The UDRP Legal Structure

- Policy and Rules Promulgated by ICANN
 - Rendered Effective by Registration Contract
- No Legally Binding Substantive Law
 - ▶ Rules state "Panel shall decide a complaint . . . in accordance with the Policy, these Rules and any rules and principles of law that it deems applicable"
 - Policy provides general principles and non-exclusive examples for legitimate interest and bad faith factors
 - WIPO Report provides information on drafters' intent
- No Mechanism for Resolving Conflicts Amongst Panels
 - No appellate panel or authority
 - ▶ No revisions by ICANN to Policy or Rules
 - Decisions can be challenged in national courts
 - Decisions published, which helps support consensus




Benefits of the Consensus System

- Provides Predictability to the Parties
- Avoids Panelist and Forum Shopping
 - ADR Provider Can Neutrally Appoint Panelists
- Encourages Efficiency
 - ▶ Facilitates Use of Single-Member Panels
 - Panels Can Benefit From Decisions of Other Panels
- Allows Flexibility for UDRP to Evolve to Address:
 - Specific Practices Not Listed in Policy's Examples
 - Developments in Business Practices
 - Changes in Technology
 - Differences in National Laws
- In General, Promotes Stability and Legitimacy of UDRP




Evolution: Automated Domain Name Registration



4.1 What deference should be owed to past UDRP decisions dealing with similar factual matters and legal issues?

Consensus view: The UDRP does not operate on a strict doctrine of precedent. However panels consider it desirable that their decisions are consistent with prior panel decisions dealing with similar fact situations. This ensures that the UDRP system operates in a fair, effective and predictable manner for all parties.
