Dear Sir/Madam,

I hope this message finds you well. Following the request pursuant to the 32nd session of the SCP, I am writing this message to inform that Israel has additional information for item 7 of the subject: Exceptions and Limitations, under "Certain aspects of the applicable national or regional patent law", to be found here: <u>https://www.wipo.int/scp/en/annex_ii.html</u> The additions are underlined.

(1) Exceptions and Limitations of the Rights

- 1. Non- commercial acts <u>("any act not performed on a commercial scale and is not commercial in character"</u>).
- 2. <u>any experimental act in connection with the invention, the objective of which is to improve the invention or to develop another invention.</u>
- 3. Experimental acts for obtaining a marketing license after patent expiration <u>as set forth</u> in <u>Section 54A of The Patents Law.</u>

"54A. Experimental act in order to obtain license

An experimental act, which is part of an effort to obtain a license to market the product after the patent has lapsed, does not constitute "exploitation of an invention", if the

following two conditions are met:

- (1) the effort to obtain a license is made in order to obtain a license in Israel or in a country, in which an experimental act on a patent protected invention for the purpose of obtaining a license is permitted before the patent lapses;
- (2) any product produced under the terms of this section is not used both while the patent is in effect or thereafter for any purpose other than obtaining a license as aforesaid;

for purposes of this section, "license" – certification, permit or any other document required under Law in order to market the product."

- 4. Continued prior use by a person who, in good faith at the filing date (priority date), exploited the invention in Israel, or had made actual preparations for that purpose.
- 5. Exploitation, authorized by the minister, by a Government departments or State contractor in the interests of national security or maintenance of essential supplies and services, subject to remuneration.
- 6. Compulsory licenses.
