A. AMENDMENTSTOTHESTAFFREGULATIONSPROVISIONALLY DECREEDANDAPPLIEDUNDERSTAFFREGULATION12.1

<u>ScaleofpensionableremunerationfortheProfessionalandhighercategories</u>
- <u>Regulation 3.15</u>

- 1. EffectiveNovember1,2002,thepostadjustmentmultiplier inNewYorkhasbeen changed,resultinginanincreaseof3.75percent(roundedfigure)inthenetremunerationof staffintheProfessionalandhighercategoriesinthatcity.Asaconsequence,andin accordancewiththeprovisionofArticle54(b)ofthe RegulationsoftheUnitedNationsJoint StaffPensionFund(UNJSPF),thescaleofpensionableremunerationfortheabove mentionedcategorieswasadjustedwitheffectfromNovember 1, 2002,bythesame percentageasthenetremunerationincrease.
- 2. PursuanttoStaffRegulation12.1(a),correspondingnewscalesunderStaff Regulation 3.1havebeenprovisionallydecreedandappliedwitheffectfrom November 1, 2003.
- 3. Furthermore,theGeneralAssemblyoftheUnitedNationsapproved,byitsresolutions nos. 57/285(SectionII.A)ofDecember 20, 2002,and57/310ofJune 18,2003,adifferentiated grade-by gradeincreaseofthebase/floorsalaryscaleinordertoaddressthelowlevelofthe marginattheuppergradesofthesalaryscaleand,thus,bringingthe gradesP -4andhigherup tothemarginlevelof111andtheoverallmarginto112.2,effectiveJanuary1,2003.This resultsinanincreaseofthenetsalariesof1.3percentatgrade P-4,2.6percentatgradeP -5, 9.1percentatgradeD -1and6.3per centatgradesD -2andhigher.ThegradesP -1toP -3are alreadyatmargin115("mid -point")orabove.
- 4. Asaconsequence, and in accordance with the provision of Article 54(b) of the Regulations of the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund (UNJSPF), the scales of pensionable remuneration for the above -mentioned grades and categories have been further adjusted by the same percentage as the net remuneration increases, effective from the same date.
- 5. PursuanttoStaffRegulation12.1(a),corresponding newscalesunderStaff Regulation 3.1havebeenprovisionallydecreedandappliedwitheffectfrom January 1, 2003.
- 6. Therevised scales of netand gross salaries and of pensionable remuneration for the Professional and higher categories applied with effective from January 1, 2003, are included in Staff Regulation 3.1 (Salary scales for Professional and higher categories) and are reproduced in Annex I.

- 7. Followingthe ICSC's(InternationalCivilServiceCommission)surveyofbest prevailingconditionsofemploymentatGenevain2002,theCommissionapprovedatits55 sessioninNewYorkinJuly2002 *one*consolidatedsalaryscale,effectiveJanuary1,2002, representinganincreaseof1.93percentweightedaverageoverthetwoprevioussalaryscales inforceatthattime .

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- 8. PursuanttoStaffRegulation12.1(a),correspondingnewscalesunderStaff Regulation 3.1havebeenprovisionallydecreedandappliedwitheff ectfrom January 1, 2002.
- 9. Furthermoreandinaccordancewiththeexistinginterimadjustmentmethodology, the netsalaries of staffmembers in the General Service category in Geneva were adjusted, effective January 1, 2003, on the basis of the movement of the Geneva consumer price index over a period of 12 months from October 2001 to October 2002. The revised salaries representances the-board increase of 1.16 percent.
- 10. Thenewgrosspensionablesalariesarestilllowerthanthoseineffecton
 January 1, 1994. Thus, the former grosspensionablesalaries have been retained for staff
 members appointed prior to October 1, 1995, until the amounts are overtaken as a result of subsequent revisions of the relevant salary scales.
- 11. Pursuant toStaffRegulation12.1(a),correspondingnewscalesunderStaff Regulation 3.1havebeenprovisionallydecreedandappliedwitheffectfrom January 1, 2003.
- 12. Therevised scales of net and gross salaries and of pensionable remuneration for the General Service category applied with effect from January 1, 2003, are included in Staff Regulation 3.1 (Salary scales for General Service category) are reproduced in Annex II.

EffectiveAugust 1, 2002 –incaseswherethereisnodependentspouse —therevised allowancepayableinrespectofadependentparent,adependentbrotheroradependentsister shallbe1,174Swissfrancsperannum;theamountof1,452Swissfrancsperannumwill remainapplicabletostaffmembersintheGeneralServicecategoryinGenevaappointedand inreceiptoftheallowancepriortoJanuary 1, 1994,andtheamountof1,308Swissfrancswill remainapplicabletoentitlementsestablishedbetweenJanuary 1, 1994,and July 31, 2002.

Compensation for Overtime for Staff Members in the General Service Category

- (a) StaffmembersintheGeneralServicecategorywhohavebeenrequiredto workovertimeshall,asfaraspossible,begivencompensatoryleave.Suchleave shallbegrantedaspromptlyasthe exigenciesoftheservicepermitandinanyevent notlaterthansixmonthsaftertheovertimeisworked.Ifthesuperiorresponsible forthestaffmemberconcernedcertifiesthat,owingtoexceptionalcircumstances, theexigenciesoftheservicedonotp ermitthegrantofcompensatoryleavewithin theprescribedperiodofsixmonths,theovertimeshallbecompensatedincash. Thestaffmembermay,however,choosetobecompensatedincashafteraperiodof twomonthsifthesuperiorresponsibleforhimc ertifiesthattheexigenciesofthe servicehavenotpermittedthegrantofcompensatoryleavewithinthatperiod.
- (b) Theduration of compensatory leaves hall be equal to time and a half for ordinary over time and to double time for special over time . Compensation in cash shall be paid at the rate of one and a half times the hourly salary of the middle step of the staff member's grade for each hour of ordinary over time, and twice that salary for each hour of special over time.
- (c) Inthecalculation of daily overtime, periods of less than 15 minutes shall be disregarded. The total overtime shall be calculated each week in hours and half hours, periods of less than 30 minutes being disregarded.

CompensationforOvertimeforStaffMember sintheGeneralServiceCategory

- StaffmembersintheGeneralServicecategorywhohavebeenrequiredto workovertimeshall, as far as possible, be given compensatory leave. Such leave shallbegrantedaspromptlyastheexigenciesoftheservice permitandinanyevent notlaterthansixmonthsaftertheovertimeisworked. If the superior responsible forthestaffmemberconcernedcertifiesthat,owingtoexceptionalcircumstances, theexigencies of the serviced on other mitthe grant of compens atorvleavewithin theprescribed period of six months, the overtimes hall be compensated in cash. The staffmembermay, however, choose to be compensated in cash after a period of twomonthsifthesuperiorresponsibleforhimcertifiesthattheexigenci esofthe servicehavenotpermittedthegrantofcompensatoryleavewithinthatperiod. The partofovertimeworkedwhichexceeds 100 hourswithinthecalendarvearin accordancewithspecialauthorizationprocedurestobefixedbytheDirector Generali nanOfficeInstructionshallalwaysbegivenascompensatoryleaveand mustbetakenwithintheprescribedperiodofsixmonths.
