Re: WIPO SCIT Circular 2542 – PCT Minimum Documentation –List of Periodicals

Dear Ms. Frary:

The United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) concurs with the proposal to add the journal "Research Disclosure" and its electronic version, "Research Disclosure Electronic", to the PCT Minimum Documentation List. The print version of "Research Disclosure" has been part of the USPTO Scientific and Technical Information Center's collections since 1972. However, electronic access to "Research Disclosure" is critical if the publication is to be truly useful in patent searching. Until recently, "Research Disclosure" was included in Derwent's World Patent Index. Discontinuation of electronic access through Derwent makes publisher provided electronic access to the content of "Research Disclosure" extremely important. We request additional information concerning the timetable under which "Research Disclosure Electronic" will be available to IP offices.

Furthermore, the USPTO believes it is appropriate to replace the IBM Technical Disclosure Bulletin (IBM TDB) as part of the PCT Minimum Documentation List (PCT No. 063) with the "Research Disclosure" journal, ISSN 0374-4353 (current paper and planned electronic versions). The January 1998 issue of the IBM TDB was the final issue published by IBM Corporation (see the IBM TDB web site <u>http://www.ibm.com/ibm/licensing/ibm_tdb/</u>). The IBM TDB web site indicates the IBM TDBs published after February 1998 are available for a fee through "Research Disclosure".

The USPTO also concurs with the proposal to remove the journal Funkschau from the PCT Minimum Documentation List.
