Unavailability of the ePCT System

In accordance with PCT Rule 82*quater*.2(a), the International Bureau (IB) informs PCT users of the unavailability of the ePCT system during the following period:

19 October 2022, from 2:30 a.m. to 6:25 a.m. Central European Summer Time.

Applicants who did not meet a time limit fixed in the PCT Regulations due to this particular unavailability may request excuse of delay in meeting that time limit under PCT Rule 82*quater*.2, in accordance with the applicable conditions announced in the notification of the IB published in the *Official Notices (PCT Gazette)* of 16 July 2020 (p.155 et seq.).

Electronic Filing and Processing of International Applications

Languages Accepted for Language-Dependent Free Text in Sequence Listings in accordance with PCT Rule 12.1(d)

It is recalled that amendments to PCT Rule 12.1(d) relating to language-dependent free text contained in the sequence listing part of the description of an international application entered into force on 1 July 2022, and a new paragraph (*a-bis*) was added to Section 332 of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT prescribing that each receiving Office shall notify the International Bureau (IB) of the language or languages of any language-dependent free text which it is prepared to accept.

The following receiving Offices have notified the following information to the IB in accordance with Section 332(*a-bis*):

- **CH Swiss Federal Institute of Intellectual Property:** English, French or German. The Office also permits the language-dependent free text to be filed in both English and another filing language within a single sequence listing.
- **PA Directorate General of the Industrial Property Registry (DIGERPI) (Panama):** Spanish. The Office does *not* permit the language-dependent free text to be filed in more than one language within a single sequence listing.
- **TH Department of Intellectual Property (DIP) (Thailand):** English. The Office does *not* permit the language-dependent free text to be filed in more than one language within a single sequence listing.
- **UZ Intellectual Property Agency under the Ministry of Justice of the Republic of Uzbekistan:** English or Russian. The Office also permits the language-dependent free text to be filed in both English and Russian within a single sequence listing.

The Ministry of Economic Development and Tourism (Montenegro): Ceasing of Receiving Office Functions and Closure of National Route – *corrigendum*

Please note that the *PCT Newsletter* No. 10/2022 indicated that applicants desiring protection in Montenegro “will no longer be able to enter the national phase in that country” although this was already the case before the Ministry of Economic Development and Tourism (Montenegro) ceased to act as a receiving Office. For international applications filed before 1 October 2022, only an extension of a European patent is possible (there was no national route before the Intellectual Property Office of Montenegro).

Additionally, Lithuania should have been included in the list of States which are party to the European Patent Convention (EPC) and which have closed the national route. The list should

therefore have read: Belgium, Cyprus, France, Greece, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Monaco, Montenegro, the Netherlands, San Marino and Slovenia.

Furnishing of Priority Documents

Update of Offices Issuing Certified Copies of Priority Documents

It is recalled that, since 23 April 2020, when using ePCT, certified copies of priority documents can be uploaded to the International Bureau (IB) as PDF documents provided that they were issued and digitally signed with the certificate of the issuing Office.

The Intellectual Property Office of Singapore has notified the IB that it now issues digitally signed priority documents. For the current list of Offices for which Priority documents in PDF format can be selected for upload to the IB, please refer to:

It is generally recommended that applicants use the WIPO Digital Access Service (DAS) allowing priority documents and similar documents to be securely exchanged between participating intellectual property (IP) Offices. A list of the DAS participating Offices is available at:

WIPO Digital Access Service for Priority Documents

The State Patent Bureau of the Republic of Lithuania has notified the IB that, with effect from 1 January 2023, it will commence operation as both a depositing and an accessing Office of the WIPO Digital Access Service for Priority Documents (DAS). As a depositing Office, it will deposit, as priority documents, certified copies of patent applications on or after 1 January 2023, which the applicant specifically requests be made available to the service; as an accessing Office it will recognize priority documents available to it through the service for the purposes of any application for which the time limit for furnishing the priority document has not expired by 1 January 2023.

By using DAS, a PCT applicant can request the IB to retrieve a copy of an earlier application from DAS for use as a priority document, instead of providing or arranging for the provision of a certified copy. Please be aware that, in order to be able to make use of the DAS service, the Office with which the earlier application was filed must be a DAS depositing Office, and not necessarily the receiving Office with which the international application is filed.

AP African Regional Intellectual Property Organization (ARIPO) (fees)

The African Regional Intellectual Property Organization (ARIPO) has notified the International Bureau (IB) that the conditions for exemption of national search and examination fees apply to applications filed on or before 1 January 2017 where an international search report or preliminary examination report has been established for the international application.

The State Service for Intellectual Property of the Ministry of Finance and Economy of Turkmenistan has specified, with effect since 4 November 2022, the Eurasian Patent Office (EAPO) as competent International Searching Authority (ISA) and International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA) for international applications filed by nationals and residents of

Turkmenistan with the State Service for Intellectual Property of the Ministry of Finance and Economy of Turkmenistan, the EAPO or with the IB, as receiving Office.

US United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) (competent International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities)

The United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO), in its capacity as receiving Office, has notified the IB of a change concerning its specification of competent International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities. In particular, with effect from 1 December 2022, the Australian Patent Office, the European Patent Office (EPO), the Israel Patent Office, the Japan Patent Office (JPO), the Korean Intellectual Property Office, the Intellectual Property Office of Singapore and the USPTO are the only competent International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities for international applications filed by nationals and residents of the United States of America with the USPTO, or with the receiving Office of the IB.

Search fee (Korean Intellectual Property Office)

Further to the specification by the Institute for Quality Management and Intellectual Property (IGQPI) (Cabo Verde) of the Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO) as ISA with effect from 1 December 2022 (published in *PCT Newsletter* No. 10/2022), KIPO has notified the IB that, with effect from that date, the search fee payable to it as ISA is reduced by 75% where the applicant (or, if there are two or more applicants, each applicant) is a national of, and has a residence or business domicile in Cabo Verde.

Practical Advice

PCT Training material available from WIPO

Q: I am a trainee patent attorney at a patent law firm and would like to know if WIPO provides any training courses or material that could be useful, not only to me, but also to fellow trainees, on the role of the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) System and how to file international patent applications using ePCT.

A: WIPO is committed to ensuring that no matter where and regardless of their level of experience with patents, everyone who wishes to protect and benefit from their intellectual property is provided with the necessary knowledge, skills and tools to do so. WIPO strongly believes that the act of fostering and supporting creativity has the ability to impact us all positively and for generations to come.

WIPO provides many forms of training on a wide range of IP-related subjects. In this respect, a wealth of training material is readily available on our website. In addition, WIPO speakers regularly take part in training sessions open to the public, both virtually and in-person. Training

programs tailored to specific training needs are also provided to individual companies, associations and IP Offices.

PCT Distance Learning Course

The Distance Learning Course on the PCT (PCT DL101 Introduction to the PCT) provided by the WIPO Academy is open to any individual wishing to obtain a general understanding of the PCT System and is available in 10 languages (Arabic, Chinese, English, French, German, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese, Russian and Spanish). This free of charge self-study course was developed by WIPO PCT specialists, and consists of 14 modules with self-assessment tools strategically placed throughout to aid students evaluate their own progress. It takes an average of 6-8 hours for students to complete the course following which a certificate of completion is automatically delivered to all those who successfully complete the entire course.

Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 4(a), (b) and (c) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 5.189. A 90% reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30), the supplementary search handling fee and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—refer to footnotes 2 and 14. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 90% reduction are applicable, the 90% reduction is calculated **after** the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.


