UDRP arbitration

- On the papers
- Geographic spread of panellists
- Complainants, registrars and panellists have now become very conversant and comfortable with the processes & procedures



Physical materials handling logistics

- Not eco friendly
- Time consuming
- Expensive



RBITRATION

Email

- All communications with panellists and parties is by email
- Scanning is now widely available and inexpensive
- Bandwidth has increased
- Mailbox quota sizes and attachment limits have increased



Portable Document Format (PDF)

- Adobe proprietary format but now publicly available
- Freeware available such as PDF995 makes conversion as simple as printing to pseudo printer
- Office 2007 includes 'Save As PDF' as built-in function



Signatures

- Options range from physical signing on paper to signing with a digital certificate
- Signing is an action rather than an image; any act which signifies adoption/assent/authentication with appropriate context
- Plaintext signature can be sufficient
