into force and have been applied for the first time and accounts between the various Unions have been settled. The settlement has been made on the basis of views expressed by the Interunion Coordination Committee. The most complicated aspect of the new Financial Regulations, the allocation of expenditure common to several Unions, has also been carried out on the basis of the views of the Interunion Coordination Committee (and also of the appropriate bodies of the Madrid and The Hague Unions). It was naturally assumed that the Committee would wish to examine financial matters in detail, to see the extent to which these views were applicable in practice. In future years, the documents will be shorter and therefore easier to consult. Naturally, in future, all details of interest to the Committee will be available as for the year 1963.

- 3. In the light of the experience acquired during this first year in which they have been applied, the Director of BIRPI feels that the new Financial Regulations are satisfactory. In particular, he finds that the principles which at present govern the allocation of common expenditure are wise and can be applied in practice, but a lot of administrative work and accountancy are involved. Furthermore, and for the same reasons, it is now apparent that some of the time limits laid down by the Regulations are too short. No changes are proposed at this session, as the Director wishes to continue to observe the practical working of the new system for another year or two. Doubtless, he will have changes to propose at the end of this period.
- 4. There are four annexes to the present Document. The first three are as follows:

Annex I. Allocation Codes.

Annex II. Receipts and Contributions.

Annex III. Expenditure.

- 5. Annex IV is a Table concerning The Hague Union deficit.
- 6. Each Annex is commented upon below.

#### Allocation Codes

- 7. In accordance with the recommendations of the Financial Experts, contained in their Report (hereinafter called "Experts' Report") submitted to the first session of the Committee (see document CCIU/I/6), and the views expressed by the Committee and the meetings of the Madrid and The Hague Unions last year (see document CCIU/I/21, MI/DO/V/14 and DM/26/5), expenditure concerning several Unions was debited to the different Unions according to certain percentages (see the definition of "common expenditure" in the Experts' Report, para.8) also called "allocation codes".
- 8. The income from certain publications (mainly the reviews "La Fropriété industrielle" and "Industrial Property") is distributed according to the same allocation code as the printing costs of these publications.
- 9. In 1963, twelve different allocation codes were used: nine concern each one of the five Unions, two concern the four Industrial Unions only, whereas one concerns only the Madrid and Nice Unions.
- 10. Only one of these allocation codes is unchangeable: the "Director's Office" percentages were established in November 1963 by the Interunion Coordination Committee, the Committee of Directors of National Offices of Industrial Property (Madrid Union) and the Meeting of the Member States of The Hague Union (see document CCIV/I/21, para.20a).
- 11. The other allocation codes are based on the recommendations of the Financial Experts (Document CCIU/I/16) approved by the bodies mentioned in the previous paragraph (see document CCIU/I/21, para.19).
- 12. Details of the basis of each allocation code and the items of income or expenditure to which each one of these codes has been applied, are shown in the tables of Annex I.

## Receipts and Contributions

13. The tables in Annex II follow the budget headings of BIRPI. In addition there is an account of the interest credited to the Madrid Union and a Summary Table of Receipts and Contributions.

#### Expenditure

14. The tables of Annex III follow the budget headings of BIRPI. In 1963 there were two categories: expenditure for the year 1963 (headings 10 to 65) and expenditure in connection with the settlement of accounts (headings 66 to 68).

## The Hague Union Deficit

- 15. In 1963, The Hague Union deficit amounted to 20,643.55 francs. Following the decisions taken at the meeting of the Member States of The Hague Union last year (see document DM/26/5, para. 21 and document CCIU/I/8, para. 15(a)), this deficit was provisionally covered by an advance, free of interest, granted by the Swiss Government. Should it not be possible to reimburse this advance out of future profit of The Hague Union, the deficits will be borne by the Member States of The Hague Union, proportionally to the number of deposits coming from each one of these States. However, the number of deposits originating in countries not party to the Additional Act of Monaco (which raised some of the fees by 400%, others by 500%) will be multiplied by four or five (as the case may be) for the purposes of computing the apportionment (document CCIU/I/8, para. 15(a)).
- 16. Tables A in Annex IV show the theoretical loss in revenue proportional to the deposits and prolongations originating in countries not yet parties to the Act of Monaco, or in those two who ratified it in the course of 1963. If the following countries had ratified the Act of Monaco by 1 January, 1963, registration would have produced the following receipts, per country (or, altogether, approximately 90% of the deficit: 18,550 francs):

Each country ought, therefore, to be debited with these amounts, in accordance with the principles laid down by the Member States, as described above.

17. Table B of Annex IV shows the allocation of the balance (2,093.55 francs) of the deficit between all the Member States of The Hague Union, in proportion to the deposits and prolongations registered.

18. If the amounts shown on Tables A3 and B were added together, the Member States of the Agreement would be debited with the following sums:

In accordance with the Experts' recommendations (para. 16 d), one half of the salaries of the officials in this Service is allocated on the basis of a "Publishing Percentage" and the other half on the basis of a "Distribution Percentage".

The "Publishing Percentage" is 50% for the Berne Union, whilst the remaining 50% is to be shared according to the "Industrial Property" code of allocation.
