Opening of the Session

1. The Conference of Representatives of the Nice Union (hereinafter called "the Conference") held its first ordinary session at Geneva from September 21 to 28, 1970.
2. The following States, members of the Conference at the opening of the session, were represented: Australia, Austria, Lebanon, Monaco, Poland, Tunisia (6).
3. The States and organizations which were represented by observers are shown in the list of participants (document AB/I/INF/2.Rev.).
4. The session was opened by Mr. Edward Armitage (United Kingdom), Chairman of the Ad Hoc Committee of the Whole (see document AB/I/32, paragraph 5), acting as provisional Chairman of the Conference.
