Since its foundation, the Unión de Mujeres Aymaras del Abya Yala Perú (UMA, Union of Aymara Women of Abya Yala Peru) has worked to foster the active participation of women in the community. The key thematic planks of its work are intercultural communication; the involvement of Indigenous Aymara women in political life; the promotion and defense of Indigenous women's rights; environmental protection; the strengthening of organizations; the fostering of good living standards; economic activities, including tourism and handicrafts with cultural identity; and fostering recognition of the richness of ancestral knowledge. UMA is a community-oriented organization, but each of its members has a particular role to play in conducting our activities and in establishing the work plan, which we set at the start of each year.

UMA has three teams, dedicated each to field work, administration (office) and production. Team members work *pro bono*, which we see as one of our organization's core strengths.

Main aims and objectives of the Organization:

- UMA strives to bring together Indigenous women's organizations from across the southern Andean region of Peru.
- UMA works to foster consultation with and the involvement of Indigenous women.
- UMA works in defense of the rights of Indigenous Peoples and Indigenous women.
- UMA strives to ensure that Indigenous Peoples' traditional knowledge is respected and nurtured.
- UMA publicizes its own activities and others that take place at the international level through modern media and via analogical radio broadcasts.

- The Union's radio program, WIñay Panqara ("ever flourishing" in the Aymara language), has been on the air for more than 36 years.
- UMA holds annual workshops to train communications specialists.
- UMA runs literacy courses, teaching students how to read and write in Aymara.
- UMA holds its Pachamama ("mother earth") Song and Poetry Contests as a way of recalling the importance of nurturing our habitat and our genetic resources.

<u>Relationship of the Organization with intellectual property matters, including a full explanation</u> of why you are interested in the issues under discussion by the Committee (maximum 150 words)

UMA believes that the intellectual property (IP), traditional knowledge and genetic resources of Indigenous Peoples are significant for the great wisdom they transmit, and that they are therefore invaluable for humanity.

It is important that our peoples be the custodians of their own intellectual resources. Our language and world view, therefore, should also be seen as IP, worthy of preservation and available, if necessary, for exclusive use by its owners. For that reason, a proper and honest registry of Indigenous People's traditional knowledge is needed in order to ensure respect for their IP rights as a community and avoiding their attribution to any one individual.
