## FICPI Position on Access to Search, Classification and Examination Tools Developed by IP Offices

## Intervention at SCP/33, 6 to 9 December 2021

**FICPI** recognizes that using high-quality search tools by applicants and third parties leads to better quality patent applications and granted patents.

The high cost of commercially provided searches and commercially provided automated tools makes such searches and tools generally inaccessible to many users of the IP system, including individual inventors and SMEs.

Several IP Offices are developing automated tools to enhance searching, classification, and examination using e.g. machine learning, natural language processing, image recognition and other artificial intelligence -type technologies.

IP Offices have a general obligation to improve access to the IP systems by all users, particularly as mentioned earlier, individual inventors and SMEs.

In view of the foregoing, we find that IP Offices, applicants and third parties would all benefit, if more applications were prepared and filed with the assistance of high-quality automated tools. This also applies to third party oppositions. Thus, IP Offices should make their automated tools available to all users of the patent systems at no cost.
