# A Report

# Introduction

From April 14 – 16, 2021, the WIPO Nigeria Office hosted the 15 winners of the 2020 WIPO National IP Essay Competition in Abuja, on an Intellectual Property Study Tour. The tour was designed to expose the participants to the practical aspects of the administration of intellectual property (IP) in Nigeria, as well as afford them an opportunity to engage directly with the faces and institutions behind IP administration in Nigeria, thereby contributing to the efforts of the WNO to build capacity and create further awareness in the area of IP amongst students of tertiary institutions.

## Background

On April 26, 2020, as part of efforts to mark the World IP Day 2020, the WIPO Nigeria Office launched the maiden edition of the WIPO National IP Essay Competition for students of all tertiary institutions in Nigeria, who were invited to submit essays of no more than 1500 words on the topic, *"Making Innovation work for a Green Future in Nigeria"*. Out of a total of 262 entries received for the competition, and from a pool of 30 finalists, 15 winners emerged.

As part of their prizes, all the winners (and finalists) were offered WIPO Academy scholarships to undertake any WIPO distance learning course of their choosing, IP internship/fellowship opportunities, certificates of achievement, and an opportunity to participate in a WIPO organized IP study tour. Additionally, the overall competition winner, Ms. Susan Chioma Omeh, received a WIPO scholarship to participate in the blended Advanced International Course on IP Asset Management organized by the Korean IP Office (KIPO), while the first and second runners up, received scholarships to attend the WIPO Summer School in South Africa.

This is a summary of the IP study tour.

# The IP Study Tour

Delivering on its commitment to the winners of the essay competition, the IP Study Tour was designed by the WNO to incorporate learning elements in intellectual property which prioritized engagement with major stakeholders involved in the administration of IP in Nigeria. At least three major benefits for the winners formed the objective for this activity:

- An opportunity to witness the practical aspects of IP administration in Nigeria, including some of the key challenges, which would serve to enhance their capacity to research and identify useful options that could support the growth of the Nigerian IP administrative system.
- An opportunity for winners to learn more about WIPO, and indeed, the available learning opportunities and resources for students and their development in the area of IP from WIPO.
- 3. An opportunity for the winners to receive practical professional mentoring towards possible careers in the field of IP and innovation.

A total of eight substantive learning sessions were covered over the course of the three days, incorporating mentoring, lectures, and institutional study visits. These sessions are summarized below.

# Session One (April 14, 2021) An Introduction to Intellectual Property:

The participants were provided with an introductory exposition to the field of IP by Ms. Victoria Onyeagbako, an intern with the WIPO Nigeria Office. This exciting introductory session covered topics, such as, definitions of IP, justifications for IP, theories of IP and an overview of various types of IP rights.

## Session Two (April 14, 2021) Intellectual Property in Practice:

A mentoring session on "IP in Practice" followed. This session was designed as an interactive learning session with practicing IP experts on various aspects of IP practice in Nigeria. The discussion covered topics such as IP trends in Nigeria, tips on commencing IP practice, amongst others. The panel included, Mr. O. M. Atoyebi, SAN, Managing Partner, *Omaplex Law Firm*, ably represented by the firm's Head of IP practice, Mr. Ibrahim Wali, Mr. Davidson Oturu – Partner, *Aelex Law Firm* and Ms. Tolu Olaloye – Senior Associate, *Jackson, Etti & Edu*.

## Session Three (April 14, 2021) Copyright Administration in Nigeria:

The students were warmly received by the Director General, Nigerian Copyright Commission (NCC), Mr. John Asein as well as the management team of the Commission at the offices of the NCC Headquarters in Abuja. After a brief ceremony, which included an investiture of the 15 winners as Copyright Ambassadors in Nigeria<sup>2</sup> towards propagating IP knowledge in their institutions and the larger world, the Director of the Nigerian Copyright Institute, Mr. Mike Akpan, made a formal presentation and responded to the students' questions on the Administration of Copyright in Nigeria. The NCC also pledged to support the first book publication of any of the 15

winners. Members of the press, including the National Television Authority (NTA), were present to cover this story and interact with winners.

## Session Four (April 15, 2021) Intellectual Property and Traditional Knowledge:

Oluwatobiloba Moody, Counsellor with the WIPO Nigeria Office, provided an introduction to traditional knowledge and intellectual property. He explained the concepts, the relationship between TK and IP, some relevant ongoing developments at WIPO, as well as some key challenges to protecting TK through the IP system.

## Session Five (April 15, 2021) Trademarks, Patents and Designs Administration in Nigeria

The students were warmly welcomed by Ms. Stella Ezenduka (Registrar, Patents and Designs), and Ms. Anne Adeleye (Acting Registrar, Trademarks). Ms. Jane Igwe (Asst. Chief Registrar, Patent and Designs) provided an introduction to Patents and Designs, while Ms. Adeleye alongside some staff of the Trademarks Registry provided an overview of trademark administration in Nigeria. The presentations were followed by an interactive Q & A session.

## Session Six (April 15, 2021) Meeting with the Minister of Foreign Affairs

The students were warmly received at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs by the Hon. Minister of Foreign Affairs, H.E. Geoffery Onyeama. At the roundtable discussion with the Minister, the students shared their experiences from the essay competition, and proffered possible policy suggestions on areas which caught their attention over the tour as well as in the context of their essays. In preparing for this session, the students worked independently and, indeed, developed their ideas and suggestions based on their internal deliberations. The four key recommendations raised by the students that formed the basis of their interactions were:

- Possible reforms in the patent administration system in Nigeria to inculcate a more substantive as opposed to largely formal search of patent applications.

- Potential for introduction of *pre grant* opposition mechanism in Nigeria's patent system to encourage public participation in Nigeria's innovation landscape and further prevent the production of harmful inventions.
- A ratification and domestication of relevant international treaties to aid Nigeria's national legal and policy frameworks on IP.
- A need for stipulated times where works which fall into the public domain are announced.

The Hon. Minister engaged with the students on all the points raised, sharing experiences, lessons, and highlighting the pros and cons, as well as some challenges and prospects of the suggestions raised.

# Session Seven (April 16, 2021) Entrepreneurial Mentoring and Innovation Leadership:

The mentoring session was facilitated by Dr. Obichi Obiajunwa, an Innovation Expert and global health Strategist, as well as the Founder of the *Young Innovation Leaders Fellowship*. Practical situation challenges, results and possible career choices in the innovation field were shared with participants.

# Session Eight (April 16, 2021) IP Commercialization in Nigeria:

The students were warmly received by the Director General, NOTAP, Dr. Dan- Azumi Muhammed, as well as members of the management team. The DG discussed NOTAP (its mission, vision and activities) as one of the 17 parastatals of the Federal Ministry of Science and Technology. He further explained the process and the role of NOTAP in terms of IP commercialization in Nigeria. He also highlighted some key challenges as well as some of the initiatives of NOTAP to address these, encouraging the winners to accept responsibility for the development of Nigeria.

# Session Nine (April 16, 2021) Closing Open Session

The Tour came to an end with a closing session facilitated by the WIPO Nigeria Office. In this session, the learning objectives were revisited and the students were exposed to lessons about WIPO. It was also an opportunity for the students to highlight their feedback from the tour.

## Informal outings:

During the course of the tour, the students were hosted to an African-themed networking dinner by the WIPO Nigeria Office on Thursday, April 15, 2021. In addition, the NCC organized an

informal reception to host the winners as Copyright Ambassadors and discuss further the roles and expectations of their new assignments on Friday, April 16, 2021.

#### Logistics

The tour was organized in full compliance with the COVID-19 protocols, as well as with close coordination with the UN Department for Safety and Security (UNDSS) as well as the UN Clinic. The students were lodged throughout their stay at a UN approved hotel – the Royalton Hotel and were provided with secure transportation for their movements across the city. As financed participants, they were also provided the regular DSA for funded participants to support their accommodation and boarding while in Abuja.

Upon their departure, the students received WIPO packages which included learning materials from the WNO library as well as some WIPO souvenirs.
