IPA calls for all Member States to ratify and implement the Marrakech Treaty

Getting it right



- 1. The Marrakech Treaty will not resolve the book famine
- 2. If badly implemented it might make the solution more difficult
- 3. If well implemented it can accellerate broader accessibility

Resolving the book famine



- 1. Quantity
 - 1-5m books a year being published Only a fraction are being adapted
- 2. Retrodigitisation is slow and costly
- 3. VIP customers want
 - Local content
 - Recent content
- 4. The supply chain for VIPs is changing
- 5. Ebooks are changing everything

Problem with relying only on MVT



- 1. Book Supply
 - Languages
 - Domestic works covered by MVT
- 2. Book demand
 - Local content
 - Recent content
- 3. Old Solution
 - Slow
 - Expensive
 - Low quality

Modern Solutions



How accessible books are being obtained

- 1. Inclusive Publishing
- 2. Publisher provision of content
- 3. Publisher VIP Library collaboration
- 4. VIP retrodigitisaion as last resort

Key demands for implementation



- 1. Clear specific exception
- 2. Commercial availability
- 3. Remuneration
- 4. Authorised entity
 Equal treatment
 Encourage collaboration
- 5. No translation right
- 6. Make this part of a bigger accessibility strategy

 - Collaborative
