






Single Complainant




Single Complainant: Single Domain Name






Single Complainant: Multiple Domain Names

- Facts
 - ▶ 9 Complainants
 - not related, ownership-wise
 - ▶ 66 domain names
 - common feature: phonewords
 - ▶ 1 Respondent
 - registered domain names at different times, over a 2year period

Decision

- may have multiple Cs to a Complaint, but only where:
 - Cs have common grievance against R, and
 - it is equitable and procedurally efficient to permit Cs to consolidate their complaints against R




Common Grievance

- Cs will have a common grievance against R where:
 - Cs have a common legal interest in TM or
 - Cs are the target of common conduct by R
