#### DRAFT PROGRAM AND BUDGET FOR 1966

- 1. This document contains the proposals of the Director of BIRPI concerning the program and budget of BIRPI for 1966.
- 2. The document comprises an Introduction and six Chapters. The Introduction contains a brief description of the main activities of BIRPI proposed for 1966 and some explanations regarding the different Chapters of the document. The six Chapters are entitled and subdivided as follows:

- 3. In Chapter I, following the description of each activity, the estimated expenditure is indicated for the following budget headings:
  - Printing : i.e., printers' invoices, paper, binding, etc.
  - Conferences: i.e., interpreters, translators, hiring of room and simultaneous interpretation equipment if the conference is held outside the Headquarters of BIRPI.
  - Missions : i.e., travelling expenses and subsistence allowances of BIRPI officials on official mission.
  - Delegates': i.e., travelling expenses and subsistence allowances paid to conference participants, other than BIRPI officials, e.g., Directors of national offices during Madrid Union meetings, trainees, participants in regional seminars, consultants, etc.
  - Contracts: i.e., fees to authors and translators of articles published in "Industrial Property" and "Copyright"; fees to translators and consultants, etc.

#### INTRODUCTION

- 4. The activities envisaged for BIRPI in 1966 are briefly presented in Chapter I. These may be grouped in a number of ways, including the following: preparation of the Stockholm Revision Conference of 1967; efforts to be made with a view to the propagation of the principles which BIRPI was designed to defend; increased services to Member States.
- 5. The purpose of the Stockholm Conference is to revise all the Conventions and Agreements administered by BIRPI: (a) the administrative structure of all these treaties would be revised and, according to present plans, an organization to be known as the International Intellectual Property Organization would be set up; (b) the Paris Convention would also be revised to include provisions on inventors' certificates ("certificates for authors of inventions"); (c) the Berne Convention would likewise be revised on a number of points concerning the very substance of copyright protection. The draft program and budget provides that the preparatory documents to be drawn up by the Swedish Government with the assistance of BIRPI - on the basis of the work of the Committees of Experts meeting in 1965 - will be printed and distributed to Member States in No further preparatory meeting for the Stockholm Conference is scheduled for 1966. However, if, in the light of subsequent events, it seemed desirable to hold further preparatory meetings in 1966, these meetings would be convened by the Director of BIRPI after consultation with the Swedish Government.
- 6. As to the propagation of the principles which BIRPI and the treaties it administers were designed to defend, the draft program and budget makes provision, in particular, for two regional seminars (or informatory meetings), the grant of several fellowships, and work in connection with model laws. An Asian industrial property seminar was scheduled for 1965, but, for reasons dependent on the wishes of the possible host country, it will not now take place until 1966. The funds seaside for this purpose in the 1965 budget will be transferred The funds set and used in 1966. In the field of copyright, a seminar will be held in Brazil; it will be organized jointly, and financed on an equal basis, by BIRPI and UNESCO. The success of the training facilities offered in 1964 justifies the grant of further fellowships in 1966. With regard to model laws, the draft program and budget provides for the preparation of a model law for the protection of trademarks and service marks, and the adaptation for English-speaking countries of the BIRPI/ UNESCO African Model Copyright Law of 1964.

- 7. It stands to reason that the activities referred to above - in particular, the Stockholm Conference, the regional seminars and model laws - also serve the interests of the Governments of Member States. In addition, the draft program and budget makes provision for certain activities of special interest to the industrial property offices of Member States of These are concerned primarily with the pursuit of the studies regarding the possibility of establishing two services; one permitting the identification of patents relating to the same invention, and the other permitting the search for identical or similar marks ("trademark research centre"). The establishment of these services, and even the study of the possibility of setting them up, might require to be financed from funds not provided by the Governments of Member States. The Director of BIRPI therefore invites the Interunion Coordination Committee to indicate whether it would object to BIRPI's accepting such At all events, if these plans made substantial progress in 1966, Member States concerned would be specially consulted on the question of their being financed by these States. draft program and budget makes provision for a meeting in 1966 of the Committee of countries practising prior examination. The Committee will deal with these questions and others, including possibly the questions of the protection of computer programs and of the deferred examination of applications for patents.
- 8. No provision has been made in the budget for the Convention for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants, as the possibility of administering this Convention within the framework of BIRPI has not yet been settled. However, talks on this subject will be pursued in 1966 between the Governments concerned including that of Switzerland as Supervisory Authority and BIRPI.
- 9. Apart from these special tasks, BIRPI will of course continue to deal with its permanent tasks: publications, registration services, etc. These tasks and their repercussions on the budget are also mentioned under Chapter I.
- 10. Chapter II contains estimates for certain items of general expenditure: personnel, construction costs of the Building, cost of the upkeep of the Building, furniture, office material, postage, telephone, library and unforeseen expenditure.
- 11. As far as some staff matters and questions of salaries are concerned, it is possible that further documents will be distributed before or at the beginning of the next session of the Interunion Coordination Committee.

- 12. As regards the Conference Room of BIRPI, it was decided in 1963 that the costs of improvement estimated at 360,000 francs at that time would be financed by a loan granted to BIRPI by the BIRPI Pension Fund, and that this loan would be reimbursed along the lines described in document CCIU/I/14 Add. 1. It now seems that the costs of this work will be approximately 30% higher than had been estimated two years ago. Up to about 300,000 francsofthe total expense will be covered by the amounts set aside for this purpose (income from the rental of premises by EFTA). It is therefore only the balance that would have to be covered by a loan from the Pension Fund.
- 13. Chapter III contains summary tables of budget headings made up of several items. These headings are the following: printing, contracts, missions, conferences, delegates' travel.
- 14. Chapter IV, entitled "General Table of Expenditure", is a summary of expenditure according to budget headings.
- 15. Chapter V consists of a table of the receipts estimated for 1966. The receipts of the Registration Services (Madrid and The Hague Unions) are liable to considerable fluctuation, depending to a large extent on the economic situation of the countries of origin of the marks filed and the designs deposited. The contributions of Member States for the Paris and Berne Unions are worked out below the theoretical ceilings (860,000 Swiss francs instead of 900,000 Swiss francs for the Paris Union, and 600,000 Swiss francs instead of 700,000 Swiss francs for the Berne Union), in view of the fact that some States have not yet accepted the respective ceilings of 900,000 and 700,000 Swiss francs, and that they will therefore be contributing on the basis of lower ceilings.
- 16. Chapter VI consists of a summary table of expenditure and income. It emerges from this table that the budget of the Nice Union will be balanced but that, in the case of all the other Unions, income for 1966 will remain below expenditure estimated for the same year. The following differences have been estimated: Paris Union, 35,100 Swiss francs; Madrid Union, 180,100 Swiss francs; The Hague Union, 49,200 Swiss francs; Berne Union, 129,100 Swiss francs.
- 17. The deficits of the Paris and Madrid Unions will be covered by these two Unions' reserve funds (on January 1, 1965, 337,000 Swiss francs for the Paris Union, and 1,420,000 Swiss francs for the Madrid Union). These deficits are therefore amply covered. They show, however, that as far as the Paris Union is concerned, a decision will be necessary regarding an

increase, no later than at the time of the Stockholm Conference in 1967, and that, as far as the Madrid Union is concerned, the financial situation will have to be reconsidered in the light of the new registration fees which will come into force, on December 15, 1966, by virtue of the Nice text of the Madrid Agreement.

- 18. The Hague Union's deficit (estimated at 49,200 Swiss francs) will be provisionally covered by an advance, without interest, granted by the Swiss Government (see the decision of the Member States of the Hague Union, of November 29, 1963, document MJ/DO/V/13, DM/26/4, page 10). The Hague Union's deficit was 21,000 Swiss francs in 1963 and 23,000 Swiss francs in 1964. The financial year 1965 will probably also result in a deficit, which will possibly be in the vicinity of 30,000 Swiss francs. It would appear, therefore, that the increases in the registration fees quoted in 1960 in the Additional Act of Monaco are inadequate and that it will be necessary to revise them during the Stockholm Conference in 1967, or shortly afterwards.
- 19. The deficit of the Berne Union (estimated at approximately 129,100 Swiss francs) will be covered by a transfer of funds from the financial year 1965. The new ceiling (700,000 Swiss francs instead of 400,000 Swiss francs) comes into force with retroactive effect from January 1, 1965. However, as the Supervisory Authority's consultation of Member States of the Berne Union on the subject of this increase was not completed until about the middle of 1965 that is to say, at a time when it was too late to incur all the expenditure scheduled for 1965 the year 1965 will result in a surplus, making this transfer possible.
- 20. Chapters IV, V and VI also contain the figures of the budget for 1965, to facilitate comparisons with 1966.
  - 21. The Interunion Coordination Committee is invited to express an opinion on the subject of the program and budget of BIRPI for 1966 and also on the other questions dealt with in this document.
