


Distribution of cases per year in .CH

Since 2004, WIPO has administered 493 .CH cases






Nationalities .CH Claimants 2004-2020




Nationalities .CH Respondents 2004-2020



- Rules of Procedure for Dispute Resolution Procedures for .ch and .li domain names
 - Available at SWITCH
 - https://www.nic.ch/terms/disputes/rules_of_procedure/
- Effective as of January 1, 2020 (Version 2.0)
- 100 % electronic procedure
 - The parties do not have to send their pleadings in hard copies
 - Greater efficiency
 - Reduced costs



Similarities with the UDRP

- Contract based and electronic procedure
- Quick and reasonable costs
- Model Complaint for UDRP and model Request for .CH
- Remedies
- ■.CH Decisions implemented by the Registry



Main differences compared to the UDRP

- Scope of protection
- The allocation or use of the domain name constitutes a clear infringement of a Right in a distinctive sign which the Claimant owns under the law of Switzerland
- Conciliation
- Language
- List of .CH Conciliators / Experts
- Mutual Jurisdiction (Zurich)



Conciliation

- Respondent should indicate its readiness to participate in a Conciliation procedure
- Mandatory for the Claimant
- Appointment of a Conciliator
- Telephone conference (one hour)
- Conducted by a WIPO appointed conciliator



First element: Rights covered

- Claimant has a Right in a distinctive sign under the law of Switzerland
 - Any right recognized by the legal system
 - registration or use of a sign
 - the right in a registered business name
 - a personal name
 - a trade mark
 - a geographical indication and
 - the defensive rights devolving from the law on unfair competition.



and Mediation

Second element

- The allocation and/or use of the Domain Name at issue constitutes a clear infringement of a Right in a distinctive sign which the Claimant owns under the law of Switzerland
- In particular, a clear infringement of an intellectual property right exists when:
 - both the existence and the infringement of the claimed Right in a distinctive sign clearly result from the wording of the law or from an acknowledged interpretation of the law and from the presented facts and are proven by the evidence submitted; and
 - the Respondent has not conclusively pleaded and proven any relevant grounds for defence

Remedies

■ Similar to the UDRP, remedies available are:

- **■** transfer
- revocation [cancellation]
- No monetary damages



Filing Fees

- Depends on the procedure
 - ■1 conciliator 600 CHF
 - ■1 conciliator and 1 Expert 2,600 CHF

Conciliation	Fee (Swiss Francs)
Conciliation	600 [Conciliator: 300; Center: 300]

Expert's decision	Fee (Swiss Francs)
1 to 5 Domain Names	CHF 2000 (Expert: 1300; Center: 700)
6 to 10 Domain Names	CHF 2500 (Expert: 1600; Center: 900)
More than 10 Domain Names	To be determined by the Center

Main benefits of the .CH Rules of Procedure

- Time-effective procedure (2 months)
- Conciliation
- Cost-effective procedure
- Online procedure (WIPO model pleadings available for parties)
- Decision implemented by SWITCH directly
