## FICPI Position on Confidentiality of Communications between Clients and their Patent Advisors

## Intervention at SCP/33, 6 to 9 December 2021

**FICPI** wishes to emphasize that clients are the beneficiaries of the protection of confidential communications between clients and their patent advisors. The advisors are simply conveyors of advice.

The proper and effective use of the IP system and the administration of justice requires complete transparency between a client and advisor. When clients can give full and frank information, advisors can give full and frank advice.

This makes the litigation process more efficient. Parties understand the risks involved in enforcing or defending their rights, or in engaging in potentially infringing activity.

Strategy may be streamlined, cases may be settled, or not commenced at all. This leads to an efficient use of the IP system and of court resources.

In the global economy of today, countries without laws preventing forcible disclosure of confidential IP advice clearly disadvantage their own citizens, particularly in cross-border disputes.

Very often, the importance of IP assets lies in other countries than the IP proprietor's own country.

Given the risks, if cross-border protection is not in place, then it is likely that the owners of intellectual property rights, risking the loss of protection, would no longer invest in and trade with the affected nations nor decide to enforce their IPRs in such nations.
